DeBARD NAMED TO NEW POST IN CONTINUING EDUCATION

Dr. Robert DeBard has been appointed assistant director of the IUPUI Division of Continuing Education by Vice-President Glenn W. Irwin, Jr.

Dr. DeBard, who has been a co-ordinator with the department for more than two years, has been instrumental in developing the division's public relations program and non-credit continuing studies programs in the humanities and college preparation areas.

Dr. DeBard received his undergraduate degree in English from Bowling Green University and his master's from there in 1968. He received his doctor of education degree from I.U.

He will continue his role as one of six full-time co-ordinators of programs for the division. He also will be in charge of division research, including market analysis and program evaluation. He will be responsible for special developmental projects, such as extension operations.
