# JA/YE Member Nations Recognized in Milwaukee

Wednesday evening's JAI Awards Cocktail on July 11 at the Milwaukee Hilton City Center Hotel recognized JA/YE Member Nations in the areas of Growth, Innovation, Media and Quality. Marty Stein, Founder of EyeCare One, and JAI Board Member, presented the awards.

### **GROWTH AWARD WINNERS:**

Armenia has experienced an astounding average 78% growth rate over the past five years; Botswana has experienced growth at 52%. Northern Ireland, with the implementation of JA's elementary school programs, grew at an average well over 100% for the past five years; St. Lucia's JA participation has grown at an average of 113% since its inception in 1996.

#### **INNOVATION AWARD WINNERS:**

**Argentina** for developing several new programs including most recently an elementary program, Environmental Achievements; Armenia for starting a weekend training session for JA teachers; Australia for piloting an adapted company-type program called "A Business Enterprise" reaching 14-15 year olds; Botswana for working with the Ministry of Commerce and Industry and the Women Affairs Department to train Botswanans on business and economics; Canada for developing a website that allows JA charters throughout Canada to update their own web pages within the country-wide site based on a template; Canada-Peel for their substantial enhancements to the GLOBE program which led to increased classroom delivery of 300% over 2 years; **Kenya** for adapting the JA Personal Economics program to add a chapter educating young people about the economic costs of HIV/AIDS, which is beneficial to several countries suffering from this pandemic; Mexico for developing new strategies for local and web contests, such as "Simulacion 2000", a Latin American MESE competition, and a regional Banks in Action competition; Nigeria for

implementing the "Venture in Management Programme" to university level students; Northern Ireland for developing the "Knowledge through Enterprise for Youth" (or KEY program) bringing catholic and protestant students together to explore personal development, motivation, confidence building, teamwork, outdoor adventures and business; Paraguay for establishing a web design competition, for creating an alumni association that promotes JA concepts, and for taking young "Our Nation" students on industrial site visits: Russia for creating an additional text adapting the "Economics Program" to the Russian culture: **Scotland** for creating a program to teach E-Commerce to students in the "Company Program", thereby teaching them to market products and undertake trading via the web; Slovakia for organizing half and full day seminars where mentors meet with groups of JA students and prepare them for leadership; and St. Lucia for developing the "Sir Arthur Lewis Program" whereby college students serve as mentors to JA students.

### MEDIA AWARD WINNERS:

Argentina, Armenia, Australia, Botswana, Bulgaria, Kenya, Nigeria, Paraguay, St. Lucia and Sri Lanka. All of these countries have done an outstanding job in creating awareness through effective use of media. Some by using well-placed articles in newspapers and periodicals; others through videos, newsletters, brochures and websites and several through outstanding annual reports
