**All Finalists for the Indiana Supreme Court Justice were Alumni of the IU Robert H. McKinney School of Law.** The Indiana Judicial Nominating Commission selected **Honorable Cale J. Bradford**, '86, Indiana Court of Appeals; **Mark S. Massa**, '89, executive director of the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute; and **Jane Ann Seigel**, '79, executive director of the Indiana Judicial Center, as finalists for the position that became available when Chief Justice Randall T. Shepard retired this March. Indiana *Governor Mitch Daniels* selected former federal and state prosecutor **Mark Massa** on March 23rd as the next member of the Indiana Supreme Court. The new Justice will join two other IU McKinney School of Law alumni already serving on the court – Justice Steven David, '82, appointed in 2010, and Justice Brent E. Dickson, '68, who has served since 1986.

**Environmental Program Receives Grant for International Water Governance.** A grant from the International Council for Canadian Studies will assist **Professor Eric Dannenmaier** and a student research team in their work on transboundary water resource governance. The \$5,000 grant from the Canadian Government will help underwrite work by Professor Dannenmaier's team as they conduct a comparative...

assessment of community involvement in the negotiation and implementation of transboundary agreements between Canada and the United States concerning the Columbia River and the Great Lakes. Their research seeks to assess the effectiveness of these negotiation processes in facilitating participation among stakeholders across borders. Professor Dannenmaier has been working with students on the project since last summer, and he is leading an Advanced Field Research (AFR) course this spring semester that will continue the work with the support of the new grant. The grant will be used, in part, to fund student travel to research areas in the Great Lakes and Columbia River basins to conduct interviews and gather information.

**New Book on Public Defense in Criminal Cases Offers ‘Clear Vision of a More Promising Future.’**

Professor of Law and Dean Emeritus **Norman Lefstein’s** groundbreaking book, *Securing Reasonable Caseloads: Ethics and Law in Public Defense*, is being sent nationwide to bar leaders, judges, and public defenders. FBI Director, William Sessions, defines Professor Lefstein in the forward he wrote for his book as “the nation’s leading scholar on indigent defense systems, and says that he “shows us a viable way forward... (and) a clear vision of a more promising future” in regard to the nation’s public defense systems in state courts. Professor Lefstein’s book is sponsored by the American Bar Association (ABA) Standing Committee on Legal Aid and Indigent Defendants (SCLAID) and supported by Atlantic Philanthropies. **New Summer 2012 Program for Chinese Students.**

Students from Sun Yat-sen University Law School will travel outside China for that school’s first summer study abroad program and their destination will be IU Robert H. McKinney School of Law. **Professor Tom Wilson** met with Sun Yat-sen officials in October, 2011, to finalize the plans. The meeting was followed by a signing ceremony at which time Professor Wilson and Sun Yat-sen Law School Dean, **Xu Zhongming**, executed a partnership agreement between the schools. Sun Yat-sen law students will come to the McKinney School of Law for three weeks, where they will receive classroom instruction and participate in law-related and cultural field trips. Two weeks will be spent in Washington, D.C. Sun Yat-sen University Law School expects 30 to 40 students to enroll in the inaugural program, which will take place from July 30 through Aug 17, 2012.

Tom Sullivan, a nationally recognized authority on antitrust law and complex litigation, authoring ten books and over 50 articles, served in the role of Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost at the University of Minnesota from July 2004 through December 2011. He also served as the eighth dean of the University of Minnesota Law School from 1995 to 2002. Upon finishing his term as dean, he returned to full-time research and teaching.

Before coming to the University of Minnesota, Professor Sullivan served for six years as dean of the University of Arizona College of Law and as associate dean at Washington University in St. Louis. He began his career in higher education as a faculty member at the University of Missouri, Columbia. Professor Sullivan has received several awards for his teaching excellence and leadership and contributions to law school development. He has chaired the ABA Section of Legal Education and the AALS Section on Antitrust and Economic Regulation. He has also been a consultant to the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee on judicial nominations to the Supreme Court. Professor Sullivan graduated *magna cum laude* from the Robert H. McKinney School of Law in 1973, where he served as an editor on the *Indiana Law Review*.



## Faculty, Students & Staff in the Spotlight !



*Professors Cynthia Adams and Carrie Hagan* were invited to the Kenya Law School January 30 through February 3, 2012, to conduct a five-day clinical workshop for the school's faculty on teaching methodology for clinical skills, including transactional and probate drafting, live client clinics, experiential learning, and pre-trial drafting. Kenya Law School, founded in 1963 as the country's first law school, began its one-year Advocates Training Programme in 2008 upon recommendation from the Ministerial Taskforce on the Development of a Policy and Legal Framework for Legal Education in Kenya. The Programme provides clinical skills training to prepare students for admission to the Roll of Advocates and to become officers of Kenya's High Court.

*Jarryd Anglin*, 3L, enrolled in the law school's Appellate Clinic program, recently won reversal for a man he represented who was convicted of possession of marijuana. The Court of Appeals reversed his conviction, also in a published opinion, concluding that the evidence did not show sufficient basis for an investigatory stop.

