Every 10 years, the HLC sends an evaluation team to review IUPUI's accreditation and recommend whether it be renewed. (Accreditation is required to receive federal funds and be eligible for accreditation by disciplinary and professional accreditors).

Two Kelley Students Named to IUPUI Top 10


