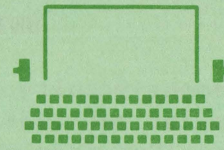

FALL ENROLLMENT BREAKS '83 RECORD

Gloom and doom predictions about declining enrollments in universities and colleges missed the mark in our case. We are enjoying record high enrollments for fall--82,627 for the entire university, 23,618 for the IUPUI campus. The 150-student gain over last year's 23,468 came in the non-health undergraduate areas with 372 more students. That jump was lowered by a decline of 150 students enrolled in the health areas that include medicine, nursing, dentistry and allied health sciences. Other campuses that broke their own records include IUB--up by 1,000 plus, as well as East, Kokomo and Southeast. According to Registrar Richard Slocum, our previous record was set in fall, 1983 with 23,540 students. Total credit hours taken this fall at IUPUI do not reflect the enrollment increase. Faculty members are teaching 206,121 credit hours, compared to 205,521.5 last fall.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS PRESENTS ANTI-APARTHEID LEADER, STUDY ABROAD/ASEA

International Programs at IUPUI, under the direction of Pat Biddinger, is off to a running start this fall and, with other sponsors, is offering a lecture and info on study abroad and at sea. Former ambassador of the Republic of South Africa to the Court of St. James, Dr. Denis Worrall will present a free public lecture: "What Lies Ahead for South Africa?" on Sept. 24, noon, Lecture Hall 100. Embroiled firsthand in the anti-apartheid movement in South Africa, he is a political scientist and lawyer. He was born and educated in South Africa and lived for six years in the U.S., where he earned his Ph.D. from Cornell U. After seven years in parliament in South Africa, he was appointed chairman of the Constitutional Committee of the President's Council. He has served as ambassador to Australia and is a founder and a leader of the anti-apartheid Independent Movement.

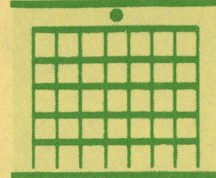
