Dean's Update to the IUSD Community

## JADA: Student Debt and Career Choice

A new study published in *JADA* (November 2015) looks at whether there is an association between the amount of education debt on completing dental school (initial debt) and certain career decisions. The study surveyed 1,842 practicing dentists who completed dental school between 1996 and 2011.

Dentists with higher initial debt were less likely to specialize and more likely to enter private practice, accept high-paying jobs on graduation, and work longer hours. Choice of employment setting, practice ownership, and whether to provide Medicaid and charity care were associated with dentists' sexes and races but not debt.

High debt levels influenced some career decisions, but the magnitude of these effects was small compared with the effects of other demographic factors.

### Progress Continues: New Building Schematic Plans

Since August 14, when the IU Board of Trustees authorized Step 1: Project Approval for the new building project, we have been working diligently to plan the schematic design and determine the best site selection for the new clinical building on the IUSD campus. The architectural team has been creative and thoughtful to listen to our needs and plan accordingly within our budget. I am very pleased to share that we have made substantial progress on the schematic design phase such that we will be moving ahead for Step 2: Design Approval by the IU Board of Trustees in early December! It has been a very busy fall working on this schematic design.

While I don't have any pictures, renderings or floorplans to show publically at this time, I will share with you some of the fundamental components of what is being considered for this exciting new addition. The site selection appears to be to the east and will consume much of the existing patient parking lot. As a three-story building with a penthouse for mechanical items, we are looking at the potential of 120 to 130 dental operatories overall, but this number can change based on clinical and support function space requirements. The new building will create a courtyard like area between the new and old structures with corridors to link them. A covered patient drop off/pickup area is included as well as substantially enhanced waiting/reception areas. We hope to relocate dental faculty practice to the first floor of the new building and provide for independent operation of this clinic and offer expanded after hours care. The exterior will blend with the existing old architecture and transform to a new dynamic eastern facing façade, exuding the confidence of a contemporary oral health care facility for the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

We couldn't be doing any of this work without the early believers who contributed gifts and pledges of more than \$4 million to this project. Each day, I thank you because your belief is paying huge dividends! While the building is mostly underwritten, we still are raising funds for the project. The time is right to make a big push for IU-IUPUI Dentistry to have new facilities as the University celebrates 200 years of service and IUSD celebrates 140 years of service to the people of Indiana and beyond. Thank you for your belief in the possibilities — we are making significant progress on this project!

### Multidisciplinary Clinic-IUSD 4<sup>th</sup> Floor...Opening Soon

For a glimpse of the IUSD clinic of the future, go visit the new multidisciplinary clinic on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor. The construction is almost complete, and the cleaning team was doing their part earlier this week. Look for an opening announcement soon! When this clinic opens, we will have 25 new operatories to support graduate operative, dental hygiene and TEAM clinical programs.

Throughout the month of November, seven BOSMA clients will be working at IUSD as standardized patients and will be participating in objective structured clinical examinations (OSCE) with our students. Dr. Willis was a member of the 1979 IUSD DDS class and completed a certificate of Operative Dentistry in 1990. He will retire July 1, 2016.
