## GYNECOLOGICAL ONCOLOGY SYMPOSIUM SCHEDULED

Six visiting professors will participate in the "GYN Oncology Symposium: What's Next?" to be held from 8 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. in the School of Nursing Auditorium, Room NU 103, on July 22.

The free symposium is being organized by the Departments of Obstetrics and Gynecology and Radiation Oncology of the I.U. School of Medicine. Reservations should be made by July 13 with Dr. C. E. Ehrlich, Department of OB/GYN, University Hospital, Room N264.

The impressive list of speakers and their topics include: Wesley C. Fowler, Jr., M.D., director, Division of Gynecologic Oncology, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, "Estrogen and Endometrial Cancer: Fact or Fiction?"; John A. Blessing, Ph.D., group statistician, Gynecologic Oncology Group, Cancer Research Scientist V, Roswell Park Memorial Institute, "Statistical Design in Clinical Trials"; Henry M. Keys, M.D., clinical director of radiation oncology at the University of Rochester, "Recent Advances in Radiotherapeutic Treatment of Cervical Cancer"; J. Tate Thigpen, M.D., associate professor of medicine from the University of Mississippi Medical Center, "Chemotherapy of Gynecologic Malignancies: An Update"; Stephen Curry, M.D., director of Gynecologic Oncology from the University of Connecticut Health Center, "Update on Gestational Trophoblastic Disease"; and Vernon Jobson, M.D., assistant professor of Gynecologic Oncology from Bowman Gray School of Medicine of Wake Forest University, "Treatment of Cervical Intraepithelial Neoplasia with the CO<sub>2</sub> Laser."

The Symposium has been arranged to take advantage of speakers who will be in Indianapolis for the national business meeting of the Gynecologic Oncology Group, a multidisciplinary research group in which personnel from 31 institutions participate. Dr. Ehrlich and the other 11 members of this group from I.U. are hosting this meeting at the Sheraton West motel. It will begin at noon July 22 and run through July 25.

All faculty members, residents, nurses and students are invited to attend the symposium which is sponsored by the Little Red Door, Marion County Cancer Society, Inc.
