

IUPUI LIBRARIAN

Robert J. Bonner has been appointed director of libraries at IUPUI. He will be responsible for operation and development of all the libraries -- Blake Street, Herron School of Art and 38th Street. Bonner will also hold the academic rank of associate librarian.

The appointment was announced by Chancellor Glenn W. Irwin, Jr. A native of Pennsylvania, Bonner received the A.B. degree from King's College at Wilkes Barre and the M.L.S. degree from Rutgers University.

ENGINEERING REACCREDITED

The School of Engineering and Technology at Indiana University-Purdue University at Indianapolis has been reaccredited by the Engineering Council for Professional Development. The council is the accrediting agency for all schools of engineering and technology.

The School's two-year mechanical engineering technology program was reaccredited for four-years, until September 30, 1976; the four-year mechanical technology program for four years and the four-year industrial engineering technology program for four years.

R. Bruce Renda, dean of the School of Engineering, said the reaccreditation assures professional recognition for the school, transferability of credits and acceptance of graduate programs. Dean Renda commented that the report of the reaccrediting inspection team was very complimentary to the programs and faculty of the School of Engineering and Technology.

The following parking regulation recommended to the Chancellor's Office by the Parking Policy Committee has been approved, effective immediately.

All individuals properly displaying a valid IUPUI parking decal on their vehicle may park in any (BLUE, GREEN or RED) designated University parking areas north of WEST MICHIGAN STREET and WEST OF AGNES STREET between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. Monday through Friday.

All Deans, Directors and Department Heads should post this notice and otherwise inform students of this new regulation.

REORGANIZATION PLAN ENDORSED

^ The IUPUI Faculty Council has endorsed the University reorganization plan with some additional recommendations: that the development of each system-wide school be reviewed by appropriate faculty committees; that system schools continue to encourage development of diverse academic programs at the Indianapolis and Bloomington campuses; that the Indianapolis and Bloomington vice-presidents be given additional titles of chancellor; that the name IUPUI be changed to reflect the role of this campus in the I.U. system; and that the role of IUPUI in intercollegiate sports be more fully developed. The Faculty Council recommendations were based on reports of interviews with faculty groups and individuals by the IUPUI Review Committee.

IUPUI & FUNDS FROM THE FEDS

^ IUPUI ranks 71st among U.S. colleges and universities on the basis of Federal funds received during fiscal 1973, according to a Chronicle of Higher Education survey. The amount, \$13.8 million, includes Federal funds for all purposes except construction and student loans. IUPUI ranked 74th in fiscal 1972 with \$13.7 million in Federal funds.

IU-Bloomington ranked 80th in fiscal 1973 with \$12.5 in Federal grants, down from \$17.6 million and a 57th place ranking in fiscal 1972. Purdue ranked 27th with \$28.5 million, compared with \$27.9 million and a 32nd ranking the previous year.

IUPUI ranked ahead of such institutions as the University of Oregon, Rockefeller University, Brown University, the University of Oklahoma, the University of Maryland at Baltimore, Iowa State University, and Mississippi State University.

The largest total in Federal funds, \$125.5-million, was awarded to Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Other leaders, although far behind the MIT total, were the University of Wisconsin at Madison, the University of Washington, Harvard, UCLA, University of California at Berkeley, Howard University, the University of Minnesota, the University of Michigan, and Stanford.

CO-OPERATIVE NEIGHBORS

Franklin College and the IUPUI Columbus Center have begun a co-operative admissions arrangement which will permit students to take as much as two years of work at

Columbus and then transfer to Franklin to complete work toward baccalaureate degrees. The student would transfer without making a repeat application, provided he meets Franklin's academic standards. Students may also take Franklin courses, at reduced fees, while enrolled at Columbus, and credits will be transferable between the schools.
