

Foreword

...

This is the fourteenth volume of "Kiwanis Activities" summarizing the officially reported activities of all the Kiwanis clubs in the United States and Canada during the year 1935. The compilation was made possible by utilizing the Official Monthly Reports recording activities as reported by the club secretaries.

At the close of 1935 there were 1,872 chartered clubs, according to the membership records as of December 31, 1935, and nearly all were carrying on civic and welfare programs.

The Objects of Kiwanis International have made possible the numerous activities recorded in this volume. These Objects are:

To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life.

To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.

To promote the adoption and the application of higher social business and professional standards.

To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive and serviceable citizenship.

To provide through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities.

To co-operate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and good-will.

Suggestions for Your Own Club

KIWANIS ACTIVITIES is a summary of the community betterment and service activities of Kiwanis clubs in the United States and Canada. The book is compiled annually from the Official Monthly Reports submitted by clubs.

The activities indicate the many varied and practical applications of the ideals, and objectives of Kiwanis International, and suggest opportunities of similar service for other communities, institutions, groups and individuals.

The book is not an honor-roll of clubs. It has been compiled as a descriptive presentation of diversified service endeavors.

How to Use the Book

KIWANIS ACTIVITIES is suggestive of what can be done in all communities by active clubs. Every club, large or small, seeking suggestions for community service can find in this volume sources of information on every conceivable kind of activity.

The key which unlocks the treasure of this book for clubs is the index on the final pages. There appear over forty general divisions of activities, which direct the reader to pages of thousands of records of actual club work.

Clubs which have made surveys of their own communities and are planning new or additional service activities, can review the results of clubs in towns of somewhat the same type and population. Clubs seeking suggestions may be located in either agricultural or industrial areas, or in vicinities of both farming and manufacturing.

For a club in an agricultural region, the index will indicate hundreds of valuable activities in better town and country relations work, in city beautiful planning, health campaigns, conservation and general education. If a club functions in a community where all forms of general economic enterprise are in operation, a vast store-house of material is suggested by such index topics as health and sanitation, boys' and girls' work, improvement of civic conditions, aid to business and industry, and many others.

A careful study of KIWANIS ACTIVITIES by members will reveal to them many clubs of about the same size, in localities having similar opportunities and problems, engaged in active and varied service programs.

Every Kiwanian is urged to make a thorough inspection of KIWANIS ACTIVITIES to familiarize himself with the summary of service work of all the clubs in Kiwanis International.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD

The service rendered by all the Kiwanis clubs in the United States and Canada, on behalf of under-privileged children, consists in removing those physical, mental, moral and economic handicaps, which bar them from the full measure of citizenship.

The following shows the various kinds of activities accomplished during 1935 to aid the children under this major Kiwanis objective:

Physical

- Ada, Okla. Purchased orthopedic appliances, shoes, school books and cod liver oil for under-privileged children. Transportation was provided for taking youngsters to the University Hospital at Oklahoma City.
- Alamosa, Colo. A health camp for under-nourished children and those suffering from tuberculosis is in operation. School children were inocu-lated for preventing diphtheria. Spanish children of the community are taught English and citizenship.
- Albany, Ga. Twelve years of successful operation is the record of the Kiwanis clinic, which started in 1923. There were over 250 cases in the clinic during 1935. Milk was distributed daily to the poor.
 Alliance, Ohio. Nearly 500 children of pre-school age were immunized
- against diphtheria.
- Altadena, Calif. Entertainment programs are provided for the boys' and girls' aid society.
- Atlanta, Ga. The major objective, Hillside Cottages, cares for 86 boys and girls placed there by the juvenile court. The children have medical attention and are provided with clothing.
- Atlantic City, N. J. Clothing, glasses and orthopedic appliances were available for needy children, who also received free dental care. Employment was secured for two boys. Over 2,000 children were Kiwanis guests at
- a summer party. Augusta, Ga. The Children's hospital is given \$25.00 a month, which pro-vides a private room for under-privileged children who need special care.
- Baltimore, Md. Equipment was purchased for a hospital nursery. The club strenuously objected to decreasing the state's crippled children's budget. A hobby show was held for boys and girls between the ages of 9 and 20.
- Batesville, Ark. The club is interested in fire drills and securing good fire fighting equipment for the Masonic Orphans' Home. Fire drills are held constantly under the direction of municipal authorities.
- Battle Creek, Mich. The annual clothes campaign secured 10,000 garments for children. A city and county-wide survey was made to find the num-ber of needy children. Glasses, food and entertainment were made
- available for youngsters. Beaver Dam, Wis. All children entering school at the beginning of the year were given vaccination and inoculation.
- Bethlehem, Pa. A donation was given the Lehigh Valley Child Guidance Clinic, which helps children who need the services of a psychiatrist. Under-privileged children were given free eye examinations and glasses.
- Bluefield, W. Va. A clinic found some 200 children needing attention. Children suffering from eye, ear, nose and throat ailments, infantile paralysis and other diseases are constantly being given help. The club took 235 boys and girls to a picnic.
- Butte, Mont. The club furnishes toys, and medical and dental care for the children in the F. E. R. A. nursery schools.
- Camas-Washougal, Wash. Five hundred children of the grade schools were examined and we found 189 youngsters who needed attention. The children whose parents were on relief or very poor got assistance from the club. Forty children were taken to a summer camp.
- Chardon, Ohio. The Committee on Under-Privileged Child arranged to care for the dental needs of 60 children whose parents were on relief. Our dental clinic examined the teeth of 320 boys and girls. Clothing, shoes and other necessities were given the needy.
- Charles Town, W. Va. The Martinsburg Hospital was given \$1,500.00 and the Charles Town Hospital a similar amount. The Morgan County Kiwanis Club was given \$3,100.00 for their campaign against infantile paralysis.

- Chattanooga, Tenn. Clothing is provided children so they can attend school. An appropriation was given the Lions club to assist in their campaign for reducing blindness among infants.
- Cheraw, S. C. Sponsored a diphtheria clinic for free inoculations. Provided milk for under-privileged children and bought school books for young-sters who were unable to buy them.
- Chicago, Ill. Classes for deaf boys and girls are held three nights each week. Medical and dental attention, school books, free circus and baseball tickets and an orphans' picnic were activities of the club during 1935.
- Cincinnati, Ohio. Supplies and equipment were purchased for the St. Rita School for the Deaf. Under-privileged girls were sent to a summer camp.
- Circleville, Ohio. The Committee on Under-Privileged Child is conducting a hard-of-hearing clinic.
- Clatskanie, Ore. A survey was made in the schools to find children suffering from tuberculosis and also under-nourished children for whom the club supplied food and milk.
- Cleveland, Ohio. A Kiwanis nursery is conducted at the Rainbow Hospital for crippled children.
- **Clewiston, Fla.** Children were given physical examinations, fitted with glasses and those needing orthopedic attention were sent to a hospital in St. Petersburg.
- **Colorado Springs, Colo.** One youngster, Richard Carr, has been placed in a day nursery and another, Corwin Hull, was placed in a nutritional camp. The Committee on Under-Privileged Child planned to see that hot lunches were provided for children in the rural school districts.
- **Columbiana, Ohio.** An educational campaign was conducted in the community to explain the value of vaccinations for all children. Pupils were immunized against diphtheria and typhoid fever, the club furnishing the serums free and local doctors donating their services. Glasses were provided for several youngsters.
- **Columbia, S. C.** Daily luncheons, milk, bread, shoes, glasses, books, etc., were given to the needy. Hospitalization was available for those need-ing surgical attention.
- **Conway, Ark.** Co-operation was given in a health week campaign for negroes. In November, a county-wide crippled children's clinic was planned.
- **Copperhill, Tenn.** Eight hundred children were examined at our health clinic. School books and clothing were given the needy children in the schools.
- **Corpus Christi, Tex.** The club is helping a crippled Mexican youth, who has exceptional talent for painting. Tonsillectomies were performed for a number of children and the club also provided eye examinations and glasses free of charge.
- Council Bluffs, Iowa. The Under-Privileged Child Committee was able to bring about the immunization of 5,527 grade school children against diphtheria. Over 1,700 youngsters were provided this service free by the club. The total expenditure for the work was \$2,571.50. Our cooperation was given in promoting President Roosevelt's birthday ball. Seventy per cent of the proceeds of this occasion went to pay for the immunization of indigent children.
- Crestline, Ohio. More than 1,000 children have been treated in our free dental clinic.
- Davenport, Iowa. Each Sunday flowers are distributed to the rooms of sick children in the Davenport hospitals. A health clinic, summer camp, picnics and automobile rides are provided for the children of orphanages and institutions.
- Decatur, Ill. A dental survey was made among 9,000 school children. Camp Kiwanis had a very successful season. The club has furnished a scholarship at Millikin University.
- Elgin, Ill. The club continues the supplying of free medical attention and glasses to poor children.
- Elyria, Ohio. The club helped to raise \$5,000.00 to build a swimming pool at the Gates Home for crippled children.

- Emeryville, Calif. Tonsil operations, eye examinations and glasses were part of the service the club made possible for youths of the community who needed help.
- Ensley, Ala. Free milk was distributed to school children and a number of boys were sent to summer camps. A crippled child was sent to Warm Springs, Ga., for treatment.
- Fairmont, W. Va. Over 100 children were operated on at the tonsil clinic
- Fayetteville, N. C. The club appropriates \$10.00 a month during the school Fayetteville, N. C. term to provide milk for under-nourished children. Regular clinics are held to assist in orthopedic and baby health activities. These clinics have been held continuously for nine years. Under-privileged boys and girls were sent to a summer camp.
- Fort Frances, Ont. Over 1,000 children have received diphtheria toxin and a dental survey was made to find those needing attention and help. Four children were fitted with eye glasses.
- Fort Myers, Fla. Kiwanis supervision is carried on at the County Chil-dren's Welfare Home. Weekly contributions are made for the support of a widow and her four children and under-privileged youngsters are provided with suitable clothing.
- Frederick, Md. A fashion show and business exposition gave us net pro-ceeds of \$1,600.00 for welfare work. A big feature of the show was a baby contest, with 116 children competing for the prizes. Sixty-two business firms had attractive exhibits. An orthopedic clinic is sponsored by the club.
- Fremont, Ohio. A multiple amplifying device for defective hearing has been installed in the schools.
- Galesburg, Ill. Our dental clinic gives free service for the poor children of the city. The visiting nurse selects the children who need attention.
- Galveston, Tex. Clothing, shoes and eye glasses are given to poor children so they may attend school.
- Great Falls, Mont. The Mantoux test for tuberculosis was given to all chil-dren in the public schools. Kiwanians made personal calls on parents who refused at first to grant permission for these tests. The club also had funds for glasses and tonsil operations.
- Greensburg, Pa. At a cost of \$1,500.00 there were 152 eye examinations and glasses provided for those youngsters who needed them. The Chil-dren's Aid Society receives help from Kiwanis.
- Greenville, S. C. Clinics were established throughout the county in an anti-diphtheria campaign. All children whose families could not pay for the toxin received free service through Kiwanis. A hospital is given a monthly appropriation for buying medicines for under-privileged children. The Juvenile Protective Association is also given money to pro-vide a home for an eight year old boy. The providing of glasses and school books and the Kiwanis playground are other activities of the club.
- Hagerstown, Md. Orthopedic appliances and glasses were purchased for children during 1935.
- Harlan, Ky. A clinic for crippled children was held early in 1935, with 66 children receiving attention. Twenty were sent to Louisville for treatment.
- Haverhill, Mass. The Committee on Under-Privileged Child holds weekly clinics, with Boston physicians giving their services. Over 100 cases were being helped at the end of 1935.
- Hendersonville, N. C. Children having diseased tonsils and defective eye-sight were given expert treatment. One boy was sent to Greenville, S. C., and a number of health clinics were held for colored children.
- Henrietta, Tex. Through Kiwanis efforts 160 under-privileged school chil-dren are receiving hot lunches at noon time. A fund was given the Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for its work with crippled children.
- Hiawatha, Kan. All children needing surgical, medical or dental attention are given help at the Kiwanis clinic. Children found to be under-nour-On May 1, 1935, we observed Child Health Day. Glasses are provided needy children. Kiwanians are asking the entire adult community to assist in personal service work among the poor children who need encouragement, confidence and friendship.

