## LAKELAND FFA ALUMNI BUILDS SUPPORT FOR LOCAL FFA MEMBERS

Lakeland Alumni has yet to celebrate its first birthday. It was formed as a unit last fall with ten charter members. They now boast 30 members and are currently working on 40.

The Alumni affiliate has provided cars, vans, and transportation in general, plus chaperon services on ag trips. One young man, an ex-FFAer and an Alumni member, enjoyed driving the bus to the State FFA Contest. Classes of hogs, cattle, grain, etc., are set up by Alumni on their farms for practice sessions.

The immediate goal has been to raise enough money for a \$300 scholarship for an agriculture student. In March, they had a fund-raising evening. They started with a chili and soup supper at 5:30 p.m. At 7:30 p.m., the Creed Speaker and the Parliamentary Procedure Team put on exhibitions for the PTSA meeting. The Parliamentary Procedure Team is now Missouri's number one team and is planning to go to the Invitational National Contest. Following the meeting, the FFA members were auctioned off as slaves. The FFA Chapter will receive one-third of the profits and the Alumni Association will use the other two-thirds on the scholarship fund.

On April 27, 1981, Robert L. Neuenschwander, local Alumni President, presented three scholarships at the FFA Banquet. Two scholarships valued at \$150 and one scholarship valued at \$300 were presented.

### FFA MEMBERSHIP INCREASES

The FFA membership increased after three years of downward trend. The official 1980-81 FFA membership is 482,611 which is up from 1979-80 membership of 481,676. A special salute to local FFA Alumni affiliates for their support in FFA membership promotion. Last year 2,590 chapters had an FFA membership equal to or greater than the number of vo-ag students. We challenge all FFA Alumni to see that this number increases so that all 8,000 FFA chapters have 100 percent of their vocational agriculture students involved in the FFA program.

### SCHOLARSHIP FOR LOCAL AFFILIATES

The National FFA Alumni Council will present one scholarship to the Washington Leadership Conference for each 250 active Alumni members in a local affiliate. The scholarship, presently valued at \$225, will be based on 1981 affiliate memberships. The Ozark, Missouri; Denmark, Wisconsin and New Lexington, Ohio, affiliates have already qualified for scholarships.

### KANSAS CITY CHIEFS PLAN FFA SALUTE

The Kansas City Chiefs will salute the FFA at their game against the Houston Oilers at K. C.'s Arrowhead Stadium following the FFA Convention November 15th. The special FFA salute will feature the FFA National Officers, chorus and recognition of individual chapters represented at the game. This salute is not an official part of the convention but a special tribute by the Chiefs showing their support of the FFA. ### NATIONAL FFA ALUMNI DUES WILL INCREASE
