

Faculty Development Opportunities



Welcome New Faculty

A new faculty colleague can be seen in the lecture halls, meeting rooms, and hallways of IUSD: Dr. Chandler Walker. He officially joined the Department of Biomedical and Applied Sciences on July 1, 2017, as a tenure-track assistant professor.



Previously a post doctoral fellow in the department of Anatomy and Cell Biology (January 2015 to June 2017) and in Neurological Surgery (September 2013 to December 2014) at the Indiana University

School of Medicine (IUSM), Dr. Walker also has held academic positions as a lecturer (Neuroanatomy: Contemporary and Translational, IUSM); teaching assistant (Essential Clinical Anatomy and Development, Marian University College of Osteopathic Medicine); and small group leader (Neuroscience & Clinical Neurology).

Among his awards, he has been the recipient of an NIH F31 Pre-Doctoral Fellowship and the Veterans Affairs IIMR Young Investigator Award. He serves on the editorial board for the Journal of Neurorestoratology and as a

consulting editor for the Journal of Neurorestoratology.

Dr. Walker's position, research-focused, has teaching responsibilities that include providing instruction for the Head and Neck Anatomy course for pre-doctoral dental students, the Advanced Head and Neck Anatomy course for post-doctoral/graduate students, portions of the Systems Approach to Biomedical Sciences (SABS), a refresher course in anatomy and neuroscience for the International Dental Program students, and a neuromuscular module in the SABS pre-doctoral course. Sadly, farewells come and amazing colleagues go. Dr. Rachel Menegaz, on June 30, completed an exemplary two-year

visiting assistant professor appointment in the department of Biomedical and Applied Sciences. Her new academic appointment is at the University of North Texas Health Science Center where she will be an assistant professor in the Center for Anatomical Sciences.

Dr. Karen Yoder, whom we reported last month as retiring on June 30, 2017, completes during the first week of July over 38 years of faculty service



to the IU School of Dentistry. Her dedication to the work and people are clear, as she, in her capacity as Director of Civic Engagement and

Health Policy and Professor of Preventive and Community Dentistry, concludes her administrative and full-time faculty appointment for IUSD while doing service in Kenya.

Professor Nancy Young and Dr. Ahmed Ghoneima will be departing IUSD on July 14 and 15, respectively. Professor Young, tenured



Associate Professor in the Department of Periodontics and Allied Dental Programs will be entering retirement, after 34 years of service to IUSD. She has been and is well-respected for her faculty service that began when she was recruited in 1983. She attained tenure in 1988, after which she went on to serve more than 10 years as director of the Dental Hygiene Program and achieved distinctions as an educator and alumna.

Dr. Ahmed Ghoneima's appointment with IUSD began in the De-

partment of Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics in 2009. During his time with the IU School of Dentistry he became an alumnus through our Advanced Standing Specialty Program and a recipient of the Academy of Academic Leadership Award.



Dr. Edwin T. Parks, after starting with IUSD in July 1991 as an associate clinical instructor, will have fulfilled more than 26 years with IUSD when he officially retires as full professor and Division Director of Radiology on July 5. Teaching Award Opportunities

CELEBRATING TEACHING EXCELLENCE

Several prestigious University awards are available for qualified faculty. [Nominations](#) must be submitted electronically and are due by Monday, October 16, 2017 along with supporting documentation.

The available University-level awards include:

⇒ **Distinguished Professorship:** The most prestigious academic appointment Indiana University can offer is a distinguished professorship. [Nominations](#) may be made by faculty, alumni, and students, among others, and are [evaluated by a committee](#). If you are successfully nominated, you will need to [prepare a dossier](#). The rank of distinguished professor honors outstanding scholarship, artistic or literary distinction, or other achievements that have won significant recognition by peers. A list of previous awardees can be found at this [link](#).

