



Dean's Advisory Board Member Frank Basile and his wife,

Katrina, are passionate about providing mind-expanding educational opportunities for Herron's students. Certainly, travel ranks high among the possibilities the Basiles know first-hand. Having visited 174 countries on all seven continents, they have a well-developed global perspective and sense of how to get around—qualities that would serve any artist well. Frank's new book, *Traveling with Frank and Katrina*, is due in late June. If the chapter headings are any indicator ("Iran: A peaceful sojourn into the 'Axis of Evil' " or "Katmandu, Nepal: The unrest of the story"), these travel tales will "share the world in ways you won't find in guide books." Grant will bring sculptural bike racks to IUPUI

Assistant Professor of Ceramics Lesley Baker will turn her \$5,000 Greening IUPUI grant into a fall class project for sculpture students. An undetermined number of sculptural bike racks, fabricated with the collaboration of the sculpture faculty, will dot the campus as a result. IUPUI is providing up to \$50,000 annually to fund student, faculty and staff led initiatives which will "green" IUPUI by advancing Sustainability Principles.