- Homestead, Pa. For the year 1935 our well baby clinic, which is held once a week, cared for 168 new youngsters and over 1,100 return visits were made by mothers. Hospitalization was provided for crippled children
- and glasses were purchased for the needy. Independence, Mo. The club established a free bed for under-privileged children at a local sanitarium. One youngster, a ward of the club, is
- being given medical attention and supervision. Ironwood, Mich. Over 300 children were examined and many were fitted with glasses. This was part of the work of an eye clinic operated under the Couzens' fund.
- Jacksonville, Fla. In 1935 the club operated its 20-babies project. An an-nual benefit football game gave the club \$2,000.00 for its under-privil-eged child work. Twelve Kiwanians act as Big Brothers in personal service work. Three wheel chairs, glasses, food, milk and clothing were provided free for children. Birthday presents and entertainment and summer camp vacations were also part of the under-privileged child program. program.
- Janesville, Wis. The club has a Kiwanis ward at the local hospital. Over \$1,800.00 was the cost of our children's work during the year. The service includes hospitalization and rehabilitation.
- Jasper, Ala. Over 150 operations were performed at the annual clinic. One child was sent to New Orleans for a facial operation.
- Jefferson City, Mo. During the year 1935 there were 910 children who went through the Kiwanis clinic. Since 1928, the start of this clinic, more than 6,000 children have been given free service. The total cost of operation during the years has been over \$3,000.00.
- Kansas City, Mo. The child health center was operated during the entire year. The visiting nurses made over 200 calls a month and between 50 and 75 babies were cared for at the baby station every 30 days. New equipment was purchased for the Kiwanis health center. The second annual ice carnival in March was attended by over 6,000 people and added about \$1,200.00 to our under-privileged child fund.
 Kingsport, Tenn. The Committee on Under-Privileged Child is active in an anti-tuberculosis campaign. Beside operating health cabins, medical aid milk and cuparision are provided for the sufferers.
- aid, milk and supervision are provided for the sufferers.
- Kirkland Lake, Ont. A street carnival in June secured \$3,800.00 for underprivileged child work. The club makes available medical and dental treatment and provides milk for children under school age whose parents are on relief.
- La Grange, Ill. The children of the Illinois Masonic Orphans' Home are furnished with toys.
- Lake View, Chicago. Orthopedic appliances, dental service, glasses, cloth-ing and special school facilities for crippled children is the work of the club for the youngsters at the Jahn School.
- Lawrence, Kan. Orthopedic and mental hygiene clinics are held monthly. About 30 patients are cared for in the orthopedic clinic and on an average of 10 persons seek the aid of a psychiatrist each month.
- Lewistown, Pa. The Kiwanis clinic at the Lewistown Hospital has corrected the defects of over 600 welfare patients. During the summer 180 children of relief families received medical and dental care.
- Lexington, N. C. Physical examinations for all children in the county schools are given to eradicate tuberculosis. A health camp was operated for 30 children who needed hospital care.
- Liverpool, N. S. Two clinics, tonsil and dental, were sponsored by Ki-wanis with assistance received from all the local doctors and dentists. A crippled children's clinic was held in November for all children in the county needing surgical and orthopedic assistance.
- don, Ont. A home talent show gave a total gross of \$6,434.05 for under-privileged child activities. The club sent 53 boys to a health camp. London, Ont.
- Los Angeles, Calif. The club has for 14 years sponsored the activities of the McKinley Home for Boys, where on January 1 there were 237 youngsters. Kiwanians are divided into 13 committee groups to care for the responsibilities of this institution. A Key club, vocational guidance and training, athletics, agriculture and general handicraft are activities carried out at the McKinley Home. The Sunset Community Center is a recreational hall for under-privileged boys and girls.

- Lubbock, Tex. The club is interested in a corrective speech clinic and organized a Knot Hole Gang band.
- Madisonville, Ky. Clothing and glasses were provided for members of our boys' club.
- Manitou Springs, Colo. Medical supplies and treatment, glasses and a survey to find children who needed Kiwanis activities was the work of the club during 1935.
- Marengo, Ill. Kiwanis will stress every effort to see to it that all children are given medical, dental and eye examinations each year when school opens.
- Marion, Ohio. The Committee on Under-privileged Child worked with the county relief administration, the city clinic and school officials to find worthy cases where poor sight, deafness, tuberculosis and other diseases handicapped children in their school work. Such youngsters were given Kiwanis care.
- Martinez, Calif. Purchased glasses and books for a number of children and paid a hospital bill for a young man who was injured in a football game.
- Martinsburg, W. Va. Helped to stage a safe and sane Fourth of July and made it possible for poor youngsters to go swimming on summer afternoons.
- Mason City, Iowa. Our second annual apple day sale in November gave us a net profit of over \$700.00 for welfare work. Wives of Kiwanians helped sell apples throughout the city. Milk was provided for underprivileged children in the schools. Medical aid and glasses were supplied to needy children. Two Junior Red Cross units were sponsored in the local schools.
- Medicine Hat, Alta. Seventy-five children were supplied with glasses, clothing and school books. Fifty-five youngsters were sent to the Kiwanis summer camp and a visit was made to rural schools to find children needing medical and other attention.
- Middlesboro, Ky. The Committee on Under-Privileged Child assisted in a drive to secure \$4,000.00 for the Grace Nettleton Home. Dental work was done for 27 worthy youngsters.
- Middletown, Ohio. A clinic for deaf children has been sponsored by the club. There is a class in lip reading. Entertainment was provided for youngsters at a summer camp.
- Milwaukee, Wis. Street car passes were purchased for worthy students and clothing, orthopedic appliances and toys were purchased for individuals and institutions. The Salvation Army was given help in repairing a pier and boats at a fresh air camp.
- Mobile, Ala. Former patients at the Kiwanis Unit of the tuberculosis sanitarium are examined periodically. All children exposed to tuberculosis are given free examinations and medical care. The club donated \$100.00 to the crippled children's clinic at Birmingham. Milk is furnished the under-nourished.
- Monett, Mo. Two blind proteges of the club, attending a school for the blind, were present at a club meeting and read from their Braille books. The club held orthopedic and eye, ear, nose, and throat clinics. Over 248 youngsters were examined. Local and out-of-town doctors and hospitals are aiding in every way possible in giving youngsters the very best treatment.
- Monte Vista, Colo. An organization representing all the civic and church groups in the community was started by Kiwanis to help in underprivileged child work. One boy, who is deaf, was sent to a special training school.
- Montezuma, Ga. Funds were available to equip a Kiwanis room in the hospital. Children were inoculated and given other medical service.
- Montreal, P. Q. The club gives assistance to the Weredale Boys' Home, St. Patrick's Orphanage, Italian Orphanage, School for Crippled Children, The Province of Quebec Society for Crippled Children, the Montreal Children's Hospital and the Griffintown Club. Transportation was provided during the entire year to take crippled children to a clinic. The wives of Kiwanians have a ladies' sewing group, which meets twice a month to make garments for under-privileged youngsters. Assisted the St. Lawrence Kiwanis Club, in an apple day campaign, and the Crippled Children's Society, which held a tag day. Food, milk, toys and entertainment were furnished for the unfortunate youngsters in our city.

- Montrose-La Crescenta, Calif. Providing milk, food, clothing and school books. A summer camp for boys and girls and medical care were underprivileged child activities of the club in 1935.
- Morgan County, W. Va. The club continues to support "The Pines," where crippled children are given care. The treatment is similar to that at Warm Springs, Ga. The water is almost of identical analysis. The club teaches these children handicrafts, as well as regular school work. This makes the youngsters self-supporting after they are discharged. A spe-cial appeal was made to W. P. A. officers for a \$300,000.00 building program for the institution.
- Morganton, N. C. Kiwanis made it possible to have over 3,000 children examined at a clinic to find those afflicted with tuberculosis so these could be isolated and treatment started. One of the major objectives for the year was the plan for building a preventorium camp.
- Newark, N. J. Boys were sent to a summer camp and the club procured medical, dental and eye service, clothing and other necessities for chil-dren of poor parents. Candy novelties are distributed to all nurseries, orphanages and other institutions of the city.
- New Kensington, Pa. The club furnishes all necessary medical attention for under-privileged children. All children having had Kiwanis service must report to doctors for check-ups at various times during the year. Eye examinations must be checked and lenses changed according to schedule. Our Tiny Tim activities are continued each year.
- Newport News, Va. A clinic for crippled children is held each month. Transportation is provided for the youngsters who are receiving orthopedic treatment.
- Newport, Vt. Children needing dental aid whose parents cannot pay for this service are helped by the club.
- Niagara Falls, N. Y. A school room, equipped at a cost of \$1,000.00, is being used for sight-saving and eye-conservation classes. The dental
- clinic, which the club has been operating in the schools, has been taken over by the city. A Kiwanis carnival gave us \$2,000.00 for welfare work. Northeast Detroit, Mich. Purchased medicine, clothing and shoes, gave funds to an orphanage, a hospital, and an institution for the deaf. Sent boys and girls to a summer camp, and held a picnic for children. North Platte, Neb. Transportation is provided for crippled children and
- one boy was sent to the orthopedic hospital at Lincoln. Orthopedic appliances, shoes and glasses were purchased for worthy children.
- Oil City, Pa. Over 100 handicapped children are receiving Kiwanis help. Hospitalization and glasses are furnished free of charge. The club sponsored a home modernization and automobile show as a civic project and secured funds for under-privileged child work.
- Ontario, Ore. In a series of pre-school clinics over 200 children of the county were found needing immediate attention. Both doctors and dentists contributed their services. Over 1,000 children were also immunized against diphtheria.
- Owosso, Mich. The club is sponsoring a county health unit, assisting boys to find work and secure clothing so they may continue their school work. Contributed money to the University hospital in Ann Arbor for playroom equipment.
- Petersburg, Va. During 1935 there were 1,084 individuals in attendance at our clinic. All of them received health examinations. The health nurse made 4,245 home visits. The club furnishes milk, clothing, shoes, glasses, orthopedic appliances, and drugs. A carnival and bazaar in May was successful and gave the club \$3,500.00 for its work among crippled children.
- Pittsburgh, Pa. Shoes, clothing, glasses, medicine, and physiotherapy treatments and appliances were part of the services of the club for under-privileged children. Over 1,200 people attended our annual charity ball.
- Pittsburg, Kan. The Committee on Under-Privileged Child cooperating with the Parent-Teachers' Association supplied hot meals for under-nourished children in five of the city's elementary schools. Over 150 children also received dental care.
- Port Arthur, Tex. Over 400 children attended a Kiwanis dental clinic in 1935. Local doctors contributed their services for all needy children. Free milk is distributed in the schools.

