

The Office of Research and Sponsored Programs (RSP) announces that the deadline for submitting Spencer Foundation Grant requests is December 1 (not October 29 as previously printed). RSP also reminds interested persons about approaching deadlines for two other programs. For more information about either of these programs, call Ext. 8285.

Study Fellowships -- Designed to assist young scholars in the humanities who wish to enlarge their range of knowledge by study in disciplines other than their present specialization. They are available from the American Council of Learned Societies. Period of study, a minimum of six continuous months, must be between July 1, 1977, and December 31, 1978. Stipends will not exceed \$12,000. Deadline for receipt of applications is November 15.

Curriculum Development Grants and Research Seed Money Grants -- The I.U. Center for International Policy Studies has announced the availability of these grants in modest amounts. They are restricted to course development and improvement or research in the general area of arms control and international security using quantitative and/or mathematical approaches. Deadline for receiving proposals for the Spring and Summer of 1977 is November 1.
