

## YOUR TEETH AND YOU AT I.U.

A new dental insurance program for I.U. faculty and staff will begin July 1 (that's Thursday). Coverage will be implemented to all university employees who are enrolled by that time in the Blue Cross/Blue Shield Healthcare Plan and who have indicated they want dental insurance.

An announcement from the I.U. Personnel Division says: "The Dental Assistance Plan offered to faculty and staff in May has been approved by virtue of over 75 percent enrollment requests from the university's current Blue Cross/Blue Shield Healthcare group. Coverage will start July 1 with open enrollment requests for current Healthcare Plan members continuing until the end of June." Wednesday is the end of June. If you did not indicate you desire to be part of this plan by sending in your enrollment request and you do indeed wish to be included, you must go to the Personnel Office on campus and let them know -- through Wednesday.

Faculty and staff not covered by the Healthcare Plan cannot join the Dental Assistance Plan now, but will be given an opportunity to do so next Dec. 1. According to the announcement, "Only a small portion of the staff and faculty not currently covered by the Healthcare Plan indicated a desire to join the dental plan. Since the 75 percent participation required by state law was not met, employees not in the Healthcare Plan cannot be enrolled in the Dental Assistance Plan."