⇒ **Distinguished Teaching Awards:** The purpose of the awards is to call attention to the importance of teaching as well as to recognize those who have demonstrated excellence in a wide range of pedagogical activities. Four teaching awards are granted to regular faculty members. The [Frederic Bachman Lieber Memorial Award](#) is available to tenured full-time faculty who have taught for five or more years at Indiana

University. The [Herman Frederic Lieber Memorial Award](#) is available to tenured full-time faculty who have taught for five or more years at Indiana University. The [Sylvia E. Bowman Award](#) is given to faculty who focus on some area of American civilization. The committee will consider only tenured full-time faculty (or equivalent) who have taught for five or more years at Indiana University. The [President's Award](#) is available to all tenured full-time faculty and to all full-time permanent lecturers and clinical rank faculty who have taught for five or more years at Indiana University.

⇒ **Associate Instructor Awards:** The [Lieber Memorial Teaching Associate Award](#) is available to outstanding teachers among the university's graduate students. The [Part-Time Teaching Award](#) calls attention to the importance of part-time teaching and recognizes part-time faculty who have demonstrated excellence. Nominations may be made either directly to the Committee on Distinguished Teaching Awards or be submitted through departmental chairs or deans. The committee does not consider visiting or emeritus faculty nor former University Distinguished Teaching Award recipients for these awards.

⇒ **Service Awards:** This category includes the following four award opportunities. The [Thomas Ehrlich Service](#)

[Learning Award](#) - honors faculty members who have shown outstanding leadership in integrating community and public service into their curricula. [Dr. Karen Yoder](#) is a past recipient of this award. The [W. George Pinnell Award](#) - honors faculty members who are considered to be shining examples of dedication of service and excellence in service to others. The [John W. Ryan Award for International Programs](#) - honors faculty members who have made exceptional contributions to the university's international programs and engagement. [Dr. E. Angeles Martinez-Mier](#) is a past recipient of this award. The [President's Award for Excellence in Teaching and Learning Technology](#) - honors highly innovative faculty members who have contributed significantly to the enhancement of teaching and learning through sustained and innovative use of technology.

These awards require preparation of a dossier. Refer to each award for details regarding the documentation required and the electronic submission of the nomination.

Sample dossier are available for review in the IUPUI Office of Academic Affairs. Faculty wishing to review award dossier samples can make an appointment with Prof. Gail Williamson, gwilliam@iupui.edu. Dossier must be viewed in the Office of Academic Affairs in University Hall.

Hamada & Chang Researcher Grant

In late June Dr. Yusuke Hamada, clinical assistant professor in the Department of Periodontics and Allied Dental Programs, and 3rd year Periodontics resident Dr. Jennifer Chang received notification from the Osteology Foundation that their grant proposal titled "Comparison of the released amounts of growth factors from platelet-rich fibrin (PRF) in healthy individuals and chronic periodontitis patients" has been selected for funding. Dr. Hamada, principal investigator for the grant, said, "I am very honored to receive the Osteology Foundation Young Researcher Grant recently. I'd like to thank committee members Drs. Steven Blanchard, Richard Gregory, and Jack Windsor for their collaboration and mentorship on the research project. Without their support, this would not



have happened." Only approximately ten percent of all Osteology Foundation Young Researcher Grant applicants receive funding. Each grant award is for a maximum of one year, with a maximum potential funding amount of 30'000 Swiss francs. This grant of 10,165CHF (Swiss Francs)/\$10,550 (U.S.) is an exciting and distinguishing honor with international significance for Dr. Hamada and the IU School of Dentistry.

Dr. Chang, student investigator for the grant, stated this grant is particularly important as well because it helps to offset the costs of their project and provides support for residents working on a supporting phase of this project.



The [Osteology Foundation](#) is an international organization. The foundation promotes research and education in the field of oral and maxillofacial tissue regeneration.

Their motto is "Linking Science with Practice in Regeneration" with an aim toward bridging the gap between scientific progress and clinical practice, as well as between academic and industrial researchers in the field of oral tissue regeneration. IU School of Dentistry's Associate Dean for Research Dr. Tien-Min (Gabe) Chu applauded the news of this grant award, noting specifically the vital role our clinical faculty can and do play in research and development. In his comments, Dr. Chu stated, "I am extremely excited to see Drs. Hamada and Chang receiving this research grant. It demonstrates our efforts in encouraging and supporting more clinical faculty to participate in research. I look forward to seeing them contribute to new knowledge in periodontology through this grant."