- **Puyallup, Wash.** The supplying of dental aid, orthopedic treatment, nursing service, glasses, cod liver oil, and summer camp vacations are all activities on the under-privileged child program of the club.
- Quincy, Mass. A fund of \$5,300.00 was provided for aiding children having tubercular tendencies. The club provided glasses and dental work and sent boys to a summer camp. Children suffering from infantile paralysis are furnished transportation by Kiwanis, and all of them are receiving treatment at the Children's Hospital in Boston and at a clinic.
- Ravenswood, Chicago. From teachers the club received over 100 names of school children who needed to be investigated and given medical, dental, and optical attention.
- Roxboro, N. C. All children in public schools suffering from defective eyesight are given help. The club strongly urged state officials to give more financial help to orphanages and institutions.
- St. Lawrence, Montreal, P. Q. A total of over \$3,000.00 was given to orphanages and other institutions for the purchase of equipment, clothing, clinic and summer camp necessities, and books. A donation was given the Province of Quebec Society for Crippled Children, and the Vocational Guidance Committee secured glasses for 10 boys. Clothing was given the Griffintown Club for distribution to needy families.
- Salina, Kan. Medical care, glasses, clothing, and furniture are provided the needy. Personal service and Big Brother work is going on for 23 crippled children who need encouragement and help.
- San Francisco, Calif. Hundreds of children and adults are given free examinations every year at a clinic. Those needing hospitalization are admitted to local institutions. A nurse is engaged by Kiwanis to give attention to children and adults at the Telegraph Hill Neighborhood Association. Three boys are being partially supported by Kiwanis.
- Saranac Lake, N. Y. During the first six months of the pre-natal clinic over 250 patients were given examinations and instructions.
- Sharon, Pa. Surveys among school children and youth organizations gave us pertinent information for an active program in under-privileged child work. The club has done some pioneer work in the establishment of a speech clinic in the high school. It was clearly demonstrated to authorities that such work is valuable and should be continued.
- Silsbee, Tex. Over 1,200 school children were examined for tuberculosis. Serum was provided by the club for 58 youngsters who showed infection.
- Smithfield, N. C. Food, clothing, and hospital care are available for underprivileged children. The club secures funds for its welfare work with an annual merchants' exposition and automobile show.
- South Euclid Ohio. A baby clinic for dispensing free health information was given financial help. Milk, food, and glasses were provided for the needy.
- Spokane, Wash. Sixty-eight under-nourished boys and girls from the Pensioned Mothers' Homes attended the Kiwanis Health Center. The average gain in weight per child was three and one-half pounds. Club doctors determined the children who most needed this camp recreation. Free medical, surgical and optical examinations were given all the children. Doctors made weekly visits to inspect the camp. Voluntary subscriptions of \$2,377.00 were pledged for this activity.
- Springfield, Mass. A clinic for immunization was conducted for over a month. Nearly 600 children of pre-school age were in attendance. Over 150 boys and girls enjoyed summer camp privileges.
- Tampa, Fla. A Kiwanis ward was established at the Pine Health Preventorium. The Under-Privileged Child Committee appeared before the county officials requesting immediate improvements at the county detention home. Over 3,000 lunches were provided for under-privileged children. Surgical and orthopedic care was provided for crippled children.
- Thomaston, Ga. During April a diet clinic was held for mothers of underprivileged children. These people are taught the food values of various items and how to prepare such food for youngsters. Each Kiwanian is assigned a child for personal service work. Typhoid serum was administered to over 200 children.

- Wabash, Ind. There were over 100 entries in a healthy baby contest. All school children in the county are examined for tuberculosis. Glasses are provided for needy children.
- Washington, D. C. The Kiwanis clinic held every Friday at the Children's hospital cares for several hundred crippled children every year. This nursing care and orthopedic equipment are supplied. Visits are made to the homes of the children by members of the Instructive Visiting
- Nurses Society. Waterbury, Conn. A post-poliomyelitis clinic gives treatments and orthopedic appliances for all children who became afflicted during the last year. This clinic in past years has given thousands of treatments.
- West Palm Beach, Fla. The club continues to operate its three clinics, the medical and surgical, the eye, ear, nose and throat, and the dental clinic. medical and surgical, the eye, ear, nose and throat, and the dental clinic. The medical and surgical clinic cared for 351 cases. There was a total expenditure of \$1,600.34. The eye, ear, nose and throat clinic had a total of 503 cases, and furnished glasses free of charge. There was a total expenditure of \$954.75. The dental clinic had 6,465 cases, with a total expenditure of \$4,489.39. This clinic employs a full time dentist, and two nurses, all employed and paid by the club. An emergency ward cares for accident cases of school children. The Good Samaritan and the Pine Ridge hospitals co-operate with the club in all its work. The 10th annual under-privileged child benefit show in February care the 10th annual under-privileged child benefit show in February gave the club its funds for all its under-privileged child endeavors. A summer camp was maintained for boys and girls.
- Winnipeg, Man. Assistance is given for finding employment for physically handicapped children. Boys and girls were sent to summer camps, books were provided for needy children, equipment was purchased for otho-pedic and dental services, school children were taken on a picnic, and glasses were purchased for a number of young people. An instrument was purchased to test children for defective hearing. Contributions are made to help an orphan who is training to be a nurse.

The following clubs, while offering various forms of service to the under-privileged, were engaged in securing surgical treatment and hospital care for children, organizing eye, ear, nose, throat, dental and orthopedic clinics, giving aid to the deaf and dumb, and the blind, supervising the President's birthday ball, and purchasing equipment for hospitals and schools for crippled and subnormal children:

Milk and medical treatment are available for all needy children. Health Centers, Children's Hospitals, Day Nurseries and Camps

- Asheville, N. C. Over 1,500 school children were examined for tuberculosis. The Kiwanis preventorium, built at a cost of \$1,500.00 and in charge of registered nurses, cares for the boys and girls who need hospitalization.
- Ashtabula, Ohio. The Griswold Preventorium cares for 50 children who have tubercular tendencies. This camp is sponsored by Ashtabula, Geneva and Conneaut clubs. Donations of fresh vegetables, canned goods, eggs, and other groceries are received from all the townships in the county.
- Bloomington, Ill. One hundred under-privileged children found by the city health department are sent to the Kiwanis health camp.
- Bradenton, Fla. Fifty under-privileged boys and girls from a health clinic were sent to a camp where they received medical attention, good food, and supervised play.
- Brownsville, Pa. Over 200 boys and girls attended our fresh air camp in 1935.
- Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. The Kiwanis health camp is free from debt. In 1935 the club burned the mortgage. The camp is continually being improved and is a haven of rest for children needing attention.
- Dover, Del. The club is establishing a \$10,000.00 community fund for the building of a home for tubercular children.
- Erie, Pa. Camp Kiwanis operated three weeks for 31 boys who received health examinations and medical care before being sent on their vacations.

Hamilton, Ont. The fresh air camp cared for 129 little girls.

- Huntingdon, Pa. Operating for six weeks at a cost of \$1,500.00 the chil-dren's health camp was opened in 1935 for 30 youngsters between the ages of eight and twelve years. These children were taken from homes of poor people.
- Kalamazoo, Mich. During the summer 500 boys and girls are given a camp vacation. The annual budget for this activity of the club is over \$6,000.00. The children are provided with shoes and other necessities.
- Kent, Ohio. A preventorium and health camp for pre-tubercular children is open every year. It was operated at a cost of \$1,900.00 in 1935.
- New Haven, Conn. Camp Happyland was operated by the club for underprivileged children and others showing tubercular tendencies. Three new cabins were built at Camp Cedarcrest. Several thousand boys and girls who otherwise would have no summer recreation are given the opportunity of spending time out-of-doors.
- New Liskeard, Ont. Two hundred children enjoyed Camp Kiwanis in 1935. The club supplies milk and clothing to all needy youngsters.
- Portsmouth, Va. Over 100 children attended the fresh air farm during the summer. Over \$1,000.00 worth of improvements were made during the year.
- Regina, Sask. Nearly 200 boys were given a free camp vacation. The club supplies glasses for all needy children.
- St. Marys, W. Va. Over 175 children from 12 counties were at our camp which has a staff of 15 nurses, cooks, house mothers, and guards. The state department of welfare selected Kiwanis Park as a site for fresh air camps for all under-privileged children coming from families who are on relief.
- Salisbury, N. C. The club operates an ideal camp for tubercular children. It opens each year about June 1 and costs approximately \$2,000.00 for the season. The children are under supervision receiving both rest and play periods and are on special diet. The death rate due to tuberculosis among children has decreased 50 per cent. The home demonstration clubs of the county donate the fresh vegetables and fruits for the camp.

Savannah, Ga. The Kiwanis Sunshine Unit is open to boys and girls suf-fering with tuberculosis. Medical attention, clothing and school tuition is provided for needy youngsters.

