TWO FOR TENNIS

Canadian-born tennis pro <u>Bill Rennie</u>, and <u>Dave Kimball</u>, general manager of the <u>Indianapolis Sports Center</u>, have been named <u>co-coaches of the men's collegiate</u> tennis team at IUPUI, it has been announced by Bob Bunnell, IUPUI athletic coordinator. Rennie was also named the new assistant manager and head pro at the sports center.

The two tennis veterans replace Willard Mays, who coached the winning IUPUI men's team for six years. The IUPUI team won the 1980 Indianapolis city collegiate tennis tournament.

Born and reared in Toronto, Ontario, Rennie began playing tennis at age 10. In 1973 he came to the states and attended college for three years in California. He received a bachelor's degree in business from I.U. He says coaching at IUPUI and working at the sports center is a "natural." "There's no reason why we can't have a top team and bring recognition to the university and the city."

Kimball just completed his first year at the sports center. A one-time investment broker, Kimball is a registered pro and has completed a tennis teachers course at the Van der Meer Tennis University. He holds a bachelor of arts degree in economics from Butler University.

Kimball and Rennie see their partnership as a chance to serve the university and the city. They also will teach tennis courses in the School of Physical Education, as well as tennis lessons at the sports center. They are currently meeting the IUPUI team and organizing match schedules for fall. Rennie is also hoping to organize a collegiate team for women students at IUPUI.

PROGRAM TO TAKE UP MINORITY CONCERNS

In an effort to focus on concerns of minority students in the health professions, the <u>first minority nursing student orientation workshop</u> has been scheduled for August 21 at the School of Nursing. The day-long program, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., will be followed by a mixer open to all students in the health professions.

Organized and sponsored by the Minority Affairs Office in the nursing school, the workshop will be concerned promarily with minority nursing students on all campuses of the I.U. system. However, it will contain workshops and information useful to

minority students of all the health professions on all the I.U. campuses, as well as those in the community involved with minority-related concerns in academic professions.

Topics and areas that will be discussed include clinical behavior, role modeling, problem solving, goal setting, test preparation and study habits—all skills necessary to the aspiring professional. According to Deborah Jenkins, minority affairs officer with the school, these areas are always covered in other workshops but the emphasis during this day will be on the minority, as well as the professional, academic perspective.

Workshop panelists will include professionals from the university and the community. Participants include Dr. John A. Smith, director of minority student affairs at IUPUI; Joseph Taylor, former dean of the School of Liberal Arts and presently special assistant to the vice president (Indianapolis), and Alvin Bynum, dean of University Division. Also Joe Byrd, nursing manager of urology at Methodist Hospital; Lincoln Lewis, IUPUI affirmative action officer; Mrs. Henry J. Richardson Jr., career consultant and former director of the career sampling program at Shortridge High School, and Myra Mason, counselor and minority affairs officer at the School of Dentistry.
