

THEATER SYMPOSIUM SCHEDULED

A line-up of several of the country's foremost authorities on mid-19th Century drama and history will be on the IUPUI campus on April 29 for the symposium on early American theater to be sponsored by the IUPUI Center for American Studies in conjunction with the University Theater. After a light supper in the courtyard of the theater in the Mary Cable Building, the group will attend the comedy, "Our American Cousin," the play Abraham Lincoln was watching at Ford's Theater when he was shot by John Wilkes Booth in 1865. The production and festival also celebrates the first anniversary of the University Theater in its new quarters.

All the symposium participants, scholars, working actors and interested persons, will hold a round-table discussion in Room 318 of the University Library. (Those wishing to join in the discussions should call ext. 3759.) After the 8 p.m. performance of the play the festival will conclude with a presentation dealing both with Lincoln's interest in the theater and with the play as drama.
