School of Physical Education and Tourism Management to Assume Management Responsibilities for Camp Brosius

The Indiana University Board of Trustees, at their regularly scheduled meeting on December 5th, heard recommendations of a task force that the management of Camp Brosius be transferred to the Indiana University School of Physical Education and Tourism Management. The transfer will take effect in time for the 2005 summer program.


Camp Brosius was founded in 1921 by the Normal College of the American Gymnastic Union, the predecessor institution of the School of Physical Education and Tourism Management. The school has used the camp continuously as a summer training facility for its students. The school also operated a children's summer camp until 1974 when the Indiana University Alumni Association initiated a family camp that operated during June, July and August.

The Indiana University Alumni Association Board of Managers had decided that it would not renew the association's lease to manage the camp when the lease expires on October 31, 2004.

Among the recommendations is that Indiana University retain ownership in the camp as long as the facility can operate on a self-sustaining basis. Also, the task force recommended that the school assume ongoing responsibility for operating the camp as it currently functions and the Indiana University Alumni Association provide transitional assistance to the school during the 2004 season.

The task force stipulated that the fee structure used for the 2004 summer season be

adjusted in such a way as to generate a 20 percent increase in revenue from family camp fees and that the 2004 season serve as a test to ensure that the market is solid. Further stipulations are that a feasibility study into a capital campaign for non-essential but desirable improvements to the camp be undertaken.



"The Indiana University Alumni Association has established a very popular program in family camping," said School of Physical Education and Tourism Management Dean, Dr. P. Nicholas Kellum. "With the school's continuing need for the camp as a training facility, it seems reasonable to extend our reach to total management of the facility. We certainly have the best interests of the camp at heart and faculty in both physical education and tourism management with expertise that will serve the camping program well."

Billie Grimes, a graduate of Western Boone High School in Lebanon, served in the Army Reserve a couple of years before graduating from the School of Physical Education and Tourism Management in 2002 with a major in

Fitness and Sports Studies and a minor in Athletic Training. She went on active duty in July 2002 and has been in Kuwait and Iraq since May 10th.

As the platoon's medic, she treated two *Time* journalists, along with injured

members of her unit, on December 10th.

Time writer Michael
Weisskopf's right hand was blown off, and photographer James
Nachtwey was hit with shrapnel when a grenade landed in their Humvee as the platoon was stuck in Baghdad traffic.

"That story is typical Billie," says Jay Bradley, Clinical Assistant Professor and Director of the Athletic Training Program. "She has a job to

do and she does it. She realized there were some injured people and she helped them."

Bradley feels Grimes's training at the School of Physical Education and

Tourism Management helped prepare her for a career in the Army. In the Athletic Training program, Grimes worked closely with all of IUPUI's athletic teams, taping, splinting and bracing athlete's injured joints and helping them with strength training.

Grimes returned home for a six-week holiday leave shortly after the magazine hit the newsstands. During that time, she was a guest of President and Mrs. Bush at the State of the Union Address, met with the Army's joint Chiefs of Staff and the Surgeon General, rang the opening bell on Wall Street, received the key to the city of Lebanon, threw out the football at a Colts playoff game and received a pizza delivered by the founder of Papa John's Pizza.

Grimes returned to Iraq on February 2nd. Her new duties include getting military vehicles ready for shipment out of the country. In mid-April, she and her unit are set to return to Germany until July 11th, when her Iraq tour of duty is scheduled to end.

If passed, the bill will require the department of education to develop: (1) recommendations for school corporation nutritional policies and curricula; and

(2) model policies for the measurement of student body mass indexes. Faculty members and students spoke with legislators, and Paige Craigie performed a dance solo in the atrium of the State House.

In Memoriam

Vera Ulbricht died on February 16, 2003 at the age of 100. Born in St. Louis, she discovered her talent for gymnastics and began taking classes at Turnvereins German-American gymnastics societies. She graduated from the Normal College and taught physical education in Peoria, Illinois; Buffalo, NY and then in her home town of St. Louis for more than 40 years. She enjoyed traveling and participated in a Washington University School of Medicine study on exercise and the elderly while in her 90's.

George R. Breithaupt died December 1, 2003 at the age of 72. He entered the Normal College in 1955 and received his BS in Physical Education in 1963.
