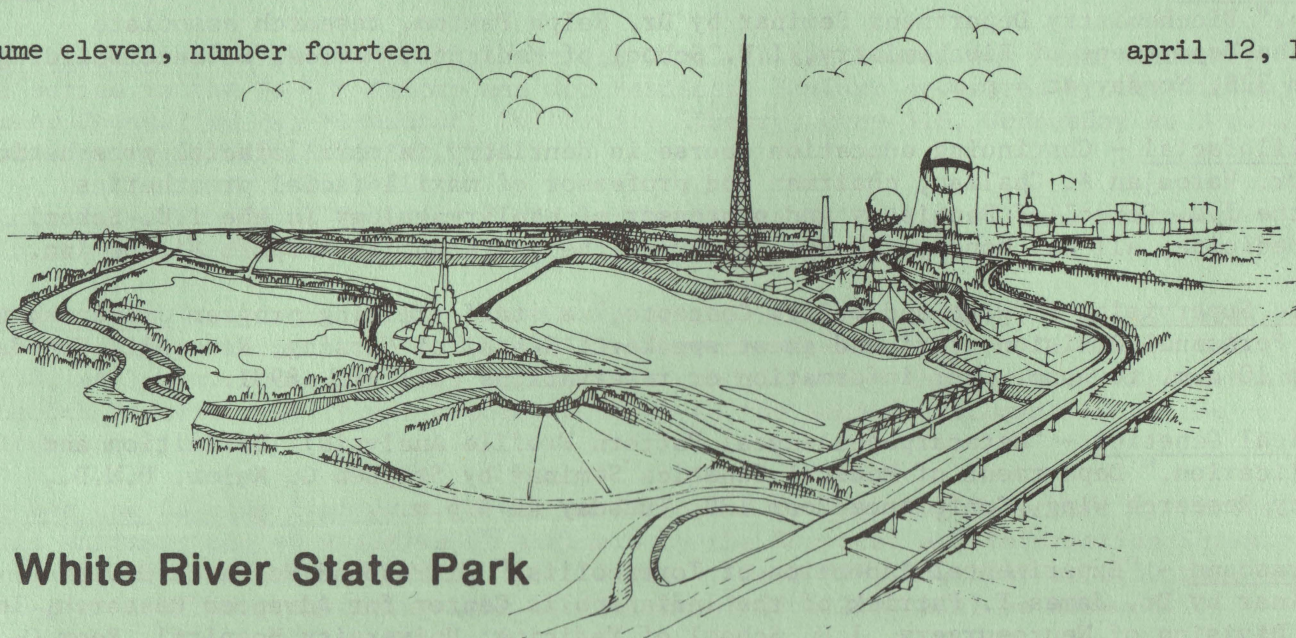

White River State Park

Right next to the IUPUI campus will rise an impressive, world-class White River State Park if present planning efforts by an international group of experts come to fruition. In an effort to inform and involve the public in this planning, a series of public television master plan design workshops are being held.

Indiana Parkdesign '81, scheduled at 8 p.m. April 22, will be aired statewide over a satellite network of public broadcasting stations, including Channel 20 in Indianapolis. Standing by at Channel 20 to address some local concerns will be Deborah Hamilton, of the IUPUI Affirmative Action Office, a consultant to the White River Park Development Commission.

The program has been successful in obtaining public ideas, garnering 124 calls on the first workshop, according to Cary Goodman, project manager for the team assembling the master plan. Said Goodman, "Our directive was to design a 250-acre urban state park in Indiana's capital city which reflects Indiana. To do that, citizen input from all over the state is necessary. This time, we will be seeking ideas for activities as well as for the kinds of architecture and open spaces that the people of Indiana would like to have in White River Park. Toll-free numbers will be supplied for those citizens calling from outside the Indianapolis area and local numbers will be given for those within calling range."
