She launched the first staff bonus pay plan. When studies showed us that students who worked on campus made better academic progress, she took steps to promote student employment. Earlier this year, during Women's History Month, Ellen was named Outstanding Woman Full-Time Staff Leader. She also was selected for inclusion in the Women Creating Excellence at IUPUI online exhibit.

A lasting legacy of Ellen's management of HRA is the work/life balance program she started. It was designed to boost productivity and job satisfaction as a business strategy while integrating work, family, and community. In recognition of her commitment, the IUPUI Staff Council brought about the establishment of the new Poffenberger Work/Life Program fund.
