[ K. Christopher ] Hi. I'm Kaitlyn Christopher and this is the February 20th edition of IUPUI's The Spot.

In light of the tragic shootings at Northern Illinois University, we want to remind you of the importance of registering your contact information into the IU-Notify system, which can be done in Onestart. This system will be used to announce and provide guidance in an emergency or crisis, and to communicate relevant critical updates. This may be done via text messaging or voice calls. Due to the upgrade of University systems, you should wait until at least Friday to update your information.

The Student Advocate Office at IUPUI provides objective, impartial, and confidential assistance to students. Anyone who has a student-related question, complaint, conflict or general concern may contact the Student Advocate Office as the first step toward a resolution. We spoke with Josh Manlove for more information.

[ J. Manlove ] The Student Advocate gives assistance to students who are feeling stuck, who have any kind of problem, who haven't been able to resolve a problem by other means - financial issues, issues with an instructor, issues with another student. I handle pretty much everything. Every student on campus, I feel, at some point or another has experienced a situation where they could've used my services. Or, I'm in the beautiful new Campus Center on the third floor - it's the Student Life suite, suite 350. It's right when you get off the escalator on the third floor.
