## Fiscal Status Improves in Past Year

The fiscal status of the Academy, reported by Treasurer **Vic Childers** at the September Board meeting, is \$61,581.34. The Board discussed a convoluted system of holding and allocating funds which are in IUPUI and IU Foundation accounts.

The Academy supports two scholarship funds at \$4,000 a year. Dues accounted for \$2,520 of the increase from last year, and for the scholarship accounts which are income-producing, \$1,855 came from contributions and investment income, and appreciation in market value accounted for the rest.

Dues for membership are \$10 per year or \$100 for lifetime membership. There are 97 life members.

# Public Presentation on Aspects of Cyber Theft

For those interested in one of the big issues of our time, the new IU Cybersecurity Center presents public presentations to keep us abreast of developments in this mysterious but socially encompassing field.

The first was on Sept. 8 at the Law School. **Filippo Menczer**, associate professor of informatics and computer science, presented a discussion of Social Phishing.

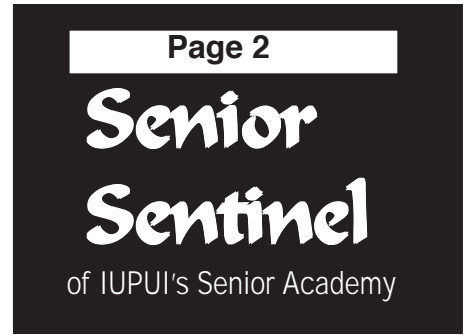
“We discussed the results of an experiment showing that people are over four times more likely to become victims if they are solicited by someone who appears to be known to them. We showed how easy it is to find out who knows whom from information publicly available on the Web, and then spoof the sender of an email to induce a victim to release personal account information. We also discussed the ethical aspects of carrying out such an experiment, and the public debate that has taken place following the experiment,” he said.

This is joint work with **Tom Jagatic, Nate Johnson, and Markus Jakobsson.**

When the notice of this program came on the editor’s computer, it was followed by a likely bogus plea from The Bank fo the West to give information so it could be matched with our account. Neither the Bank of the West nor any account associated with any such entity is known about.

The Cybersecurity Research Center was announced in April, 2003 and has assembled a staff to work with businesses and government agencies to win battles with cyberspace criminals.

Other public presentations are scheduled for Oct. 13, titled “From Privacy and Security to Collective Information Practices” by **Paul Dourish** of UC-Irvine, and a Nov. 10 program by **Philippe Golle**. Times and places are still to be announced.

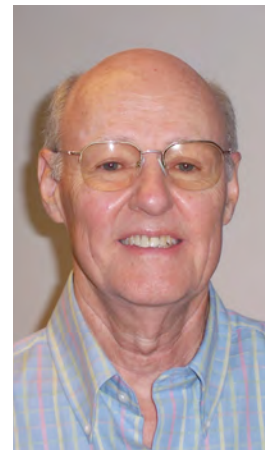
## The Pres Says... **Preparing for a Great Year**
