LEGISLATIVE REPORTS II

Senate -- Bills introduced:

- SB 1 -- Would incorporate IUPUI schools and divisions into a State University of Indianapolis (Borst). Assigned to Education Committee.
- SB 7 -- Would require new or replacement highway signs to indicate distances in kilometers as well as miles (Thompson). Assigned to Road and Transportation Committee.
- SB 10 -- Would establish an Indiana Council on Science and Technology (Andrew, Bruggenschmidt). Assigned to Finance Committee.

House -- Bills introduced:

- HB 1033 -- Would establish an eight-member Indiana Commission for Arts and Humanities in Education (Williams). Assigned to Education Committee.
- HB 1080 -- Would require State Scholarship Commission to award \$50 to National Merit Scholarship finalists (Wathen). Assigned to Ways & Means Committee.
- HB 1082 -- Would prohibit smoking in public buildings and in areas of private buildings from which products or services are sold to public (DuComb). Assigned to Human Affairs Committee.
- HB 1084 -- Would incorporate Indiana State regional campus at Evansville as University of Southwestern Indiana (Deckard, J.R. Harris). Assigned to Education Committee.

LEAMNISON NAMED DIRECTOR OF RMP

Promotions of staff members at the Indiana Regional Medical Program have been announced by Dr. Steven C. Beering, associate dean of the School of Medicine and co-ordinator of the RMP.

George F. Leamnison has been named executive director and Miss Florence R. Brown, R.N., director of regional development, for the program which helps develop and implement health care services throughout Indiana. The program office is in the Union Building.

Leamnison, director of community relations for the program since 1968, replaces Louis E. Gordon who has been appointed executive director of the hospital section of the Pima County Health and Hospital Corporation at Tucson. Miss Brown, formerly research associate, assumes duties formerly handled by H. Carl Smith, now with the Division of Allied Health Sciences of the medical school.

Recent applications from IRMP for extended funding have been reviewed very favorably at the Federal level and it now appears that the program, which for most of 1973 has been phasing out, will have substantial funding during all of 1974, Dr. Beering said.
