Applications are sought by the [Multidisciplinary Undergraduate Research Institute \(MURI\)](#) for summer 2012 and academic year 2012-2013 from all IUPUI faculty members who are interested in mentoring undergraduate students to conduct multidisciplinary research in teams. This is a unique opportunity for conducting pilot projects or testing new techniques and designs while helping undergraduate students develop essential research skills.

MURI is collaboratively funded by the Center for Research and Learning, a division of the IUPUI Office of the Vice Chancellor for Research, and the Purdue School of Engineering and Technology at IUPUI.

The deadline for summer 2012 and academic year 2012-2013 MURI project proposals from faculty members is March 9, 2012.

This summer's Institute will run from June 1 through August 3, 2012.

Undergraduate Student Feature: Fatoumata Bah

Fatoumata Bah, a senior majoring in chemistry at the Purdue School of Science, currently participates in the Ronald E. McNair Postbaccalaureate Achievement Program. During her freshman year, Fatoumata's sister directed her to CRL, where she was accepted into the Louis Stokes Alliances for Minority Participation (LSAMP) and gained exposure in laboratory research in chemistry.

When asked what intrigued her about the possibility of doing research, Fatoumata said, "Curiosity! I was curious to find out what interests me in the world and what doesn't, and that's exactly what undergraduate research did for me." Fatoumata went on from LSAMP to perform clinical research in the Life Health Sciences Internship Program (LHSI) with mentor Dr. Patricia Scott. She enjoyed the research so much that she applied to CRL's McNair program, which enabled her to continue the research with her mentor and to pursue publication.

Fatoumata has recently presented at the Indiana University Undergraduate Research Conference in Kokomo and at the School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences Alumni Association Interdisciplinary Research Conference. Her abstract also has been approved for presentation at the 92nd annual conference of the American Occupational Therapy Association.

Fatoumata expects to graduate in December 2012 and plans to bring her passion for research with her as she becomes a health professional.

Mentor Feature: Dr. Patricia Scott

Dr. Scott, Associate Professor of Occupational Therapy, whose expertise is in measurement of participation research methods, evidence-based practice came to IU in 2007 from Florida International University, where she taught for nineteen years and chaired the department for eight of these years. She comes with a strong clinical background in mental health, both in traditional short and long term settings and in nontraditional settings such as alternative schools for troubled youth, prisons and forensic hospitals. Her research in the past has been in the areas of ADA Title 1 accommodations for individuals with psychiatric disabilities, and she was a CORE fellow in the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTF) Outcomes Research program. Scott also was honored as a Fellow of the American Occupational Therapy Association in 2002 for excellence in teaching and nontraditional practice.

More recently, Scott has focused on the challenges in measurement of participation. Her work centers on the conceptualization of occupational role performance as a way to measure outcomes. Specifically, she is studying transitions throughout the liver-transplantation process. Her move to Indianapolis allowed her to conduct research at the IU Health University Hospital, the third largest (by volume) liver-transplant center in the United States. She is an Indiana University Translation of Research into Practice (TRIP) Scholar.

"This is my second year working with her," says Fatoumata Bah of her

mentor, "and she has been more than a mentor to me, always setting some time aside to assist me, despite her very busy schedule. She has significantly contributed to my professional development at IUPUI, and the enthusiasm and passion she displays has increased my confidence."

Be a Leader in Research: Calling CRL Students to Join the CRL Ambassadors

The CRL invites all current and past CRL scholars to submit an application to become a CRL Ambassador!

The Center for Research and Learning Ambassadors Program provides students with the chance to network with research faculty and community members, plus gain invaluable experience and exposure by promoting their research and the center to students, alumni and the community. These students would encourage student interest in undergraduate research, advocate for the interests of undergraduate-student researchers and attend CRL events and conferences.

To be selected for the newly formed Ambassadors Program requires that you be a current or previous participant in any CRL program, be a currently enrolled student at IUPUI, and maintain a respectable GPA. Because Ambassadors represent the CRL, they must ensure the Center's reputation is preserved. Once you've applied, you will need to be nominated by a faculty member and then if selected undergo a personal interview. Applicants also must provide outside references. Once chosen, the successful candidates will be appointed by the Center for Research and Learning for one year.
