## WEDNESDAY IS BIG DAY FOR MEDICAL ALUMNI

Twenty members of the class of 1928, representing 1,000 years of medical practice, have made reservations to attend the 31st Annual Alumni Day of the I.U. School of Medicine on Wednesday in the traditional circus tent on the front lawn of the Union Building.

The program will be a special 75th Anniversary celebration (the School of Medicine admitted its first class in Bloomington in September, 1903) during which Dr. Julius B. Richmond, U.S. surgeon general, will receive an honorary degree from I.U.

Another highlight of the Diamond Jubilee program will be the presentation of the Distinguished Alumni Families Award to 13 families who have had three generations of physicians graduated from the School of Medicine. A total of 93 physicians graduated 50 years ago in the class of 1928. Of these, 35 are still living.

Dr. Richmond will receive his honorary degree from I.U. President John W. Ryan with traditional pomp and ceremony after an academic procession to the strains of music from a brass band.

Registration for the more than 600 medical alumni expected to attend the annual meeting will be held under the tent beginning at 9 a.m. Annual business session and election of officers will be held at 11 a.m. in the Union Building Roof Lounge.

The traditional roast beef and strawberry shortcake luncheon will begin under the tent at 11:45 a.m., followed by the academic procession and awarding of the honorary degree. School of Medicine Dean Steven C. Beering will give his annual report to the alumni.
