LEGISLATIVE REPORTS III

SENATE -- New Bills

SB 320 - (Fanning) -- Would prohibit withholding of student transcripts or records from any state-supported school, college, or university because of non-payment of fees. Assigned to Education Committee.

SB 329 - (Stanish) -- Would amend law governing psychologists to provide licenses without examinations for those engaged in private practice for 10 years prior to July 1, 1969. Assigned to Public Policy Committee.

SB 370 - (Snowden) -- Would direct the State Board of Health to develop plans to establish a special facility to help the multiple handicapped; appropriates \$50,000. Assigned to Finance Committee.

HOUSE -- New Bills

HCR 11 - Congratulates Bob Griese, quarterback for the Miami Dolphins and former star for Purdue University and Evansville Reitz High School, for his accomplishments.

HB 1363 (Jones) -- Would abolish mandatory collection of student activity fees. Assigned to Education Committee.

HOUSE -- Legislative Action

HB 1029 - Would allow foreign students to attend Indiana public schools without tuition charged. Passed by House, 86-2, and sent to Senate.

HB 1126 - Would include Indiana Vocational Technical College in the Indiana Higher Education Telecommunications System. Passed by House, 89-0, and sent to Senate.

DR. RYAN INSTALLED

An investiture service installing Dr. John W. Ryan as the 14th president of Indiana University was held last Thursday in the Board of Trustees Room, Bryan Administration Building, Bloomington.

Donald C. Danielson of New Castle, president of the I.U. board, invested Dr. Ryan with the symbols of office and gave him the charge of office. In accordance with President Ryan's request that the ceremony be brief and simple, attendance was limited by invitation to some 45 representatives of the various segments of the University and state government.

Dr. Ryan was elevated to president on January 26, 1971, after 2½ years' service as vice-president and chancellor for regional campuses.