Former Faculty In Memoria



Dr. Norris L. Richmond, 85, passed away on May 24, 2017. A memorial service was held on June 6, 2017 at the All Souls Unitarian Church.

Born and raised in Gary, Indiana, Dr. Richmond was the first born of ten children. He graduated from Roosevelt High School in 1948, joined the Air Force in 1952 and then enrolled in a dental technician course. His dental training eventually lead to assignments as a dental hygienist in various locations including Japan, the Philippines, and Taiwan, during his tour of service.

He married in 1954 and had two daughters, Taiyan and Tish. Following his discharge from the Air Force in 1956, Dr. Richmond earned his BS in Public Health and DDS from IU School of Dentistry, graduating in 1963. He maintained a part-time private practice from 1963-1966, earning an MS in Operative Dentistry in 1965.

Dr. Richmond was appointed to the IUSD faculty in the Department of Operative Dentistry, becoming among the first African Americans to join the ranks of the full-time faculty. He was tenured in 1973 and promoted to Professor in 1980. Throughout his career he received numerous awards and recognitions. In 1995, he earned the distinction of Professor Emeritus upon his retirement from IUSD.

Well-known for his sense of humor and friendly smile, Dr. Richmond also loved music, world travel, and learning about other cultures and religions. His hobbies included the love of architecture and reading.

Dr. William D. Browning, 68, passed away on June 10, 2017. The first in his family to go to college, Dr. Browning received his dental



degree in 1974 and his masters of science degree in 1991, both from the University of Michigan. He practiced dentistry for nearly

20 years before entering academia. In 2008, Dr. Browning was appointed Professor of Operative Dentistry with tenure and Indiana Dental Association Endowed Chair in Restorative Dentistry at IUSD.

During his tenure at IUSD, he served as module director for three courses, published seventeen authored or co-authored articles in peer-reviewed journals, presented at international, national, regional and state professional meetings, and delivered innumerable invited presentations at state and local venues. He also served on the Council of Dental Education and Practice for the Indiana Dental Association and several IUSD Task Forces.

He retired from teaching in 2014, and even after retirement continued to collaborate with IUSD faculty in various ways. In 2014 he was given the distinction of Professor Emeritus of Operative Dentistry.

His interests included travel, food and wine, military history, politics, and chocolate in any form. He leaves behind his wife Judy and their two children, as well as several grandchildren.

Recruitment Update



Highlighted in earlier sections of this month's newsletter are updates relative to the assistant professor position in the department of Biomedical and Applied Sciences (recruitment of Dr. Chandler Walker) and to the assistant/associate professor position in the department of Cariology, Operative Dentistry, and Dental Public Health (recruitment of Dr. Tamara Button). Consideration of candidates Dr. Yasuyoshi Ueki—for associate/full professor in Biomedical and Applied Sciences, Dr. Ching-Chang Ko—for department chair of Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics, and Dr. Wei-Shao Lin—for associate/full professor in Prosthodontics, are still underway. For each of those candidates confirmation of the rank at which they should be recruited is being evaluated by the IU School of Dentistry's Promotion and

Tenure Committee. A decision will be reached this month and then steps will proceed according to internal offer recommendations and University policy for IUSD and campus-level offer approval.

The department of Oral Pathology, Medicine and Radiology seeks your ongoing support in recruiting applicants for its clinical assistant professor position. Its lead applicant accepted another offer in late June.

During July two candidates will be interviewed as finalists for the clinical assistant professor position in the Division of Dental Hygiene in Periodontics and Allied Dental Programs. Internal candidate Twyla Rader is scheduled to interview on July 12. External candidate Anne Miller is scheduled to interview on July 14. It is anticipated that the Search and Screen Committee for the position will make its hire recommendation to IU School of Dentistry dean Dr. John Williams by the end of July/early August.

