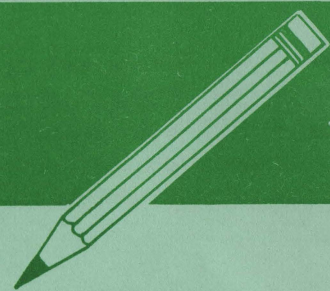

Dr. Victor Hackney, chairman and professor of dermatology and chairman of the search and screen committee recently appointed by President Ryan, states "The task of this committee is formidable, but I am confident that the committee will be able to accomplish its mission efficiently and with dispatch." CANCER SYMPOSIUM CONVENES

A national conference on the cancers of childhood will be held in Indianapolis this week under the sponsorship of the Indiana University School of Medicine and the James Whitcomb Riley Hospital for Children.

The two-day meeting, opening Thursday at Stouffer's Indianapolis Inn, will present advances in the diagnosis and treatment of children's cancers through discussions by authorities from the I.U. medical school and other major centers throughout the United States.

Indiana Governor Otis R. Bowen will address the meeting at a banquet on Thursday. Tickets for the banquet cost \$25 a couple and will be sold to raise funds for research in children's cancer, the second leading cause of death in children. Tickets are available from Dr. Jay L. Grosfeld at the I.U. Medical Center.

Visiting panelists include some of the nation's leading research and clinical authorities on childhood cancers: Dr. H. William Clatworthy Jr., Ohio State University College of Medicine; Dr. Robert M. Filler, Harvard University School of Medicine and chief of clinical surgery at Boston's Children's Hospital Medical Center; Dr. Alvin M. Mauer, medical director of Memphis' St. Jude's Children's Hospital; Dr. William Newton Jr., Ohio State University College of Medicine; Dr. Judson G. Randolph, chief surgeon at Children's Hospital of Washington, D.C.; Dr. Lucius F. Sinks, chief of cancer research at Buffalo's Roswell Park Memorial Hospital, and Dr. Melvin Tefft of Harvard University School of Medicine.

The program is directed by two members of the I.U. School of Medicine faculty, Dr. Jay L. Grosfeld, professor of pediatric surgery, and Dr. Robert L. Baehner, associate professor of pediatrics.

PUT IT IN WRITING

A book to teach dentists how to help their patients stay away from dentists has won its three authors, all members of the School of Dentistry faculty, a special merit award from the American Dental Association. The book, Preventive Dentistry in Action, was written by Dr. Simon Katz, professor of preventive dentistry; Dr. James L. McDonald Jr., assistant professor of preventive dentistry, and Dr. George K. Stookey, associate professor of preventive dentistry.

Dr. Eugene E. Levitt, director of the section of psychology and professor of clinical psychology, has written a chapter in a book called Issues in Abnormal Child Psychology (Brooks/Cole Publishing Company). The chapter deals with "Research on Psychotherapy with Children."

Dr. K. V. Vasavada, associate professor of physics, is a co-author of an article published in the Proceedings of the International Conference on pi-pi Scattering, held at Florida State University.
