

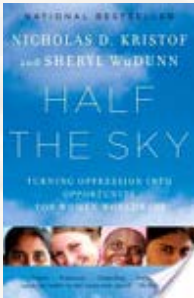


CHANGE YOUR WORLD

2012-2013 COMMON THEME BOOK(S)

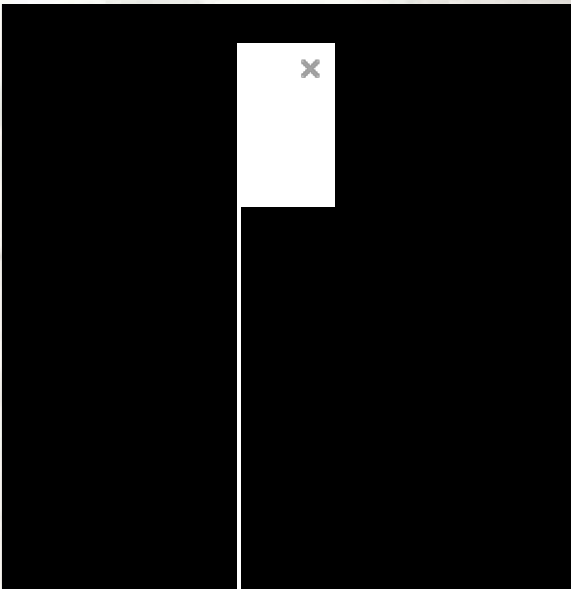

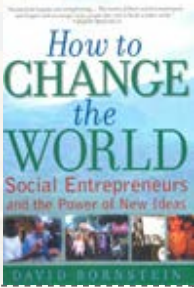