Kiwanis strives "To promote the spirit of mutual understanding between the farmer and the city man by encouraging an appreciation of their common aims and purposes." The accomplishments in furthering the development of better town and country relations, during 1935, shows varied activities of real value. The results for the past year were as follows:

General

- Alexandria, Va. The annual farmers' day meeting was held with 55 rural residents as our guests.
- Altus, Okla. Officers of 20 farm women's clubs were our guests and a number of Kiwanis-Farmer meetings were held during the year.
- Amarillo, Tex. The Committee on Urban-Rural Relations made plans for a farmers' and exhibitors' day at the Tri-State Fair. All were guests of the club at this annual event. Stock was purchased for 4-H club members.
- Americus, Ga. Two hundred farmers were taken to see a soil erosion control project.
- Arkansas City, Kan. The Committee on Agriculture was placed in charge of the livestock show at a county fair. Farmers were helped to secure loans to buy milk cows. An essay for rural students and a picnic for farmers and business men were other activities during the year.
- Astoria, Ill. The club arranged to hold a series of meetings in communities near Astoria so rural and urban people could become better acquainted.
- Auburn, Neb. The second annual county corn husking contest was held in October, with 1,000 in attendance. Many farmers in our community have entered a pasture contest. Four-H clubs were given assistance during a county fair.
- Auburn, Wash. A good-will tour in April covered all communities in this area. Farmers were given a free theatre party and Kiwanians attended Grange meetings during the year.
- Bend, Ore. One of the main objectives is to have farmers diversify their crops, utilize more home-grown foodstuffs and exchange surplus produce to the advantage of local farm sections. Kiwanis is also encouraging a better grade of livestock and poultry, head lettuce growing and Grange activities. A 4-H worker was sent to summer school.
- Benicia, Calif. A rural fire district was formed and fire fighting equipment purchased to protect this area.
- Big Stone Gap, Va. The Committee on Agriculture co-operates with farmers in their production and marketing problems. Prizes are purchased by Kiwanis for 4-H club activities.
- Bloomsburg, Pa. The 12th annual Kiwanis-Farmer dinner was attended by over 350 people. Each year this meeting is increasing in popularity.
- Bluffton, Ind. The club promoted a street fair, a county corn husking contest, paid the expenses for 4-H members sent to a leadership camp and attended a number of town-city meetings.
- Boscobel, Wis. Special trade days are held in our city for farmers who wish to take advantage of the sales. In January an educational meeting, free dancing and music was the program for farmers' day. Over 2,000 were in attendance.
- Capitol Hill, Oklahoma City, Okla. Kiwanis is interested in assisting farmers in soil conservation and having their lands terraced.
- Cedartown, Ga. Three hundred farmers are interested in a soil erosion program.
- Center, Colo. Three adult classes in agriculture are conducted five evenings each week. Kiwanis sees to it that all farm problems are discussed. An active part was taken in a potato show.
- Centralia, Wash. Met during the year with Grange groups, assisted in a strawberry festival and helped to entertain over 800 farmers and their wives.
- Clanton, Ala. Two hundred farmers were taken to an agriculture experimental station. Seven hundred boys and girls of the 4-H clubs were entertained at an Easter egg hunt and rally.

- Clatskanie, Ore. The annual window fair in 1935 was very successful and had an excellent display of local products. This year a flower show and household arts exhibit were added to the fair. Kiwanis met with Grange groups, interested farmers in plant disease control, sponsored a soil survey, helped 4-H clubs and directed an urban-rural soft-ball league for 60 members.
- Copperhill, Tenn. In September 300 exhibits were entered in our agriculture and home-craft fair, which had an attendance of over 5,000. A number of farmers' meetings were held in 1935.
- Corinth, Miss. The club co-operates with the county demonstration agent in all his endeavors.
- **Crosby, N. D.** On club meeting day each Kiwanian who sees a farmer in town brings him as his guest. Held a whist tournament for the people of the rural communities.
- Dade City, Fla. The club is working to secure an agricultural agent for the county.
- Dadeville, Ala. Sponsored a county-wide picnic with 3,000 in attendance. Assisted the demonstration agent with a 4-H club rally and had 12 agricultural meetings during the year to discuss farm problems. The club takes pride in its record of farm progress, having reclaimed 22,500 acres of farm land by proper terracing. The planting of winter legumes has increased from 23,000 pounds in 1932 to 300,000 pounds in 1935. Over 3,000 business men and farmers have made a study of soil erosion work in the county.
- Davenport, Iowa. Twenty-five thousand people attended the Iowa corn husking championship meeting in November. The winner was Elmer Carlson. Over 500 volunteer workers were needed to prepare for this event. The fifth annual 4-H achievement show program was held in November. Farm boys and girls were sent to the International Livestock Exposition in Chicago.
- Detroit Lakes, Minn. Farmers were taken to a livestock show at Crookston. The Committee on Agriculture supervised the distribution of 500 ewes in this territory, went on a turkey tour, assisted with a two-day seed show and attended a series of rural meetings.
- DuBois, Pa. A number of ladies' nights were held in rural churches in this vicinity.
- Elkton, Md. Farmer meetings were held to outline the necessity of having good farm inventories before credit extensions could be secured.
- El Paso, Tex. At the Southwest Livestock show Kiwanis was responsible for the hog exhibit division.
- Florence, Ala. A county-wide soil erosion program is under way. This club has won the Howard Yielding cup for outstanding work in agriculture.
- Fort Myers, Fla. Succeeded in securing a permanent county agricultural agent. Pigs were purchased for farm boys.
- Galesburg, Ill. Held a spelling bee for adults in a small rural community. This affair was greatly enjoyed as were many agricultural meetings held during 1935.
- Gordon, Neb. The Committee on Urban-Rural Relations organized and financed a rural baseball league with 11 teams composed of farmers within a radius of 30 miles of our community. Delegates were sent to an A. A. Meeting in Washington, D. C.
- Grafton, W. Va. A succession of rural meetings were held during 1935.
- Greensburg, Pa. A farmers' institute, under Kiwanis sponsorship, was planned by the club.
- Hamburg, Iowa. All fruit growers of the community were at a meeting to discuss the advancement of this industry.
- Harrisburg, Ill. A community fair was held in October, with exhibits of household arts, farm products, cattle and horses. A farmers' auction sale now sells on an average of \$5,000.00 worth of farm produce, livestock, etc., each week. A number of 4-H poultry and pig clubs were started. A cup was donated for a high school poultry show and 159 farmers were guests at one meeting.

- Henrietta, Tex. Kiwanians worked with the county commissioners to secure a home demonstration agent who would hold classes in canning, home beautification, diet, etc. Four-H club boys are given Kiwanis
- Hogansville, Ga. The Committee on Agriculture is working with farmers to have established a one variety cotton crop. Several thousand bushels of seed have already been distributed to farmers.
- Hollywood, Fla. The club was instrumental in securing funds for farmers and fruit growers who lost their crops through a heavy frost. A number of get-together meetings were held during the year.
- Hominy, Okla. The Committee on Agriculture established an agency so farm lands could be listed and prospective tenants might register.
- Hope, Ark. Once a week the club makes a good-will tour into the rural districts.
- Hoquiam, Wash. A series of farmer-merchant, Grange and good-will tours were the agricultural activities of the club.
- Inglewood, Calif. The Committee on Urban-Rural Relations was responsible for a forum contest, which was of interest to the entire community and country district.
- Jackson, Ga. A community canning plant has been built and is in full operation. Help is given the county agent in his 4-H club work.
- Jefferson City, Mo. The club traveled nearly 400 miles attending 18 meetings with farm folks and organized 17 Four-H clubs. Certified seed corn was given to farm boys.
- Jonesboro, Ark. Donated \$300.00 for premiums for the Northeast Arkansas Fair. Promoted a series of rural meetings, assisted the 4-H clubs in getting pedigreed stock, completed plans for remodeling a curb market and helped to raise funds to pay the salaries of a county agent and a home demonstration agent.
- Kent, Wash. Meetings were held to discuss foreign trade and its affect on agriculture and the milk industry. The second annual lettuce festival received Kiwanis co-operation and transportation was furnished for 4-H girls.
- Klamath Falls, Ore. Co-operated with the federal government and county officials in helping those on relief to get located on small tracts of land. Good-will meetings were held in the country under the direction of the Committee on Urban-Rural Relations.
- Lewistown, Ill. Farmers in the vicinity were given an opportunity to dispose of unnecessary breeding stock when the club promoted a rooster day. Local merchants also offered special sales at this time.
- Madison, S. D. Over 10,000 people attended a state corn husking contest. There are 220 boys and girls enrolled in the 4-H clubs, which is one of the main objectives of Kiwanis.
- Madisonville, Ky. Through the work of Kiwanis, a cheese plant was secured for the city. It will handle 30,000 pounds of milk daily thereby giving a market to the farmers in this section.
- Marion, Ky. Kiwanis several years ago sponsored a strawberry association, which is now highly successful. A series of community meetings were held in rural districts and 4-H members were given help.
- Marion, Va. A Kiwanis good-will tour took 160 business men into all the counties surrounding our city.
- Meade, Kan. Livestock sales are held once each week. The club this year held a barbecue, with an attendance of over 1,200. In December members of the 4-H clubs were entertained.
- Medicine Hat, Alta. Members of the Committee on Agriculture attend all rural picnics and farm meetings and keep in close touch with the people and the problems of our rural sections. Free seed was distributed to responsible farmers and a close touch is maintained with rural districts in our school visitations.
- Milton, Fla. A trade week festival was conducted in December to bring together the town and country people.
- Mitchell, S. D. Luncheon was served for 1,800 farmers who attended a road show. A financial contribution was made for the 4-H club achievement day.

- Moberly, Mo. Kiwanis is interested in all the work of the dairy men of this community. Winners in the 4-H state contest were entertained.
- Moline, Ill. Over 5,000 were present at the Kiwanis-Farmers' party, at which time the city and rural folks have a chance to get better acquainted. Kiwanians also attended farmer parties held in rural districts.
- Mt. Pleasant, Pa. A farmers' institute, an annual affair, could not accommodate all the farm folks who wished to attend. A theatre was engaged in which to hold this affair. The institute is one of the major activities of Kiwanis in this section.
- Nampa, Idaho. A farmers' institute, attended by 200 rural folks, was a success. A 4-H club member was given funds to attend a short course at the University of Idaho.
- Neillsville, Wis. Assistance was given a group of farmers so a highway leading into town could be improved. Four hundred rural children from the county attended the annual seed judging contest. A country-community dinner was attended by Kiwanians.
- Nephi, Utah. A poultry caravan visited a hatchery to secure information. A number of drought wells were dug so farmers could have water supply. Sponsored a county 4-H club exhibit and achievement program, sent 4-H leaders to the Utah State Agriculture College and the Spanish Fork Livestock Show and arranged an educational tour for the young people to industrial plants.
- New Albany, Miss. The club is interested in a plant-to-prosper program. This is an endeavor to see what improvements a farmer can create on his farm, in his home and to raise the standard of living for farm life. Kiwanis effort is directed toward stressing the value of the county as a dairying center and a good locality for the cheese industry. Speakers were provided for the 4-H club.
- New Liskeard, Ont. Assistance is given local farmers in their grading and marketing problems. Kiwanians are now interested in developing a company, as a community enterprise, with the idea of establishing a warehouse and getting machinery for grading of all farm produce. Lamb and potato clubs are given assistance.
- Norton, Va. The club is trying to develop an interest in farming. A farm agent has been engaged with the hope that this section will develop poultry raising, dairying and fruit growing.
- Oak Cliff, Dallas, Tex. The club was represented on the program of the county fair. Our main interest is to improve the relationship between the town and country people.
- Ontario, Calif. The Committee on Agriculture arranged for a demonstration of vineyard spraying. Windshield stickers, "Save Our Forests," were distributed in a fire prevention campaign and legislation was discussed in the interest of our country population.
- Ottawa, Ohio. At the county fair the two healthiest children under one year of age were given cash prizes.
- Panama City, Fla. The work of the Committee on Agriculture was to increase the area given over to dairy and poultry production.
- Pekin, Ill. Assistance is given the agricultural department of the high school where night classes are held for farmers and young men. Better transportation is sought for rural pupils attending the high school and the club co-operates with the county farm bureau and the 4-H clubs.
- Pierre, S. D. The Iroquois Federation of 11 towns arranged to secure trees for planting in school yards, parks and around lakes. There are over 300 members in this organization. Numerous country meetings were held by Kiwanis during the year.
- Pineville, Ky. A rehabilitation program for the county is under way and the club is endorsing a public health unit, meetings with farmers, 4-H activities and a county fair.
- Roxboro, N. C. All the summer meetings were held in different communities throughout the county. The club's work is to induce farmers to sell their tobacco in the local market.
- St. John, N. B. Fifty competitors participated in an annual ploughing match, which had an attendance of over 1,000 people.

