Tenure-eligible faculty and librarians may not be granted sabbatical leave during the probationary period of a tenure-eligible appointment, which means they can apply for a sabbatical leave in their seventh year to be taken during their eighth

Ordinarily, sabbatical leaves are approved either one semester at full pay or for the academic year at half-pay. Sabbatical leave proposals must be approved and supported
