

A SECOND "FIRST"

IUPUI's second annual "First of Fall Festival" will be held September 21-October 10 with concerts, food and tours of the campus.

On September 21, there will be a cookout on the Cavanaugh Hall Mall, with the rock group "Streamwinner" from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., and on September 27 there will be a cookout and a concert by "Spokane" during the same hours at the same place.

On September 23 at 1 p.m. there will be an "Almost Anything Goes" contest on the West Michigan Street campus for IUPUI students, faculty and staff. The public is invited to watch.

October 7 will be "Opportunities Day" for high school students which will include a cookout and concert by "Bald Ego" from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. There will be two workshops--one at 10 a.m. and the other at 1 p.m.--during which there will be a skit by the IUPUI Speech and Theater Department, an audiovisual show about IUPUI, and representatives from the departments ranging from Financial Aids to Career Counseling. Displays and representatives from the various schools and divisions will be in the Lecture Hall from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

On October 10 the whole community is invited to IUPUI for a cookout and concert with the Indianapolis Symphony Woodwind Quintet from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the Cavanaugh Hall Mall. There will be a continuous audiovisual show about IUPUI and its programs in the Lecture Hall, and displays and representatives from Continuing Studies, the Women's Program, the campus day care center, Weekend College, the External Degree Program and IUPUI schools and divisions. (In case of rain, the concert will be held in the Union Building.) The IUPUI Downtown Express will provide transportation from downtown to campus for 10 cents a ride. SPEAK UP

IUPUI issues what is believed to be the state's largest single source of speakers for meetings--the IUPUI Speakers Service booklet. All staff and faculty members are invited to be listed. Application forms are available from the Publications/Information Services Office, Ext. 2101.

The deadline for receipt of information for the booklet is September 20. Publication of the booklet is set for November 1.

The Speakers Service mails about 7,000 booklets directly to clubs and groups and makes them available also to individuals around the Indianapolis area. The service attempts to act as a broker to bring organization programs directors into contact with university experts who have interesting things to talk about.
