Meeting on March 15, 1919.

Present: F. Vonnegut, Lieber, Rath and Scherer.

Dean Rath talked about the meeting of the school superintendents in Chicago.

Dr. W. S. Small from the U. S. Bureau of Education attended the meeting and gave detailed information about the establishment of a permanent organization under the auspice of the Playground and Recreation Association called Physical Education Service and aims to submit laws for the introduction of gymnastics in the public schools to Congress and the federal legislations. At the same time, another conference for the establishment of a union of gymnastic teachers' educational institutions took place which will be continued at the annual meeting of the American Physical Education Association.

Dean Rath was given time off to attend the convention from April 9 through 12.

Rud. Hofmeister was hired as the summer course assistant replacing Heckrich who declined the position this year.

Ms. Amanda Artman had to drop out due to illness.

The Winona (Minn.) State Normal College inquired whether their graduates who took certain classes for gymnastic teachers might finish the course in less than ~~one~~ two years. The Administrative Office decided that the course work in gymnastic and related subjects performed at those institutions is not sufficient to grant any special concessions. The decision was met with approval.

Ms. Kemp and Ms. Powell asked for permission to remain in the seminary through the end of the year. Granted.
