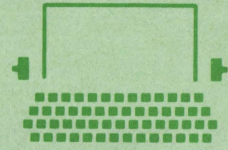

FORMER SEN. BAYH ON CAMPUS NEXT WEEK

Birch Bayh, former U.S. senator (D-Ind.), will be on campus Feb. 12 in his role as a Distinguished Citizen Fellow of the IU Institute for Advanced Study. He will give a free public lecture dealing with the First Amendment in the 1990s at 2:30 p.m. in University Place Conference Center. Faculty, staff and students and members of the community are invited to attend. In the morning he will visit with political science students and, later in the month, he will appear on "Consider This," the IUPUI-produced cable television talk show that features political science faculty Richard A. Fredland, Charles H. Winslow and William A. Blomquist.

Bayh, father of Indiana Gov. Evan Bayh, served in the U.S. Senate for nearly 20 years, from 1962 until he was defeated by then-Rep. Dan Quayle in 1980. Before that, he served in the Indiana House of Representatives from 1954 to 1962.

The Distinguished Citizen Fellow program of the IU institute brings outstanding persons to IU campuses to share their knowledge and experience with students and faculty. Another Distinguished Citizen Fellow is Dr. Otis R. Bowen, former Indiana governor and former secretary of the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services.

SPRING ENROLLMENT RECORD HIGH

IUPUI's enrollment for the 1990 spring term is up again this year to a new record total of 25,476, which is 1,153 more than last spring. The increases came in undergraduate programs. Overall, the increase in total credit hours taught here exceeds 13,300, up 6.2 percent from last spring. Statewide, 85,387 students are taking 861,485.2 credit hours on the eight IU campuses. This represents an all-time high for both. This is the second time since 1975 that all campuses experienced increases in both head count and credit hours.

"MATHLETES" COMING

Students from 24 central Indiana middle schools will be on campus Feb. 10 to participate in the regional competition of the sixth annual Mathcounts program. Designed to help reverse declining math scores in America's schools, Mathcounts competition includes written and oral matches about geometric properties and graphs of first- and second-degree equations that are beyond the typical level of difficulty for seventh- and eighth-graders, said Daniel Warner, central Indiana coordinator. Winners in the local contest, hosted by the Indiana Society of Professional Engineers and the School of Engineering and Technology, advance to state competition Mar. 24 on campus. State winners go to national competition in Washington, D.C., in May.
