SEASON'S MEETING

HERRON GALLERY SCHEDULES FIBER SHOW

"Fiber Structures & Fabric Surfaces," the first major exhibition of contemporary fiber held in Indianapolis, opens October 12 in the Herron Gallery at the Herron School of Art. The public is invited to the opening reception on October 12 from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m.

Curated by Harold F. Mailand, assistant conservator for textiles at the Indianapolis Museum of Art, the exhibition brings together 26 contemporary artists working with fiber and living in the United States, Canada and Europe. All 33 selected works have been completed within the past two years and many will make their public debut in the Herron show.

"The artists in this exhibition are reconsidering many traditional and non-traditional techniques of manipulating fiber and embellishing the fabric surface," Mailand said. "They also are drawing on and adapting 20th-Century technology, materials and the interdisciplinary backgrounds of painting, sculpture, architecture and printing."

An accompanying catalogue documents the exhibition as an historical reference and presents a glossary of terms. Herron Gallery also will supplement the exhibition with two free public slide lectures. "My Personal Commitment to the Textile" by Warren Seelig will be presented October 26 at 8 p.m. Seelig, a guest artist included in the exhibition, is chairman of the Fiber Department at the Philadelphia College of Art. And Mailand will discuss "Historical Prototypes and Current Influences on Contemporary Fiber" on November 2 at 3 p.m. Both lectures will be in the Herron auditorium, adjacent to the Herron Gallery.

The exhibition will be on display through November 21. The gallery is open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, and until 9 p.m. on Wednesdays.
