IUPUI national ranking reaches new level

For the 13th straight year, the national spotlight is focused on two IUPUI student-focused initiatives as our learning communities and first-year experience were recognized this month by U.S. News & World Report in its 2015 edition of Best Colleges based on a survey of university presidents, chancellors, chief academic officers, and admissions officers.

In that same survey, college administrators were also asked to nominate institutions that have recently made the most promising and innovative changes in the areas of academics, faculty, student life, campus or facilities. And colleagues ranked IUPUI seventh as an "Up and Comer." IUPUI has been ranked an "Up and Comer" for each of the five years that the survey has been taken.

IUPUI's inclusion among Best Universities underscores our commitment to student success, academic quality and increase in the number of bachelor's degrees. The recognition by presidents, provosts and deans of admissions of our "Up-and-Coming" status confirms IUPUI as an innovative national leader committed to practices for student success

What's new is for the first time, U.S. News—in their ranking of national universities—placed IUPUI on the list of the best 200 universities in the U.S.—at 194th.

IUPUI was also recognized for efforts to help veterans and active-duty service members apply for, pay for and complete their degrees. IUPUI was 69th among national universities in U.S. News' "Best Colleges for

Veterans."

Amir Pasic named dean of IU Lilly Family School of Philanthropy

Dr. Amir Pasic, Vice President for International Operations of the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE), will join the school effective January 20, 2015—pending approval by the IU Board of Trustees. Dr. Pasic will assume leadership of the world's first school devoted to the study and teaching of philanthropy. He has the wide range of experiences, skills and global connections that are just perfect for the next leader of the Lilly Family School of Philanthropy. Dr. Pasic has extensive international experience as well as a bachelor's degree from Yale, Master's from Johns Hopkins, and PhD from the University of Pennsylvania.