*Professor Shawn Boyne* has been named to the Society of American Law Teachers committee on LGBT issues. The committee increases the awareness of issues of concern to the LGBT community in American law schools. Professor Boyne also serves as the law school's faculty contact for the Law School Admissions Council for prospective LGBT students.

*Professor Karen Bravo* has been appointed to the Arthur C. Helton Fellowship Program Committee. The Helton Program, established in 2004 on the recommendation of the American Society of International Law (ASIL) Honors Committee, recognizes the legacy of Arthur C. Helton, a remarkable ASIL member who died in the August 19, 2003, bombing of the UN mission in Baghdad, along with the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights, Sergio Vieira de Mello, and 20 others. Professor Bravo will serve on the 2012 selection committee that reviews applications each year for the fellowship.

The fellowship provides financial assistance in the form of micro-grants and is funded, in part, by contributions from ASIL members. Fellows will undertake their project in association with an established educational institution, international organization, or non-governmental organization working in areas related to international law, human rights, and humanitarian affairs.

**Professor Kenneth Chestek**, who joined our law school in the summer of 2003 as a member of the LARC team, teaching in the areas of legal analysis, research and communication, and professional responsibility, will be leaving after this semester to begin a new position with the University of Wyoming. **International Human Rights Law Society JD Students Leontiy Korolev**, **Kate Cook**, **Aimee Heitz** and **Timothy Weber**, along with Delta Cultura Cabo Verde, a Cape Verdean non-governmental organization, researched, wrote, and submitted a Shadow Report to the United Nations Human Rights Committee discussing how the government of Cape Verde has failed to combat corporal punishment and sexual abuse of school children in Cape Verde. The 70-page report, submitted on March 3<sup>rd</sup>, provided the Committee with key recommendations in curbing corporal punishment and sexual abuse. The report called for the establishment by the Cape Verdean government of child- and gender-sensitive mechanisms for the mandatory reporting and investigation of corporal punishment and sexual abuse cases, and to integrate the best-interest-of-the-child principles in those mechanisms. Other J.D. students who participated in the project include: **Ritu Chokshi**, **Mark Shope**, **Jessica Topor**, **David Wesche**, and **Guang Yang**. **Professor Lahny Silva** also contributed to the report, along with PIHRL program manager, **Perfecto Caparas**, who trained, supervised, and directed the students in UN shadow report, international human

rights law, and evidence writing and analysis. In the report, Perfecto introduced and integrated the issue-rule-analysis-conclusion structure and system into UN shadow reporting. The compilation of the reports can be accessed at: <http://indylaw.indiana.edu/humanrights/UNshadow.html>.

**Janelle Kilies** and **Sean McGoff** were both selected for this year's Law Student of the Year award at the Indianapolis Bar Association's annual "Take a Law Student to Lunch" event, which was held at the Hilton Indianapolis on March 22<sup>nd</sup>. The honor is given to a student, or students, who have made exceptional contributions to support Law Student Division sponsored activities or programs, who are recognized as good role models for the legal profession, and who are deserving of special recognition. **Professor Antony Page**, an expert in International securities and business law, testified before the Indiana Senate's Committee on Commerce and Economic Development on January 20<sup>th</sup>. He spoke in favor of Senate Bill 62, which introduces flexible purpose corporations to the state. A flexible purpose corporation is an organizational form of business entities that would like to pursue a social purpose in addition to making a profit. To date, one state has enacted a similar form. A related form known as the benefit corporation has already been enacted in seven states. Supporters expect that the new form would bring additional employment opportunities to Indiana, as well as allowing social entrepreneurs to achieve their visions. He also spoke to Indiana's Business Law Survey Commission about the bill. The bill was authored by Indiana State Senator **Mike Delph** who graduated from our law school in 2010.

**EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS**

Indiana University has created a web page to provide resources for you about emergency preparedness; information will be updated as needed. From the IU homepage, <http://www.indiana.edu/>, go to: About IUPUI, Site Index, Emergency Preparedness.

**In the event of a building emergency for:**



**FIRE:** Alarms will sound and evacuation is mandatory. Use closest stairway for exits. **DO NOT USE ELEVATORS.** Once outside, move to a safe place – if possible, to the parking lot west of the law school. Remain outside until the “all clear” is given.

**NOTE: If you have a physical condition which prevents you from walking down the stairway, please go to one of the two designated “safe rooms” in the building: Rm. 267 or Rm. 387. Safe rooms will be checked by the fire department and persons located in these rooms will be carried to safety by fire department personnel in the event of an actual fire.**

**TORNADO WATCH:** The “campus siren” will sound but evacuation is **NOT** required.

**TORNADO WARNING:** When a severe weather warning is activated by sirens, Jag Alert, campus emergency alert radios, or law school personnel, **evacuation is necessary.** Evacuate **immediately** to the designated areas of the building not exposed to windows or other potential hazards from shattered glass. **(Classrooms are now designated “shelter in place” locations with the installation of special laminate on the windows preventing flying glass and other debris from entering the classrooms.)**

Please see the designated areas posted at the north elevators on each floor of the law school building. **DO NOT** use the underground parking garage as a shelter location.

## **SAFETY AT IUPUI**
