Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Interim President Bill Bosron at 10:05 a.m.

The minutes of the June 14 meeting were approved with the addition of Golam Mannan's name to the list new members welcomed at the meeting.

President's Report

- On July 24, Interim President Bosron and Walt Linne met with Nasser Paydar, the new Chief Academic Officer (former title Dean of Faculties). Dr. Paydar indicated that his office will continue to support the Senior Academy with office space, salary for an administrative assistant, a computer and other office supplies, and postage. The Senior Academy office has been moved to room 109 in the AO building. A new strategic planning process for IUPUI will begin this fall, and Dr. Paydar asked for input and support from Senior Academy members.
- Lee McLaughlin, Senior Academy's Administrative Assistant, worked to prepare a brief history of the Senior Academy prior to the meeting with Dr. Paydar. Copies were distributed to members of the Board. She obtained information from the IUPUI archives, as well as from several current and former Board members. Since the 20th anniversary of the founding of the Senior Academy will be on September 20, 2013, Bill suggested that the Board work to expand the history prior to the anniversary and plan a special event to celebrate the founding.
- Bill announced the death of Board member Art Mirsky on June 24, 2012 and
 distributed copies of the obituary prepared by Earth Sciences faulty and of the
 remarks he prepared for the memorial service. Jeff noted that in addition to the
 items mentioned in the obituary, Art had served as the starter for IUPUI canoe
 races. At the next meeting, the Board will discuss proposed changes to the
 scholarship descriptions and consider a person to fill Art's place on the Board.
- Once again the Sr. Academy President has been asked to serve on the IUPUI
 United Way Executive Committee. Bill distributed descriptions of the United
 Way Loaned Executive program and reported that IUPUI administration and
 United Way Executive Committee would like to find a member of the Senior
 Academy to participate in this program.

SENIOR ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIPS: CRITERIA 2012

SENIOR ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIP FOR IPS STUDENTS

Up to \$2,000. Deadline: February 1, admission and application. A, E, T, R2

The Senior Academy at IUPUI has established a scholarship program designed to partially support tuition and books for beginning freshmen who show the potential for academic excellence in their IUPUI studies. The scholarship will be awarded in the second semester of the awardee's high-school senior-year for enrollment at IUPUI in the following fall semester. Applications will be reviewed and the awardee selected by the Senior Academy Scholarship Awards Committee. Applicants must (1) meet regular admission requirements to IUPUI, (2) have graduated from a high school in the Indianapolis Public Schools (IPS) system, (3) have a high school grade point average of at least 3.00 on a 4.00 scale and (4) agree to enroll for at least 9 credit hours per semester. The applicant must also (a) submit an academic transcript, (b) submit two letters of recommendations (must be from current or former teachers) and (c) complete an essay on your academic objectives, community service, and your career goals.

A = Application, T= High School Transcript, R2= Two recommendation forms completed by current or former teachers, E = Essay

SENIOR ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIP FOR RETURNING-STUDENTS

Up to \$2,000. Deadline: March 1, admission and application A. E, T. R2

The Senior Academy at IUPUI has established a scholarship program designed to partially support tuition and books for students who, for some reason, dropped out of college – level status for at least 5 years, and are now planning to enroll, or have already enrolled in their <u>first</u> semester, at IUPUI in order to complete their first undergraduate degree. The applicant must not have enrolled in any college-level courses during the five years prior to enrolling at IUPUI. Applications will be reviewed and the awardee selected by the Senior Academy Scholarship Awards Committee. Applicants must (1) meet regular re-admission requirements to IUPUI, (2) have had a grade point average of at least 2.00 on a 4.00 scale for previous college credits, and (3) agree to enroll for at least 6 credit hours per semester. The applicant must also (a) submit an academic transcript of any previous undergraduate college courses taken, (b) submit two letters of recommendation, and (c) complete an essay on your academic goals, community service, and why your experience during your absence from school will enhance your successful completion of your academic goals.

A = Application, T = Transcripts, R2 = Two recommendation forms, E = Essay

SENIOR ACADEMY GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP

Up to \$2,000. Deadline: March 15, admission and application A, E, T, R2

The Senior Academy at IUPUI has established a scholarship program designed to partially support tuition and books for students who will be graduating seniors who expect to graduate with a baccalaureate degree at the end of the Spring Semester. Applications will be reviewed and the awardee selected by the Senior Academy Scholarship Awards Committee. Applicants must (1) be in good academic standing at IUPUI, (2) have successfully completed at least 90 credit-hours prior to the semester the student is to receive funding, (3) have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.00 scale, and (4) agree to enroll during the Fall-Spring Semesters for the number of credit-hours required to graduate at the end of the Spring Semester, but for no less than a total of 20 credit-hours during the last year. The applicant must also (a) submit an academic transcript, (b) submit two letters of recommendation from current or former instructors, and (c) complete an essay on your academic goals, how you are achieving them, community service, and your plans after receiving your baccalaureate degree.
