Steven R. Counsell, MD was honored as the recipient of a <u>2002 Hulman Health Achievement Award in Geriatrics and Gerontology</u> on October 17 at the Indiana Public Health Foundation's annual awards banquet. The award is Indiana's "Premier" health award in recognition of Indiana's citizens and organizations whose efforts have resulted in a significant improvement to the human race. The purpose of the award is to create a positive image of health and provide a forum for awareness of the contributions of health leaders. Nearly 40 colleagues from the IU Geriatrics Program, Wishard Health Services, IU Medical Group, IU School of Medicine and the IU Center for Aging Research were on hand to pay tribute to Dr. Counsell.

On behalf of the Division of General Internal Medicine and Geriatrics, **Steven Counsell, MD**, Director of the IU Geriatrics Program, presented awards for "Outstanding Accomplishments in Geriatrics for 2001" to geriatrics faculty and staff during the program retreat in October.
