IUPUI's [40th-year celebration](#) continues. This week The Spot met with Mackenzie Valandigham to discuss some of the ways you can commemorate IUPUI's 40 years.

[M. Valandigham] The web site is basically a place where students and staff can go to to see what we're doing along with the 40th Anniversary. It contains a calendar. You can go and see what events are happening on campus and get some more information on where to show up and who's going to be speaking.

The trivia section of the web site is for students, faculty, and staff. Anybody can get on there and answer our weekly trivia question. It's changed every week. If you get the right answer, your name will be added into a big pot, and we will draw for prizes. The question changes every week, so you go back every week and you get to see your answers and if you're right or wrong. At the end of 12 weeks we'll draw for a prize. Everyone's eligible for the prizes.

We've got some things donated from our Barnes and Noble bookstore on campus and from some surrounding bookstores - the Textbook Alternative and Indy College Bookstore as well. The prizes will be valuable to students. We'll get some things in there for the staff, too.

They also get all of their printing done here. We have printers for posters and also for regular flyers. They can get designs with JAGtv and help their web sites as well.

We're located up in the Campus Center in Room 380, which is actually within room 370 in the Campus Center, so you'll see 370 before you'll see our office actually.

Free Poster February is a promotion that the Multimedia Production Center is putting on for student organizations that are registered with Campus and Community Life to be able to exchange 50 of their 150 flyers that they get per month in exchange for a 2-foot by 3-foot poster.

There's other offers that we're going to be doing during this month. This week in particular is going to be a free giveaway for 50 flyers for the first organization that says they saw this ad on The Spot. So you want to check out the Spot every week for additional promotions throughout the month of February. Any registered student organization can get a poster. If you're not registered, you want to talk to Diana Sims-Harris in the Campus and Community Life office in the Campus Center in Room 370.
