Among the featured speakers will be:


- Jim Stryker of Ingersol-Rand, who helped the company redesign its approach to business and climb from third to first in the industrial hand-held grinder market;

The events were announced by new MAX*WELL coordinator Darrell Mendenhall, who took over the campus-wide wellness program earlier this summer.




