Agricultural Education Instructor Important to FFA Alumni

The main purpose of the FFA Alumni is to support the FFA and agricultural education. To provide the best level of support, the Alumni needs to maintain close communication with the FFA chapter. Many successful Alumni affiliates accomplish this by including the agricultural education instructor as part of the local Alumni council. The agricultural education instructor can provide direction for the Alumni in terms of what activities can best support the local FFA chapter and agricultural education program.

Although alumni meetings may require additional time for the instructor, the benefits of having alumni support should more than offset any additional time commitments. According to Lynn Wells, eastern region representative on the National FFA Alumni Council, most instructors, who have been involved with successful Alumni affiliates, state it is important for them to be involved with the local Alumni. They feel that the support provided by the Alumni affiliate was a great asset. These teachers emphasize that involvement allows them to channel support where it is most needed.

New Jersey FFA Featured in Museum Exhibit

An FFA/agricultural education exhibit at the New Jersey Museum of Agriculture was opened on July 21. It's centerpiece, a mural, was created by artist Karen Kleinschuster and depicts many facets of New Jersey FFA and agriculture. The mural cover of the 1993-94 FFA Chapter Supply Catalog was also designed by Ms. Kleinschuster. The FFA Alumni played a vital role in securing contributions for the exhibit and its development. The FFA exhibit will be viewed by thousands of visitors to the New Jersey Museum of Agriculture.

National FFA Convention

More than 28,000 FFA members, advisors and supporters are expected to attend the 66th National FFA Convention, November 11-13, in Kansas City, Missouri. This is the world's largest annual youth organization gathering. Lee Greenwood, John Holliman, Baxter Black, and Senator Larry Craig will be making stage presentations.

Wisconsin Alumni Issues Challenge

Five members attended the FFA Alumni State Leaders' Conference in Washington, DC. The delegation visited their senator's office, Senator Herb Kohl, and promptly recruited him as a new life member. Wisconsin issues a challenge to other states to do the same. This could be highly beneficial to the FFA Alumni and FFA.

National Council Nominations

Delegates will elect national council representative for the member-at-large position. The following nominations were selected for the ballot.

Jim Guilinger served as Illinois FFA Alumni president from 1989-92. He was advisor of the Sycamore FFA Alumni, the first to form in Illinois. As a teacher, his chapter won a national gold emblem 34 consecutive years, was rated number one in Illinois for 29 years, and had 69 American FFA Degree recipients. He served as Nat'l Vocational Agricultural Teachers Assoc. president and American Vocational Assoc. president. He has served as coordinator for Facilitating Coordination in Agricultural Education in Illinois since his retirement as a teacher of agriculture.

Paul Wegmeyer served as Michigan FFA Alumni president from 1991-93. He was Michigan FFA president in 1981-82 and received the American FFA Degree in 1983. He has served as chair of the Michigan FFA Foundation Advisory Council and member of the Michigan Agriscience Education Strategic Planning Committee. His position with the Michigan Farm Bureau has allowed him to be involved in legislative research and policy. He has produced daily agricultural broadcasts via satellite to more than 30 radio stations.
