Thanks to all of you, we've done it again. IUPUI enrollment and credit hours set new records. Last week's [announcement](#) of the Indiana University official enrollment report demonstrates that IUPUI is continuing to be a major factor in Indianapolis's relative vitality during these tough economic times. By serving more students, and helping students graduate, we contribute to Indiana's future.

This fall, undergraduate enrollment is up 1.3 percent and credit hours are up 1.9 percent. We are pleased that overall enrollment is up—and retention is up—both of which will contribute to the Talent Dividend, which seeks to boost the number of baccalaureate degree holders contributing to the regional economy.

My thanks go to you—the staff and faculty—who, weathering the economic downturn, have worked hard to ensure that critical work got done.
