Third reading of proposal to Article 6 Paragraph 13

I make a motion to amend the constitution. If a member in good standing should move out of a adjoining county he is entitled to his death benefits but will loose his sick benefits

The special Constitution committee recommended the following ~~recommendations~~ amendments to be added to the Constitution

Article 6 Paragraph 2.

Permanent disability thru accident or Chronic sickness shall not be covered by benefits.

Article 4 Paragraph 1

Eliminate ~~present~~ requirements for prospective members to speak german but to be of German descent.

Article 5 Paragraph 2

If the net worth of the society goes below \$15,000.00 all members are required to pay dues again till it reaches the above amount.

Article 8 Paragraph 8.

The pay of the sick committee shall be the same as the other offices of the society.

Article 6 Paragraph 5.

If a single member without any relatives be committed to an Institution he shall not be entitled <sup>to</sup> any benefits and no dues accepted during his confinement if same is released and in good health again he shall be reinstated with full benefits. signed by.
