School Report for DIAC Meeting

December 10, 2009

- State Appropriations were reduced for 2009-11 biennium.
- Federal stimulus funds backfilled the reductions for two years only.
- Board of Trustees approved tuition increase of 4.6% for 2009-10 for undergraduate students.
- Tuition increases were 9-25% for graduate programs.

- IU plans to implement 4.2% cut from base funds for 2010-11. (School share is \$400K cut)
- State collected less than projected tax revenue (\$254M for September, \$46M for October, and \$120M for November).
- Governor announced \$150M (6%) cut from the higher education institutions.
- Indiana Commission on Higher Education will formulate the implementation within a month.
- School's share of the cut may be around \$500K.

- IU will return part of the tuition increase (\$300 per student) to in-state and full-time students if they enroll in 12 or more credit hours and if they end up with 3.0 semester grade point average.
- School's share is about \$150K.
- IU may have to roll back tuition increase for 2010-11.

- Record student enrollment in IU system.
- IU-BL has over 40,000 and IUPUI has over 30,000 students.
- Based on the US and World News report, IUPUI is on the list of “universities to watch” for second year in a row.
- Last year IUPUI was 14th on the list with Ohio State; this year it is in 7th place.
- IUPUI is in the silent phase of new fund raising campaign.

- IU President announced new program, Innovate Indiana Fund
 - \$10M
 - Translation and commercialization of concepts and technology developed by faculty.
 - Seed funds of \$50K to \$350K.
 - IU RTC will run the program.

- Enrollment is up again as compared to last year
 - 6% up in student headcount for fall 2009
 - 6.2% up in student credit hours for fall 2009
 - We are still the largest student headcount unit on campus.
 - Spring 2010 student credit hours increased by 8%.
- Energy Engineering-BS proposal will go to ICHE after Purdue Trustees' approval.
- School bundled all the laboratory and other fees into one program fee for students effective this fall.

- ABET (Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology) team visited and reviewed our Computer Graphics Technology-BS and Computer and Information Technology-BS programs for the first time in October 2009.
- NASM (National Association of Music Schools) team visited and reviewed our music technology programs for the first time in November 2009.

- External research was at a record high (\$7.2M) for 2008-09.
- We have already \$5.1M for July-November of this fiscal year.
- Budget is in flux. We have to plan for less State appropriation during 2011-13 when the Federal Stimulus funds are gone and also return funds to State.
- The average SAT score of admitted students increased from 1,021 to 1,042 for fall 2009.

- Planning for Science and Engineering Research Complex 1 (SERC) continues. This is primarily for our school and the School of Science.
- SERC 1 will be \$20M building with 60% of space going to research. The funding will be through research overhead from the campus and the two schools.
- Funds for SERC 2 will be requested from the State during 2011-13 biennium.

- There is a possibility of SERC 3 funded through private donations.
- School is awaiting the decision from IU President regarding the school's share from the ANGEL software proceedings.
- Search for new dean is underway. Clayton Nicholas and Bill Wylam are on the Search Committee.

- We are in the silent phase of the next fundraising campaign.
- School priorities have been identified and the campaign leadership team will be formed.
- The preliminary fundraising target for the school is \$12M.
- The beginning and ending dates for the campaign are yet to be announced.
