CHRISTMAS SERVICE WORKING

United Christmas Service operates during the months of November and December to assure that "the neediest of the needy" do not go wanting at Christmas time. A division of the United Way of Greater Indianapolis, Inc., it needs help. It needs monetary contributions and donor groups who have year-round or holiday projects to provide clothes, toys, food or assistance to the needy.

Last year contributions of \$140,000 and items from donor groups brightened the holidays of over 5,000 Indianapolis-area families. It works like this: The "neediest of the needy" families known to the community's network of participating social service agencies are referred with specific needs. Requests also are accepted directly from persons in need. All referrals are cross-checked to eliminate duplications, and if the family is not known it is referred to an agency of volunteer investigators to verify needs.



HONORS AND ACCOLADES

Dr. Richard K. Curtis, professor of speech communication, was elected chairman of the 3500-member Senior College/University Section of the Speech Communication Association at its annual convention in Anaheim, Calif., Nov. 12-15.