Dr. Allison Scully, a recent graduate of the

IU School of Dentistry and currently a pediatric dentistry resident at the University of Michigan – Ann Arbor's School of Dentistry, interviewed with IUSD in June for the clinical assistant professor position in Pediatric Dentistry. Since there are currently no other appropriately qualified candidates for interview, the Search and Screen Committee is reviewing candidate feedback from Dr. Scully's interviews and presentation to provide this month a hire recommendation to Dean John Williams.

Also in relation to Pediatric Dentistry, the call for internal applications for the position of department chair closed on June 16. Only one application was received for the Search and Screen Committee's consideration. An official interview recommendation will be submitted to executive associate dean Dr. Michael Kowolik this month. If recommended, interviews and a candidate presentation will be scheduled for late July/early August. Watch for email updates!

IUSD Building News

Adam Smith, Director of Facilities Planning & Auxiliary Operations, reports the following construction update on the new IUSD Fritts Clinical Care Center.

Construction is progressing well on the Fritts Clinical Care Center. On the interior of the building, workers are already hanging drywall. By mid-July, they should break through the exterior of the current building in two locations: Dr. Ned Warner's former office in Endodontics for the northern walkway connector, and through the first, second and third floors for the patient entry and the southern walkway connector. The elevator installations should be complete in July as well.

In our existing buildings, there will be

some movement of clinics because of curriculum changes, most notably creating dis-



cipline-specific clinical programs for D3s. For example, D3s will now practice Prosthodontics in rooms 311 and 314, as Graduate Prosthodontics has moved to the fourth floor multidisciplinary clinic that was vacated by the TEAM Clinic, which has been

dissolved. Also sharing the fourth floor multidisciplinary clinic will be the Graduate Operative Dentistry Program and the Center for Implant, Aesthetic and Innovative Dentistry. First-year Dental Hygiene students will practice in the Regenstrief Clinic, while DH2s will practice in open operatories throughout the facility.

Progress on the Phase II building redesign continues to move forward as well. Currently the framework for how the subcommittees will operate and generate feedback is being determined. Subcommittee meetings are planned to commence soon. If you have volunteered for a subcommittee, keep an eye on your inbox for upcoming information.

Dr. Eversman in Memoria



Dr. Philip Eversman, 67, passed away on June 11, 2017. A memorial service was held on June 15, 2017 at St. Christopher Catholic Church in Indianapolis.

He was born in Jasper, Indiana and was a graduate of Indiana University and received his DDS degree from IUSD in 1975. He is survived by his wife, Cynthia, and their three children, Emily, Matthew and Eric (Bao) Eversman.

Dr. Eversman practiced general dentistry in Hendricks County for 40 years and re-


tired in 2015. He was Fellow of the American Academy of General Dentistry, a member of the International College of Dentists, the American Dental Association, the Indiana District Dental Society, and the Indiana Dental Society.

Dr. Eversman received several awards during his career, including the leadership award from the Indiana Dental Association, and the Honor Dentist Award from the Indianapolis District Dental Society. He was appointed as a clinical adjunct assistant professor in the Comprehensive Care and General Dentistry department in January 2017. He was admired and respected by students,

staff and faculty in the Comp Care department. Among his many passions, Dr. Eversman was an avid fisherman, a lifetime learner, world traveler and a hobbyist.

CAITS has announced a new tool to help IU fight against phishing emails. The PhishMe Reporter tool for Outlook is now available in the Software Center on CAITS supported PC's.

The PhishMe Reporter tool replaces the PhishAlarm add-in previously available on some CAITS PC's. The new tool should be available to install on all CAITS PC's. Anyone can install it at their leisure and use it to report suspected phishing emails with a single mouse click. Simply go to your start menu, click all pro-

grams. Then go to Microsoft systems center and click on Software center. Select the applications tab and then look for the PhishMe icon and download. Now you can report phishing emails in one click.