Salem, W. Va. Specialists on potato and fruit production were brought to our city so all farmers could benefit by their lectures. The club sponsors 4-H club work.

- Sandusky, Ohio. A farmer-merchants' banquet was held in September. Santa Cruz, Calif. A good-will tour was made of the entire county visiting farms, homes, schools, etc. Kiwanis co-operates in all the work of the
- Sedalia, Mo. Delegates to the Clover Prosperity Conference were enter-tained and the Urban-Rural Committee is assisting a soil erosion or-ganization. Certified seed corn was given 24 boys and at the end of the year a 4-H corn show was held.
- Spring City, Tenn. The farmers' exchange now has 100 members. A study is being made of rural electrification for our territory. A farmers' night was held in June.

- Thomasville, Ga. A community canning plant was put into operation, giv-ing employment to more than 100 men and women. Three hundred books were added to the libraries of county schools. Assistance was given to make a barbecue, with 7,000 in attendance, one of the big affairs of the year.
- Visits are made to all the rural communities and our assistance is given in every way to combat soil erosion. Nine hundred people at-tended two drives, in which 22,500 rabbits were killed. The drive cov-ered an area 12 miles square. Getting rid of these pests helped farmers to save their wheat crops. Kiwanians helped in working out the details for a county fair. Vega, Tex.

- Grand Island, Neb. Our annual 4-H club picnic and achievement day entertained 300 young farm people.
- Greencastle, Ind. We sponsored a 4-H club fair taking full charge of all the business routine.
- Gresham, Ore. Scholarships were provided for two boys and girls for 4-H club achievements. All representative farmers were guests at a special meeting.
- Harlan, Ky. Two hundred 4-H members planted black walnut trees at their homes. Fifty others sent exhibits to London, Kentucky. Prizes were awarded to the county champions in the home practice and farm practice demonstration teams. Nearly 400 members of the 4-H clubs competed in an annual county-wide flower show and fair.
- Hartford, Conn. Worked with boys and girls in calf, poultry and garden projects. A series of Kiwanis tours were held to educate young people of the rural districts in community, state, and national affairs.

.

- Hibbing, Minn. Farm magazines are furnished free to 4-H members who are engaged in poultry-raising projects. The club held a special farmers' day, sought to have more of the rural men appointed on the fair board, endorsed a \$50,000.00 seed fund, and became interested in the possibility of a canning factory for the community.
- Indiana Kiwanis District. During the past four years 1,150 boys and girls from 80 counties in Indiana have attended the 4-H Leadership Training Camp, which is sponsored by Kiwanis clubs of the district. The youths are between the ages of 16 and 21 and are in the 4-H organization. Experienced leaders are instructors at the camp.
- Jamestown, N. Y. Over 1,000 children and adults from the rural sections of the county were entertained.
- Jasper, Ala. All 4-H club members were enrolled in projects for which Kiwanis offered a series of prizes. One young 4-H member was sent to Washington, D. C. as the reward for his work. Kiwanis was successful in securing a full-time county agent. A series of rural meetings were held to promote better marketing facilities.
- Kansas City, Mo. A vocational livestock judging contest at the American Royal Livestock Show was in charge of Kiwanis. Our club was also responsible for a reception and registration during Missouri Day at this show. Approximately 400 boys and girls were present.
- Los Angeles, Calif. A 4-H club was organized at the McKinley Home, where rabbits, poultry, and pigs are raised. A number of boys were sent to the annual state encampment.
- Memphis, Tenn. One hundred boys were provided with cotton and corn seed. An exhibit was held at the end of the year. Nearly 2,000 boys were in attendance at an annual barbecue and dance which gave us \$1,700.00 for our activities.
- Miles City, Mont. Children from 100 miles radius attended the rural field meet held in May. One delegate was sent to the national convention of the Future Farmers of America in Kansas City, and Kiwanis also helped to pay the expenses of a delegate to the National 4-H congress. Over 1,800 rural people attended the annual fall farmers' frolic. Rural meetings were held in May.
- Milwaukee, Wis. There were 1,500 members of the 4-H clubs of the county who attended achievement day. Eight scholarships were awarded for the agricultural short course and the annual 4-H camp at Madison. Kiwanis cooperation is given to the Milwaukee County Holstein Association for sponsoring a May ball, proceeds of which were used to provide prizes for the 4-H calf projects.
- Modesto, Calif. A 4-H party was attended by 300 young people and two scholarships were awarded winners so they could attend the state agricultural college.
- Monroe, La. At the parish fair 50 gold 4-H buttons were awarded to boys and girls having superior exhibits. Three tuition awards for the state university are also provided. Several hundred prizes were available for over 1,200 competing members in home demonstration projects.
- Morris, Minn. A field day was held at the fair grounds for 4-H club members and Kiwanis sponsored a banquet for these young people during county fair time.
- Mountain Grove, Mo. Strawberry and tomato projects for vocational agricultural students were sponsored by Kiwanis.
- Mt. Gilead, Ohio. Funds were available for building a school work shop with a blacksmithing outfit and printing presses. Members of the F.F.A. have the opportunity of working in this shop. A farm-town day for securing better cooperation between the two groups was held in April.
- Muscatine, Iowa. Kiwanis sponsored a celebration for rural school children, and a series of farm meetings was held during the year.
- Nappanee, Ind. Two members of the 4-H club were sent to a junior leadership camp, and Kiwanis was interested in sponsoring a 4-H fair.
- New Westminster, B. C. Boys and girls of the district will organize for a sheep contest and stock judging endeavor. A silver trophy was given as a competitive prize in livestock work.

- Ogden, Utah. The Committee on Agriculture helps the young Future Farmers of America to keep record books on their various projects. Several of the young farm people took awards at the fair in Salt Lake City. Kiwanis support goes for a full F.F.A. program at the county high school.
- Okemah, Okla. Dayton Rose had the grand champion Duroc Jersey, and Clyde Shay had the best Hampshire at the district and the Oklahoma City fat stock-shows. Seventeen county boys won prizes totaling \$250.00 at the two shows. A minstrel show was played for the country people in various rural sections.
- Oklahoma City, Okla. Kiwanis gave \$300.00 to help county F.F.A. boys to purchase first class livestock and poultry. Prizes were awarded to winners at a livestock show.
- Omaha, Neb. Health examinations were given 100 boys and girls of the county 4-H health clubs. Seven young people were sent to a district camp, and the club presented leadership pins to the winners in the county home project endeavor.
- Oshawa, Ont. At the fall fair Kiwanis sponsored junior exhibits, awarded prizes, and later gave a banquet for 50 members of the junior farmers' club who were awarded prizes totaling \$180.00.
- Peninsula-Portland, Ore. Kiwanis sponsored 4-H club work, inspected garden projects, presented three scholarships for the summer school at Corvallis and was responsible for a picnic for the young farm people.
- Port Arthur-Fort William, Ont. Four hundred boys and girls of the junior farmers' clubs were entertained at an annual fair. We also provided meals, sleeping quarters, prizes for exhibits at a cost of \$1,000.00, and an appropriation of \$600.00 allocated to the Agriculture Committee for the junior farmers' activities.
- Riverdale, Toronto, Ont. Medals were presented to the boy and girl winning the highest marks in township entrance examinations. Three cash prizes were also given to the men having the best community garden plots; and a silver shield was awarded in an annual plowing match.
- Roseburg, Ore. Josephine Wright, a 12 year old 4-H member, won first place in the canned meats division at the Chicago International Livestock Exposition. Prizes were given for community fairs, and a Kiwanis booth was in operation at all these fall festivals. Forty children of the county were taken to the 4-H summer school at Oregon State College. Kiwanis Kapers were presented at four Grange meetings, and the proceeds were used for 4-H scholarship funds.
- St. Johnsbury, Vt. Eighty boys and girls were entered in a garden contest for which Kiwanis awarded cash prizes and a silver trophy cup.
- Sidney, Mont. The county 4-H club exhibits were displayed at the Great Falls fair. Achievement pins were given to 4-H club winners. A home talent show was presented in 16 county communities. Members traveled over 650 miles to present the entertainment.
- Tallahassee, Fla. Two state scholarships are awarded each year for girls of the canning clubs.
- Tillamook, Ore. Kiwanians supervised 4-H teams for state fair competition, furnished all the 4-H achievement pins for the county, sponsored athletic contests at a fair, assisted in the preparation of agricultural exhibits, arranged to entertain all the children at the county fair, and directed a 4-H club forest project. Other activities were to secure prominent speakers to discuss farm problems. Met with nearby Grange groups, entertained the county fair board, and arranged for a series of summer rural meetings.
- Toronto, Ont. There were 150 members of the junior farm boys' clubs at one of our luncheons. Ten of these young people were given scholarships for the Ontario Agriculture College at Guelph. Kiwanians attended a field day meeting held for the junior farm boys.
- Troy, N. Y. Our 12th annual potato day, when crops were judged and prizes awarded, was held in the fall. We paid the expenses for sending two 4-H girls to a state gathering.

- Waterloo, Iowa. We encourage all 4-H activities in the county, sent four boys to attend a 4-H short course at Iowa State College, and were active in organizing a rural youth movement.
- Wausau, Wis. Kiwanis sponsored the ninth annual short course and fiveday vocational school for 40 boys of the county. The school included instruction in wood and metal work, care of tools, etc. A prize was awarded for a 4-H calf contest.

Seven 4-H boys and girls were sent to the district leadership camp, and Kiwanis was responsible for a county 4-H achievement meeting.
- Barrie, Ont. A county potato fair, a horse show, and the supplying of over 100 boys with certified seed potatoes were the activities of 1935.
- Belington, W. Va. The seventh annual festival and fair was held in October. Kiwanians visited with farmers in rural communities.

- Dawson, Ga. The peanut festival, which included a fair and carnival, cleared about \$300.00.

- Freeport, Ill. The fall festival includes exhibits of home economics, corn products, a quilt show and a milking and a corn husking contest. Two thousand people attended the final corn husking contest.
- Fremont, Neb. The fourth annual 4-H tri-county fair was under the sponsorship of Kiwanis. A fall harvest festival was also very successful.
- Greenfield, Mass. Assisted in the advance sale of tickets for a county fair.
- Hampton, Va. The club gave its assistance in sponsoring a county fair after such an exposition had been discontinued. A number of farm-city meetings were held during 1935.

