- GPA minimum of 3.0

The Graduate Program Administrator, Kitty O'Doherty, currently tracks, and will continue to take on the responsibility of tracking the progress of students on this MS path. Approval of these two requests would enable a more efficient, as well as a less time and paper consuming system for the audit/certification process.
