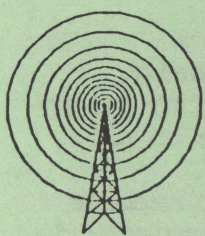


NORTH CENTRAL COMMITTEE PLANNING ACCREDITATION VISIT

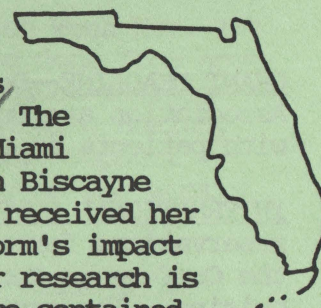
METROS BASKETBALL RETURNS TO RADIO WAVES

GEOLOGIST STUDYING HURRICANE ANDREW'S ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

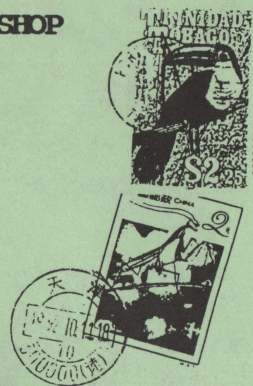
Hurricane Andrew did millions of dollars worth of damage to the homes, property and lives of Florida residents. But it is the damage to the southern state's coasts and their environments that has attracted the attention of IUPUI geologist Lenore Tedesco. The School of Science faculty member has made two trips already to the Miami area damaged during the August storm, comparing data she gathered in Biscayne Bay before the hurricane with post-storm information. Tedesco, who received her Ph.D in 1991 from the University of Miami, has been studying the storm's impact on coasts, coral reefs, sea beds, and coastal mangrove forests. Her research is providing new information about how historical and climactic data are contained within rocks and sediment.

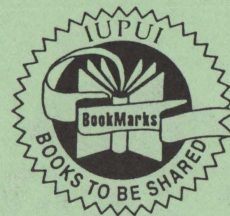

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) "town meeting" scheduled for the campus Nov. 20 will offer people in Indianapolis plenty of chances to find out about the space agency's future. The meeting at the Conference Center has been extended by 30 minutes and now will run from 2-6:30 p.m., with more than an hour allotted for questions from the public. The campus visit by NASA officials, including the agency's top administrator, Daniel Goldin, will include a tour of the schools of Engineering and Technology, Science, Dentistry and Medicine. 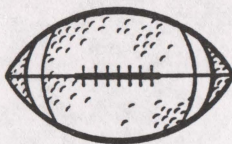