Vocational guidance was added during the convention year of 1925-26 by Kiwanis as an International Objective. Listed here are a few of the

- Ames, Iowa. Arrangements were made for a series of nine weekly broad-casts on vocational guidance.
- Ann Arbor, Mich. Twenty Kiwanians gave vocational talks at the city's
- Ann Albor, milder a work and an analysis and a state of the high school. Ashland, Ky. There are 30 members in our Key club at the high school. Two of the boys attend each regular Kiwanis meeting.
- Baltimore, Md. The club planned a community survey to find what occu-
- pations might have ready jobs so unemployment could be relieved. Bend, Ore. A check is kept on all lines of business to find if any youths are needed for Saturday or other extra hours of work. If there is anything available high school students who are interested in a certain line
- thing available high school students who are interested and the event in a certain line of endeavor are given an opportunity to fill these part-time jobs. Billings, Mont. The Committee on Vocational Guidance is helping all the young people of the community who are just out of school and looking for employment. All applicants are registered and business houses notified of these young people. We established an employment bureau to also seek work for students during the summer vacation.
- Birmingham, Ala. A contribution was given to help pay the expenses for a life career conference at which Kiwanians acted as presiding officers. a life career conference at which known all over the South attended this meeting.
- Boonville, Mo. The club is extending its vocational guidance program into the rural schools. There are group lectures and individual counseling
- for all students. Buffalo, N. Y. Contacts were made with 170 boys of the high school. Ki-wanians interviewed each of them regarding their particular interests and offered vocational advice and help.
- The Committee on Vocational Guidance makes it possible Camden, N. J. for high school graduates to interview various industrial and business men in the community for vocational instruction and advice.
- Clarinda, Iowa. Thirty volumes on vocational guidance for a library and a series of 12 addresses on this subject was the work of the club during 1935
- Clatskanie, Ore. Arrangements were made for young people to go on inspectional tours of local stores and plants. Part-time work was secured for a number of young people and a vocational interest survey was held in the schools.
- Crosby, N. D. A Kiwanis scholarship is available to the student showing the best record in all-around activities.
- Darlington, S. C. A medal was awarded for the best essay on "My Pro-posed Life Work and Why I Am Suited for It."
- Davenport, Iowa. After years of diligent work, there has been established at St. Ambrose College a regular course in vocational guidance. This is not only a part of the curriculum of the institution, but it is available to the high school. Kiwanians and others appear before the classes to lecture on their business interests.
- t Los Angeles, Calif. There were 26 vocational groups consisting of over 1,500 girls, all sponsored by the wives of Kiwanians, which par-ticipated in a vocational guidance program. The Committee on Voca-tional Guidance also was in contact with 1,400 boys, a great percentage of whom were definitely under-privileged. The Key club is very active. East Los Angeles, Calif. During the summer months efforts were made to secure employment for young people.
- Fort Wayne, Ind. All young women interested in home economics were given an opportunity to hear lectures on the subject. Young people of the community were given a chance to hear lectures discussing the advantages and disadvantages of all professional, technical and social endeavors.
- Franklin Park, Ill. The program of vocational activity in the club was to conduct a survey determining what is being done in schools, homes, churches and civic groups toward vocational education; to have the club consult boys and girls concerning various vocations, to secure good books on vocations and to interview young people who need ad-vice. The club is also interested in sponsoring a hobby campaign.

- Harlan, Ky. High school students were secured part-time work in offices. This gave the young people direct experience in work they desired. All merchants and professional men are co-operating in the work.
- Harrisburg, Pa. The club spent approximately \$3,000.00 so Miss Ruth Keller could complete four years at a teachers' college, where she studied home economics. All young people are enlightened as to business and industrial careers. Hendersonville, N. C. Four prizes were awarded for the best essays in the
- city and county schools on "My Life's Work.
- Kirkland Lake, Ont. Thirteen members of the Committee on Vocational Guidance worked with the Institute of Mining and Metallurgy for se-curing apprentice jobs for 50 boys.
- Lawrence, Kan. A manual training school, during the vacation period, was conducted by the club for the boys of the junior high grades. The youths are permitted to make anything they choose and this endeavor is very successful.
- Los Angeles, Calif. Boys leaving the McKinley Home are placed in em-ployment for which they are best fitted and where advancement is possible. Vocational talks are given at the high schools and before the Key clubs, with speakers obtained from among the leading business and professional men of the city.
- Mendota, Ill. Our Committee on Vocational Guidance sponsors the making of career books by the senior class of the high school. Each member outlines the career he or she expects to follow and prizes are awarded for the best work.
- Miami, Fla. The club conducts annual vocational conferences at the high school where 2,000 students have the opportunity of discussing all occupations.
- Newark, N. J. Thirty-two members of the Key club are sponsored by individual Kiwanians of our club. The boys report each week to their sponsor and all have been given full memberships at the Y. M. C. A.
 Newport, Wash. Personal interviews were given to over 180 youngsters. There were vocational talks on various subjects and positions were
- secured for 16 youths.
- Ocala, Fla. Vocational guidance books were distributed to all the school libraries throughout the county.
- Olympia, Wash. Personal interviews were emphasized as the major vocational work for 1935. The most popular vocations, according to a survey, were on stenography, teaching, engineering and business. Esti-mated receipts of \$2,920.00 was the total secured by the boys and girls who worked on public projects. Many of these youths come from homes unable to afford the bare necessities of life and of school. The youths were secured 336 part-time jobs.
- Pasco, Wash. Employment service is maintained for needy high school students. Co-operation is given the schools in vocational guidance work and lectures and interviews are available for all students.
- Pekin, Ill. For four years Kiwanians have been contacting students and assisting them in choosing a vocation. Others were helped in getting free scholarships in agriculture, home economics and other courses. Splendid co-operation is given the club by all colleges and institutions.
- Peterborough, Ont. Vocational books were distributed throughout the schools of the city.
- South Euclid, Ohio. All unemployed young men between the ages of 18 and 25 were contacted with the hope of getting them adjusted. Their names are kept in a card system which is the property of the club. Vocational talks and personal conferences, visits to manufacturing plants and special instructions in the schools on vocational guidance were some of the activities of the club for 1935.
- Tipton, Ind. A six-weeks course of vocational guidance was conducted at the high school by members of the club. Kiwanians gave talks on their business enterprises.
- Trenton, N. J. Many physically handicapped young men and women are rehabilitated by the club. All of these individuals get employment training and later are given temporary or full time positions. When an applicant is unsuccessful in his work the Rehabilitation Commission is notified and the person is returned for more training. In this way the club overcomes the breaking down of morale of a boy or a girl.

- Vancouver, B. C. During 1935 there were 85 vocational talks by 31 Kiwanians and others on 41 subjects. Nearly 5,000 students in the elementary and high schools heard the lectures. We conducted a number of plant visits. A number of youngsters were given individual instruction.
- Washington, D. C. During 1935 a series of radio talks was given over station WRC on vocational subjects. These lectures were mimeographed and copies sent upon request to interested persons and schools.
- Waterloo, Iowa. A number of conferences gave thousands of boys a chance to hear about forestry, engineering, dramatics, journalism, etc. Fiftyone boys secured Kiwanis counselors. Employment is frequently secured for high school boys.
- West Bend, Wis. There were 430 essays received in our annual contest among high school students who wish to determine their life's occupation. Group lectures are given in the schools on occupational subjects.

EDUCATIONAL WORK

Many activities were undertaken by Kiwanis clubs during the past twelve months. Educational assistance was given students, schools, faculties and authorities.

- Aberdeen, N. C. An award was made to the Cedar Hills school for having won three consecutive years a cup presented by the club for good school attendance. Kiwanians were interested in urging the increase of teachers' pay throughout the state.
- Albany, Ga. The senior class was given assistance in raising funds for the publishing of a high school annual. Each year an award is made to the outstanding graduate of the high school class.
- Alice, Tex. Kiwanians were directly responsible for maintaining the local school system in good condition. Over \$3,000.00 in delinquent taxes were collected early in the year for educational work.
- Allentown, Pa. Three medals and three cash prizes were presented to the seniors of the high school on the basis of outstanding work in special departments during the four years at school.
- Ashland, Ky. Magazines are supplied to the settlement schools in the eastern part of the state.
- Astoria, Ore. Each year the high school faculty selects a boy and girl who have been outstanding in scholarship, leadership and citizenship and engraves their names on the cup which the club presented to the school in 1923.
- Atlantic City, N. J. The club entertained the 1935 graduating class of the high school. The three winners of the club's annual essay contest were presented with gold medals and a typewriter was given to the student having the best rating in commercial subjects. During the time of the convention of the National Education Association a special Kiwanis meeting was held for the representatives.
- Baxley, Ga. The club co-operated with city officials to obtain new and adequate school buildings and is giving its support to a state bill for free text books in Georgia.
- Berwyn, Ill. The club took an active part in selecting candidates for the board of education of the high school and grammar school. Three years ago a Citizens Committee was formed whose duty it was to keep the schools out of politics.

- Buffalo, N. Y. Correspondence school courses were awarded to underprivileged young people through the Boys Work Committee.
- Charleston, S. C. Awarded three prizes for essays by high school and preparatory school students on "The Constitution of the United States."
- Charlottesville, Va. A scholarship was made available for a young man. Kiwanians with their wives spent a very pleasant evening at the Blue Ridge Industrial School.
- Chester, Pa. Honor students were entertained and awarded 12 Kiwanis Builds Forever pins.
- Clermont, Fla. A committee found many high school graduates in the community who were unable to attend college. A series of meetings are held to encourage these young people to study at home. A class in current social problems was started for these young people.

- Greenville, Ky. A Buy-in-Greenville campaign, known as Kiwanis Trade Day, had a 100 per cent response from all the business people in our community.

BOYS' WORK

- Ada, Okla. Each member has become interested in personal service work and acts as a Big Brother to some worthy boy. We held an annual picnic for 50 newsboys and co-operated with the state in a national youth movement.
- Albany, Ore. Three boys, paroled from the circuit court on a petty larceny charge, are being given special attention by Kiwanians.
- Alhambra, Calif. The club works with the police court and welfare workers giving moral guidance wherever it is needed. A hobby show had 504 entries which covered every conceivable display.
- Altoona, Pa. A Buddy Club at the Y. M. C. A. has a membership of 100 under-privileged boys. Meetings are held once a week.
- Amarillo, Tex. Members of the Under-Privileged Child Committee are active in juvenile delinquency work and all Kiwanians are assigned to care for delinquent boys and girls. During 1935 there were 25 cases which received Kiwanis attention.
- Anderson, Ind. A survey was made in neighborhoods where a reduction in delinquency was necessary and the club co-operated with authorities in cases where worthy families needed help.
- Ann Arbor, Mich. A special room at the Y. M. C. A. was secured where youths between the ages of 16 and 25 could congregate at meetings. These young men out of school but unable to find employment are given the help of Kiwanians. Four cases involving problem boys were investigated and given Kiwanis service. The Y. M. C. A. was aided in its summer camp activity.
- We observed National Youth Week with the assistance of Astoria, Ore. the Chamber of Commerce and the schools. A Kiwanis meeting was conducted by the young son of one of our members.

