#### MAKE CONVENTION PLANS

The 1983 FFA Alumni Convention will be held on November 9-10 in Kansas City, Missouri. The first Alumni session will be on Wednesday from 1:00 - 4:30 p.m. and the second session on Thursday from 9:00 - 12:00 noon. The FFA Convention starts Thursday morning and ends Saturday evening. We hope you will make plans to attend.



The National FFA Alumni has awarded four grants of \$500 each, sponsored by The Ace Bolt and Nut Company, to North Carolina, Illinois, Nebraska, and Washington State FFA Alumni to initiate new projects. A total of 13 states submitted proposals for consideration.

The proposal from North Carolina is designed as an incentiverecognition system to encourage membership development in local affiliates. Gold, silver, and bronze plaques will be presented for affiliates with a minimum of 75, 50, and 25 members. North Carolina will also develop new Legion of Merit certificates for persons enrolling five new members.

The Illinois Alumni will use the \$500 grant to develop a traveling exhibit consisting of panels explaining the Star Farmer and Star Agribusiness programs, BOAC, Cooperative Activities, the Heritage Program, Safety Program, Program of Activities, and the FFA Alumni.

The Nebraska Alumni will develop spot public service announcements for use in at least 25 radio stations. The announcements will publicize vocational agriculture, the FFA, and the FFA Alumni. They also will develop an FFA Alumni membership packet and two new state awards for Alumni membership development.

The Washington Alumni proposal calls for training Alumni personnel to conduct seminars/workshops at state vo-ag teachers meetings, all eight district vocational agriculture conferences, and local meetings. The proposal also calls for mailings of publicity sheets on the FFA Alumni to all teachers

State grant proposals for 1984 should be developed and mailed to the National Office by January 1, 1984.

#### STRUCTURE OF NATIONAL LEADERSHIP FOR VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE

A meeting of vocational leaders including Mr. Kenneth Seering, our National President, will be held on April 19 in Kansas City, Missouri, to develop a structure of national leadership for Vocational Agriculture Education. Since 1963, we have seen our national Vocational Agriculture staff reduced from thirteen to two persons and federal recognition of the importance of the national agriculture education program decline. Because of this recognized problem of our present delivery system, Mr. Byron Rawls, Program Specialist and head of Vocational Agriculture Education with the Department of Education, has called this meeting. He has presented a proposal designed to bring together all facets of the vocational agriculture profession to provide the program with leadership and direction. We hope to report on results of this very important meeting in our Summer newsletter.

The Western and Central Regional Council Representatives will be elected by mail ballot as part of the Fall newsletter. If you have nominations from these regions, please submit them to your state Alumni president immediately. States must nominate their candidates on or before July 1.



#### NEW SCRAPBOOK CONTEST

At the 1983 Convention, the first FFA Alumni Scrapbook Contest will be held. This contest is designed to encourage affiliates to develop and record historical background and improve local publicity of Alumni activities

This scrapbook contest is a totally new contest and should not be confused with the Outstanding Affiliate Award. Fairness to all Alumni affiliates, small and large, is always a consideration of the National FFA Alumni. In an effort to fulfill this objective and for uniformity in judging, the National FFA Alumni has required that the official FFA scrapbook be used for entry in this contest.

- Contest rules are as follows:
- 1. Scrapbook is to cover the time period of one National Convention to the next National Convention.
- 2. Scrapbook should be organized according to the major comittees found in the affiliate's program of activities.
- 3. Pictures and articles of each activity can be included only once and under its most appropriate committee as identified in Number 2.
- 4. All entries are to be brought to the National Convention and delivered to an assigned location prior to the opening session of the National FFA Alumni Convention and to be reclaimed at the close of the last Alumni convention session.
- 5. The official FFA scrapbook, 12 1/2" by 17" (1" or 2" binder), imprinted with the FFA Alumni affiliate's name, and available from the National FFA Supply Service, is required for entry.
- Suggested items to include in the scrapbook:
- a. Pictures of affiliate members in their local settings
- b. Pictures of affiliate members in FFA Alumni activities
- c. News stories about affiliate activities and members
- d. Affiliate's program of activities
- e. Other material that completes the affiliate's activities
- 7. Only one scrapbook may be used: therefore, be selective,
- Judges will be appointed by the National FFA Alumni Council President
- 9. Factors to consider in evaluation:
  - a. Organization
  - b. Neatness
  - c. Pictures (quality)
  - d. Identification of pictures, clippings, etc.
  - e. Quality of projects
  - f. Applicable material
  - Completeness
- 10. Present framed certificates to the national winner and participation certificates to all entries.
- 11. Scrapbooks will be on display during the National Convention. Each entry must have an affiliate member present during the time scrapbooks are on display.
- 12. All precautions will be taken, but the National FFA Alumni is not responsible for any scrapbook while on display.

#### **1983 FFA ALUMNI INTERNS FROM** NEBRASKA AND IDAHO

During the 1983 summer, the FFA Alumni will have two individuals serving as interns in the area of governmental affairs. The collegiate intern for this summer will be Larry Svehla from Clarkson, Nebraska. He will finish his Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Nebraska this year. Larry was the Nebraska FFA President in 1979-80 and National Agri-Marketing Association Account Executive for the N.A.M.A. Marketing Campaign in 1982 and 1983. He participated on an International Agri-Marketing Tour to Japan in 1982 and was a summer intern with Farmland Industries in 1980.

The ten-week collegiate internship is designed to provide an educational experience for the intern, provide vocational agriculture information to individuals involved in the Federal Vocational Education Legislation, and to develop resource materials and information for use by the FFA Alumni Association. The FFA Alumni collegiate intern has the opportunity to serve as a United States congressional intern

the opportunity to serve as a United States congressional intern through a cooperative agreement with the Congressional Rural Caucus. The Rural Caucus is chaired by U.S. Congressman Wes Watkins from Oklahoma who was a former State FFA President. The instructor internship was awarded to Mike Rush. Mike was a vocational agriculture teacher from 1977-80 in Buhl, Idaho. He is presently instructing and working on his doctorate degree in Agri-culture Education at the Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. He served as Executive Secretary of the Idaho. FFA University. He served as Executive Secretary of the Idaho FFA Leadership Conference in 1982, as Manager of the FFA Western Extemporaneous Speaking Contest in 1981, and placed first in the Idaho Jay Cee Speak-up Competition in 1980. Mike will serve in a fourweek internship. The instructor internship has similar purposes as the collegiate program.

#### ALUMNI AWARDS OVER \$10,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS

The National FFA Alumni will award over \$10,000 in scholarships to the FFA Washington Conference Program, A total of 39 scholarships, valued at \$27 each which is the full conference registration fee, are given to FFA Alumni state associations and local affiliates for their selection and awarding to FFA members. A state association receives one scholarship for every 500 active Alumni members, and local affiliates receive a scholarship for every 100 Life members or 250 active members.
