

NEW HOSPITALS DIRECTOR ASSUMES DUTIES FRIDAY

Roger S. Hunt, associate vice-president and hospital administrator at the Hahnemann Medical College and Hospital of Philadelphia since 1974, last week was named director of the Indiana University Hospitals. The I.U. board of trustees approved the appointment, which becomes effective Friday.

"We are fortunate to have acquired the services of this young man who has compiled an enviable record in his field in a short length of time," said Dr. Steven C. Beerling, dean of the I.U. School of Medicine.

Hunt will succeed Ralph W. Kletzien, who has served as acting director of the hospitals for the past year while a search for a new administrator was continuing. Kletzien will resume his duties as assistant director.

Hunt, 34, a native of White Plains, N.Y., received the A.B. degree in psychology from DePauw University and the master of business administration in health care administration from George Washington University, Washington, D.C. He served as administrative resident and then administrative assistant at Lankenau Hospital, Philadelphia, before becoming assistant administrator at Hahnemann in 1968. He became hospital director in 1971.

Since 1973 he has been associate professor in the Hahnemann College of Allied Health Professions, where he developed courses in health care organization, professional liability, and management.

As associate vice-president, Hunt served as the chief administrative officer of the 500-bed medical school hospital, which has an annual budget of \$44-million, 1,700 employees and 295 interns and residents. He implemented budgeting and revenue management programs resulting in a \$1-million improvement in the hospital's operation and producing an annual net gain.

He co-ordinated program planning, helped develop the financing, and obtained planning agency approvals for a \$65-million hospital construction, and he reorganized nursing services and started recruitment programs which filled the budgeted registered nurse positions for the first time in 20 years.

He also established some shared service programs, established a brain scanning capability, expanded renal dialysis facilities, and directed policy and procedure development for the corporation.

Hunt is a fellow of the American College of Hospital Administrators, a member of the American Hospital Association, the Hospital Association of Pennsylvania, the Delaware Valley Hospital Council, and the Forum of the Delaware Valley Hospital Council. He was listed in the 1970 edition of Outstanding Young Men in America, named "Jaycee of

the Year" by the Wayne Area Jaycees in 1970, and won the Mead Johnson Fellowship, the American College of Hospital Administrators' postgraduate training award, in 1967-68.

SALLY KNOX NAMED TO HOSPITALS POST

Miss Sally L. Knox, chairman of medical nursing services at the I.U. hospitals since 1973, has been appointed associate director of the I.U. hospitals for nursing services.

Miss Knox has served as acting assistant director of hospitals for nursing services since August, when Mrs. Anne P. Black resigned the post to accept another position. She is responsible for nursing at University Hospital, the Riley Hospital for Children, and Robert W. Long Hospital.

Miss Knox, who also is adjunct assistant professor of medicine at the I.U. School of Medicine, came to the I.U. Medical Center in 1967 as assistant professor of nursing in the School of Nursing. She served for a time as staff development co-ordinator for medical nursing services at the I.U. Hospitals.

A native of Brazil (Ind.), Miss Knox attended Van Buren High School there. She received her bachelor of science degree from Indiana State University and her master of science degree from the I.U. School of Nursing. She now is working on her doctorate at I.U.-Bloomington.

She also attended the St. Anthony Hospital School of Nursing at Terre Haute where she received her nursing diploma and the school's clinical award. She was named "Alumna of the Year" at the St. Anthony Hospital school in 1974.

Miss Knox has been a staff nurse and instructor at St. Anthony Hospital, and served as an in-service instructor at Union Hospital in Terre Haute, as well as at the I.U. Medical Center.

She is a member of Phi Lambda Theta, educational honorary, and Sigma Theta Tau, honorary society in nursing. She also is an active member of the American Nurses Association, the Indiana State Nurses Association, the Indiana Adult Education Association, the Marion County Heart Association, the Marion County Mental Health Association, the Indiana Society of Nursing Service Administrators, and the Adult Education Association of America.

Save the Pacers -- June 30 (that's Thursday) is the deadline for the drive to sell 8,000 season tickets for the 1977-78 Pacer season and apparently assure that the Indiana Pacers will stay in Indianapolis for another year.