- Atlanta, Ga. Members of the Better Boys committee help first offenders who need supervision. A junior club, composed of 21 boys under 12 years of age, has been started at the Hillside Cottages. This group holds regular meetings and carries on an inspirational program.
- Austin, Chicago. Youths of foreign parentage who lack the opportunity of fellowship in organized groups are entertained through Big Brother activities.
- Belleville, Ont. The net returns on our annual carnival were nearly \$14,-000.00. This money is used for boys' work, playgrounds, Y. M. C. A., Boy Scouts, public health activities, etc.
- **Bloomsburg**, **Pa.** All paroled boys are given Kiwanis aid. Classes are held at the court house for all the delinquents and the Committee on Vocational Guidance seeks employment for some of these youths.
- Bluefield, W. Va. Books are collected and sent to a reform institution for establishing a library.
- Boston, Mass. Kiwanis gives financial aid to maintain a club located in one of the poorer districts. Facilities include a gymnasium, library and a hall for music and dancing. One hundred boys have been given memberships in the Y. M. C. A.
- Buckley, Wash. A young man committed to the state training school convicted of homicide has an excellent educational record. It is hoped that a better environment can be found for him.
- Butler, Pa. Boys having difficulties with the law are paroled to Kiwanians who act as Big Brothers. A number of boys were sent to a Y. M. C. A. camp.
- Caldwell-West Essex, N. J. The club is interested in providing a place of recreation for boys between the ages of 16 and 20 years. Such a tommunity center keeps the young people off the streets and out of taverns.
- Canoga Park-Reseda, Calif. An organized group of Mexican boys are being helped and a number of Kiwanians are Big Brothers to underprivileged youths.
- Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Problem boys are given Y. M. C. A. memberships and personal contacts are maintained by Kiwanians.
- Chatham, Ont. Approximately \$2,200.00 was received from an indoor carnival and most of it used for boys' work and camp activities.
- Chester, Pa. There were 800 entrants from the schools of Delaware county in our hobby show. Forty-eight winners were entertained at one of our meetings.
- **Columbus, Ind.** Our boys' club has over 1,000 members. Its excellent work is known throughout the United States. We held a sons' and daughters' night, built a cabin at a summer camp and gave a Hallowe'en party for 500 youths.
- Dallas, Tex. Five years ago the Kiwanis-newsboys' camp at White Rock was started. The total attendance for almost five years is 510 groups averaging nearly 12,000 boys.
- Decatur, III. Several boys have been paroled to Kiwanians. Financial help was given to the Family Welfare Association, which sponsored a child guidance clinic and the Committee on Under-Privileged Child developed a boys' club for youngsters living in a factory district.
- Dover, N. J. Five boys, paroled to a member of the club, meet with him twice a week for discussion and guidance. Leisure time activities continue for a group of Ki-Y boys and a soft ball league was started for both older boys and young men.
- Durham, N. C. A high school club, with the ideals of good fellowship as in Kiwanis, was developed for senior high school students. Boys and girls from the juvenile court are found employment and given assistance.
- Edmond, Okla. Three hundred exhibits of airplanes were entered in our show for boys of the community. The winners were our luncheon guests.

El Dorado, Ark. One thousand boys are members of our Knot Hole gang.

Fort Worth, Tex. The 500 members of our Knot Hole gang pledged themselves to good rules of conduct and are given the opportunity to attend baseball games during the entire season.

- Freeport, Ill. A marble tournament interested 305 boys divided into two groups. Winners in each group were awarded trophy cups. A number of kite contests also had several hundred participants.
- Fremont, Neb. Our ninth annual camp for the members of the Rinkey Dinks club of 60 boys opened during August. A hobby and craft show
- for boys was sponsored by the club. Galveston, Tex. Observed National Youth Week and conducted an Easter
- egg hunt for 1,100 boys of our Knot Hole gang. Goldsboro, N. C. Personal service work is carried on by all our members. Boys who receive this attention are secured from the local welfare department.
- Books and magazines for a library at the industrial school Grafton, W. Va. for boys was one of our major activities. Hundreds of books have been
- placed in this institution. Greenville, Ky. The club sponsored the manual training department of the high school and purchased \$300.00 worth of equipment. Prizes were
- awarded to the best pieces of work constructed by the boys. Hamilton, Ont. Early in 1935 the club had 55 boys under the guidance of Kiwanians. These youths have Kiwanis Dads who visit with them once a week. Medical attention is given all the youngsters and they have
- Y. M. C. A. memberships. Harrisburg, Pa. The Knights, a group of under-privileged boys, hold meet-ings at the Y. M. C. A. Health and educational programs are available to these 65 youths. Hyde Park, Chicago. Worthy under-privileged boys are given Y. M. C. A.
- memberships.
- Jackson, Miss. A part of the 1935 program was the adoption by our members of 65 Little Brothers who need help and supervision. A number of young men were given a vacation at a Kiwanis-Y. M. C. A. camp. Cooperation is also given a local juvenile council.
- Jersey City, N. J. Eighty-five boys were sent to a camp. These youths were picked from among 500 investigations as to home life and envi-ronment. All had to pass physical examinations. Our Big Brother work continues among the members of the club. Boys are received from the special service department of the board of education. At Christmas 250 boys were given clothing.
- Kissimmee, Fla. Boys and girls in the circuit, county, juvenile and municipal courts who need help are given Kiwanis assistance.
- Lake View, Chicago. The eighth annual youths' handicraft exhibit was held in April with over 600 entries and 40 prizes. Ten boys were sent to a Y. M. C. A. camp.
- Laramie, Wyo. All cases in the juvenile court receive Kiwanis attention. The Club also means to see that control over liquor sales to minors is enforced and inspection is made of publications of a licentious nature which may get into the hands of children.
- Lawton, Okla. All newsboys of the town were invited to a special lunch-eon. The affair was so successful that the club is going to make it an annual occasion. A father and sons' day was held in November.
- ington, Va. The mayor and chief of police are very enthusiastic over the Kiwanis boys' club. Youngsters in this group are taught habits of good living and participate in various games. It is hoped to erect a Lexington, Va. club house in the future.
- Little Rock, Ark. A boys' camp cares for transient youths under the supervision of a federal bureau. If the camp can be improved under a W. P. A. project, \$25,000.00 will be spent in making it one of the finest camps in the United States.
- London, Ont. Fifty-three boys were sent to Silver Beach Gap for a vaca-tion. The club sponsored a week of donkey baseball, with teams from various industrial plants and fraternal orders. The attendance was approximately 7,000. On Thursday nights at the Y. M. C. A. there were 60 under-privileged boys who were given a hot supper. On Sundays there is also a religious service for these youngsters.
- Los Angeles, Calif. A transient camp cared for hundreds of boys who needed help. These young men had left their home towns and were wandering about the country. Splendid co-operation was received from Kiwanis clubs in doing rehabilitation work and getting these youths returned to their homes.

- Malone, N. Y. Held a father and sons' day and conducted a hobby show.
 Marion, Ohio. Our principal activity is a boys' group, the Ki-Y Torch Club, with 28 members. All cases coming before the juvenile court are given Big Brother supervision.
- Mason City, Iowa. The ninth annual hobby show, with 109 boys and 675 exhibits, was the finest show in the history of the club. The club buys Y. M. C. A. memberships for under-privileged boys.
- McAllen, Tex. A group of boys is being helped to find odd jobs so they can get enough money to pay DeMolay dues.
- Morris, Minn. There were 292 displays of bird houses at an exhibit held for boys and girls from the surrounding counties. The three winners were given a 2,000 mile trip throughout northern Minnesota. A father and son banquet was held in February.
- New Britain, Conn. Our club helped to collect \$16,000.00 for the New Britain Boys' Club. An annual field day was held for 150 boys of this club.
- New Brunswick, N. J. An older boys' conference was held at the Y. M. C. A. The club observed youth week and arranged for a hobby show.
- New Kensington, Pa. Worthy boys are assigned to Kiwanis Big Brothers who take a personal interest in their welfare and physical condition. It is hoped that through Kiwanis the right environment can be found for these youths.
- Newport News, Va. The club is interested in a United States transient camp, where 3,000 are being taught trades, growing and canning their own produce and learn self reliance. A father-son-daughter banquet was held in November.
- New York, N. Y. At one meeting we raised \$1,000.00 for sending boys to camp. The sand-lot baseball league continues to be one of the best recreational endeavors. All boys under 18 years of age are allowed to play in the league.
- Noranda, P. Q. Eight hockey teams for over 100 boys between the ages of 8 and 12 was one of the best activities during 1935.
- Norfolk, Neb. Kiwanians have delinquent boys paroled to them by the county judge.
- North Fort Worth, Tex. Over 600 youngsters were enrolled in our boys' club. Kiwanis has spent considerable money and much time on this club and also assists under-privileged children in receiving medical, dental and eye care.
- Northwest Town, Chicago. Financial aid was given so 106 under-privileged boys could be sent to a camp.
- Old York Road, Pa. The third annual model airplane meet was held in May for all the high schools in this territory.
- Ottawa, Ont. The membership of the boys' club in 1935 was 700. There are first aid instruction classes, junior police organizations, manual training, wood and reed work, hockey, boxing tournaments, etc. Visits are made to the juvenile court to assist boys in trouble. Temporary positions are found for worthy youths and medical attention is available for all the boys.
- Owosso, Mich. Five Kiwanians volunteered to become probationary officers for boys from the probate court.
- Seattle, Wash. The 25 Big Brother Kiwanians are helping little fellows who need care and supervision.
- Sioux City, Iowa. Six hundred boys were given a vacation at a summer camp. All boys and girls from families on relief are entertained by the club.
- Spokane, Wash. Our Big Brother work continues to be directed by five sub-committees. There is free medical and dental assistance, vocational help, musical instruction and recreational pleasures. Y. M. C. A. memberships were secured for 42 Little Brothers. When these youngsters pass the age of 16 they are organized into the Fraternity of Keys which cares for their needs and problems. Merit pins are provided for those who can achieve them. A picnic and Christmas party were provided for all the Little Brothers.

- Toronto, Ont. The club was willed over \$1,000,000.00 by the late T. P. Loblaw, a member who died in 1933, to be used in under-privileged boys work and other charitable enterprises. A boys' club, a large summer camp, rugby teams, harmonica and bugle bands and vocational classes were all activities of the club during 1935. Three thousand boys took part in the season's rugby games. The vocational training school teaches carpentry, electrical work, printing, barbering, etc. A boys' orchestra is now being organized. Attendance at the gymnasium and the vocational classes average over 4,000 a month.
- Vancouver, B. C. The club has nearly 100 Little Brothers who are receiving the attention of Kiwanians. Medical attention, clothing, recreational facilities and summer camp activities are available for the children.
- Watertown, N. Y. Each week over 100 boys are entertained at the Y. M. C. A. with games, swimming, singing and other entertainment. These Buddy Boys are also helped in a vocational way and 50 of them were sent to a summer camp.
- Wilmington, N. C. The Brigade Boys' Club has a membership of over 400 under-privileged youths who receive physical, mental and moral training. The club contributes \$1,000.00 to this club each year. Under W. P. A. work the club building was remodeled at a cost of \$10,000.00. The attendance during 1935 was in excess of 40,000.
 Yonkers, N. Y. At the Y. M. C. A. Kiwanians supervise the Ki-Y boys'

Amsterdam, N. Y. Our annual Hallowe'en parade was a big success with over 2,500 boys and girls in line. Eighty prizes were awarded.

- Ann Arbor, Mich. Four hundred boys and girls entered exhibits in the pet and hobby show, which was attended by 2,000 people.
- Baltimore, Md. A city-wide hobby show had 400 exhibits entered by children between the ages of 9 and 20 years. Over 12,000 people were in attendance and \$500.00 in prizes were awarded. Children of foreign birth were encouraged to enter the show. The club believes this was a real step toward Americanization.

Beaver Dam, Wis. Kiwanis beach had swimming instructors for all children and adults. Children under 12 years of age were admitted free. We realized \$600.00 on a carnival for our activities.

- Belleville, Ont. Net returns reached nearly \$14,000.00 in our annual fall carnival, which had over 4,000 children as guests. The money will be used for boys work, Y. M. C. A., Boy Scouts, public health, playgrounds, etc.
- Bend, Ore. Harmon Playfield had an attendance of 18,612 for 1935. Three supervisors were employed. The city government has been asked to make extensive improvements, which include new swimming tanks, shelters, etc.
- Bowling Green, Ohio. A handicraft shop was established, the work being supervised by F. E. R. A. officials. This shop provides children with hobbies during the summer.
- Cheboygan, Mich. The club sponsored a community skating rink.
- Cle Elum, Wash. The Committee on Public Affairs, receiving the support of many other civic organizations, is working for the construction of public playgrounds and a swimming pool. An excellent ski course is one of the winter activities of the club.
- Compton, Calif. Assisted in sponsoring a mutt dog parade. There were 20 special prizes, for the best decorated dog, the longest tail, the most fleas, the largest litter, etc.
- De Kalb, Ill. The club paid all election expenses so the people might vote on whether or not they wish to establish a park district and a park board to raise money, by bond issue, for the building of a swimming pool. The vote went three to two for the park district, with a \$25,000.00 pool. Two of the five park commissioners elected were Kiwanians.
- Denver, Colo. The Committee on Public Affairs is active in securing proper recreational facilities in congested districts where children need supervised activities.
- Dunkirk-Fredonia, N. Y. The club was interested in conducting elimination contests in a marble tournament so a winner could be selected to go to the national tournament at Ocean City.
- El Paso, Tex. One hundred boys entered our kite flying contest, which attracted 5,000 people.
- Fond du Lac, Wis. A visit was made to each of the grades in the city schools to organize a learn-to-swim campaign.
- Galveston, Tex. Our seventh annual Easter egg hunt furnished entertainment for over 5,000 children. All the youngsters from hospitals and orphanages were furnished free transportation to the event.
- Glendale, Calif. Over 1,000 boys and girls were given free swimming lessons at the Y. M. C. A. and Y. W. C. A.
- Hoquiam, Wash. A Kiwanis committee worked with the American Red Cross for holding life saving classes. The club has plans for building a community tennis court.

- Astoria, Ore. One hundred boys and girls enrolled in a vegetable garden contest.
- Beaverton, Ore. The workers of the S. E. R. A. assisted in the beautification project which included the planting of trees along principal streets, a clean-up campaign and a garden contest.
- Center, Colo. The club supported a clean-up, paint-up and fix-up campaign for the town.

Aberdeen, N. C. The club has developed an organization which can be drafted within a few hours notice for relief work in case of disaster.

- Algona, Iowa. A food show secured us three truck loads of groceries for the needy of the city.
- Atlanta, Ga. During book week the public was given an opportunity to donate books and other reading matter for large groups of unemployed people.

Bay City, Mich. The club secured old shoes which were repaired and distributed among the poor.

Binghamton, N. Y. There were 300 subsistence garden plots assigned to worthy people.

Cedartown, Ga. Several years ago canning equipment was purchased, and all surplus food is now utilized for those in need.

- Charlotte, N. C. The major activity of the club is a maternity clinic where several hundred babies are cared for each year. Pre-natal care and instruction is given to those who cannot pay for this medical service. This work is carried on with the help of the medical department of Duke University.
- College Park, Detroit, Mich. Over 2,000 damaged toys were secured through a newspaper campaign and were repaired and distributed among the poor boys and girls at Christmas time.
- Dade City, Fla. The club is sponsoring an art craft shop for the unemployed of the community.
- Englewood, Chicago. The dentists and doctors of the club gave over 1,000 hours of professional service to poor families. Coal and milk were available for those in need. Over 1,700 children and adults were supplied with Christmas gifts. The club conducts a Christmas cheer station where merchants and others may bring their donations.

Escondido, Calif. A trained dog was secured for a blind man.

Gary, Ind. Five hundred families were given community garden plots. Over 3,000 toys were collected, repaired and repainted by the Boy Scouts and distributed at Christmas.

Hamilton, Ont. Free transportation service is available to poor people who need hospital care.

Hoquiam, Wash. The local fire department repairs all toys secured by the club and we distributed these among the poor.

- Huntington Park, Calif. Over 1,500 cans of food were secured at the annual
- canned goods movie party and were distributed to those on relief. Lakewood, Ohio. Kiwanians assist in finding jobs for the unemployed, furnish food for transients, and conduct a used clothes campaign for the needy people in the city and rural districts.
- Manchester, N. H. All the old people of the city are given automobile rides and entertainment each year.
- Prince Albert, Sask. Clothing was secured for the unemployed through an old clothes drive.
- Spokane, Wash. Twenty-five mothers and 115 children occupied the 25 Pensioned Mothers' homes during 1935. These homes have an appraised value of \$47,000.00. Mothers pay \$10.00 to \$15.00 a month rental. During the year \$2,796.46 was spent for maintenance and purchase of homes. Kiwanians were assigned to individual homes and many contributions of clothing, furniture, fuel, etc., were made by members. Medical work was supplied free by doctors and dentists. Twenty gallons of milk are supplied daily for the children. The Pensioned Mothers' sewing group for which the club buys material, made 200 garments and canned 5,000 quarts of fruits and vegetables for winter use. HEALTH AND SANITATION

The following describes the ways in which Kiwanis clubs worked to improve health and sanitary conditions in their communities:

- Atlantic City, N. J. A gold medal was awarded to Miss Helen Hunter in recognition of her outstanding work among under-privileged children. This lady and all members of the 1935 class of the Atlantic City Hospital were entertained.
- Bellaire, Ohio. We were successful in having the county commissioners segregate sufficient funds to insure the continuation of tuberculine tests for milk cows.
- Blue Ridge, Ga. Kiwanis aided the sponsoring of the sale of Christmas seals.
- Chester Pike, Pa. For five years the club has worked toward the extermination of the mosquito nuisance in this section. The major work was done through the P.W.A.
- Clanton, Ala. One of our objectives was the establishment of a health unit for the county.
- Clatskanie, Ore. A county health organization working with the state tuberculosis society was sponsored by the club. Nearly 300 pupils in the high schools and grade schools were examined to find those needing treatment for tuberculosis. The Christmas seal sale is sponsored by our club and carried out through the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts.

Columbia, Tenn. In March the annual blue ribbon health day was held throughout the county. All children who met the requirements of the state health department participated in a parade and were entertained.

East Chicago, Ind. This year our club sponsored Child Health Week.

- Eustis, Fla. One young lady was given assistance so she might enter a training school for nurses.
- Geneva, Ohio. Kiwanians served as auditors of the books of the County Health League.
- Indiana, Pa. All nurses graduated from the Indiana Hospital were guests of the club. One meeting was given over to a discussion by a doctor on the socialization of medical care.
- Mebane, N. C. With other civic organizations the club is working to secure a full-time health officer. Kiwanians also assisted in seeing that all dogs of the county were inocculated.
- Montreal, P. Q. A seal sale was helpful in raising about \$13,000.00 for institutions. A contribution was also given for a cancer fund.
- Moultrie, Ga. All persons applying for servant positions were requested by city ordinance to pass a medical examination and obtain a health certificate before securing employment.
- Springer, N. M. All stagnant pools of water were treated with heavy oil to destroy mosquito breeding.
- Victoria, B. C. A total of \$3,413.17 was realized from a tuberculosis seal campaign.
- Waukegan, Ill. Weeds were destroyed on all vacant property. These were a real health menace and also obscured the vision of automobile drivers.

Other clubs were interested in general health clinics, sanitariums and camps, in selling health seals, guarding against epidemics, purchasing equipment for health organizations and giving assistance to community nurses and health officers; securing pure milk, good water supply, proper sewage disposal and cleaning up polluted streams.

- Anaconda, Mont. Funds were raised for transporting elk from the vicinity of Yellowstone Park to the district west of Anaconda.
- Anthony, Kan. Reforestation work is going on in the drought stricken areas of this community.
- Brevard, N. C. A movement was started for the location of a fish hatchery in the county.
- Cheboygan, Mich. During the winter grain was purchased so the county agricultural agent could feed the wild game.
- Claremont, Calif. An active campaign is underway to educate people to help prevent forest fires.
- Clarksburg, W. Va. Some 4,000 trees, which the club planted several years ago, were transplanted and others will be used to beautify roads in this territory.
- Clatskanie, Ore. Thousands of trout, catfish and bullfrog tadpoles were planted in the Clatskanie river. Three hundred young pheasants were placed in holding pens for future release. The club is active in combatting forest fires.
- Davenport, Iowa. A campaign was got under way in May to halt the killing of song birds by children with air rifles and sling shots.
- Hynes-Clearwater-Hollydale, Calif. Over 750 trees were given to children for the annual tree planting campaign in March.
- Las Vegas, N. M. Some 5,000 trees in the Kiwanis nursery were distributed and planted in this section.
- Los Angeles, Calif. The Committee on Agriculture has obtained the whole hearted co-operation of the Boy Scout organization in the metropolitan area to help in a Save-Your-Forest campaign. Over 75,000 stickers were distributed. Five hundred pine seedlings were planted on the McKinley Home grounds.
- Michigan Kiwanis District. The Michigan Kiwanis Forest, which is part of the Huron National Forest on the banks of the Au Sable River near East Tawas, was dedicated on September 21, 1928.

- Price, Utah. The F. E. R. A. made a survey to find people who desire trees for their yards. Some 600 trees were ordered.
- Rehoboth Beach, Del. A reclamation movement, started several years ago, has resulted in a state-wide membership of 750 members whose interests are in providing more game and fish throughout Delaware.
- Richland Center, Wis. Two thousand trees were planted on city hill.
- Richmond, Calif. The club sponsored the raising of funds for an aviary.
- Saginaw, Mich. In May the club planted 1,000 pine trees. This planting has been an annual affair for the past 15 years.
- Tillamook, Ore. Successfully fostered legislation and secured passage of bills which will provide for the disposal of burned and cut over lands to the national government, which will replant these thousands of acres.
- Viroqua, Wis. Sparrow traps were secured to reduce the number of these birds and protect native birds. A theatre party was held to secure produce and grain which could be used for winter feeding of Chinese pheasants.
- West Branch, Mich. Over 12,000 perch and bass were planted in the lakes of our county. A ton of corn was secured for the county game refuge so that the deer might have sufficient food.
- Wisconsin-Upper Michigan Kiwanis District. In 1930 the Kiwanis Forest Nursery project was started with 2,000,000 sprouts planted. These were transplanted again in 1932.
