

TRUSTEES MEET

The plaza between the west side of University Hospital, Emerson Hall and Radiation Therapy, which forms the roof of a basement pharmacy and a radiology diagnostic area, will be removed and replaced by the Tousley-Bixler Construction Co., Inc., Indianapolis which submitted the low bid of \$279,000 for the project, by action of the I.U. Board of Trustees at its Dec. 5 meeting.

Water penetration into the rooms below has been extreme, making the reconstruction necessary. The plaza will be rebuilt using new insulation, fill, a waterproof membrane and loose-laid two-foot by two-foot concrete pavers on pedestals. New drainage and new and relocated lighting and seating will be incorporated. Appropriate state approvals will be requested.

In other action, the bid of \$39,975 by Architectural Graphics, Inc., of Indianapolis was accepted to provide interior signs, bulletin boards and building directories for the Education/Social Work Building. The design will be correlated with signage existing in the School of Physical Education/Natatorium Building with which this building connects.

Personnel Changes

Business Professor Jack R. Wentworth was named acting dean of the I.U. School of Business by the trustees to succeed Schuyler F. Otteson, who will retire as dean at the end of the year. Otteson, dean of the business school since 1971 who announced his plans to retire last spring, will return to teaching. The trustees also re-appointed Harvey C. Bunke acting executive associate dean for the school. Both appointments will be effective Jan. 1 to July 1. A committee is searching for a permanent dean.

Professor Gerald Bepko, dean of the I.U. School of Law-Indianapolis, was named to the board of directors of Municipal Recreation, Inc., to fill a vacancy left by the resignation of Robert R. Baxter from the post.

Carl W. Fuller, professor of speech pathology, assistant director of Audiology and Speech Clinic and clinical director of Language Pathology Services, was granted early retirement effective Jan. 1, with the title Professor Emeritus of Speech Pathology, School of Medicine. Robert L. Campbell, associate professor of journalism and assistant to the dean, was retired effective Dec. 31 with the title of Associate Professor Emeritus of Journalism, School of Liberal Arts.

James E. Price was named head coach, Women's Basketball, part-time in the School of Physical Education as of this past Oct. 4.

Student Housing Fees

While determined to keep costs to students as low as possible, in view of increasing operational expenses pushed higher by inflation, particularly on the

Indianapolis campus where maintenance costs are climbing and reserve funds are dwindling, the trustees increased rates for student housing at Indianapolis an average of 7.5 percent. The rate schedules cover a variety of student accommodations from single rooms to housing for students with families.

JULY FOR CHRISTMAS

A novel Christmas gift idea for golf enthusiasts is available this year for the 1983 Mayflower LPGA Classic to be played July 18-24 at the Country Club of Indianapolis for the benefit of the James Whitcomb Riley Hospital for Children.

(The Mayflower Classic has raised a significant amount of money for Riley. To date, the Mayflower Fund for Research in the Diseases of Children has topped the \$200,000 mark. This fund is administered by the Riley Memorial Association.)

Gift Certificates for season passes at \$25 each, and Any Day books at \$30 each are being offered. The certificate comes with a Yuletide gift envelope. After Christmas the recipient mails the certificate to Mayflower postage-free and receives the pass or booklet before June 1. The season pass is a \$52 value good for daily admittance to the 7th Annual Classic plus free parking and a courtesy souvenir program. Any Day books, containing six coupons, offer admittance on any day of the tournament. All six can be used on one day, or any other combination of days desired. The maximum value is \$60.

Ayres stores and the Hilton Hotel lobby, Athletic Department Sporting Goods stores, Downtown Visitors' Center, Area Golf Pro Shops and the Mayflower General Office.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAMS IN NURSING STUDIED

The Midwest Alliance in Nursing, an organization made up of nursing service agencies and nursing educational programs headquartered in Ball Residence, has received a three-year grant of \$202,075 from the W. K. Kellogg Foundation as one of six nursing organizations and colleges soon to take part in a major project to improve associate degree nursing education and service.

Associate Degree nursing education programs now graduate the largest number of nursing students annually and have become the major source of registered nurses for beginning practice. The grants stem from recommendations made by advisory committees convened by the Foundation in 1977 and 1979 to explore and recommend ways of strengthening associate degree nursing education nationally. Identified as the most important issues for action were the need for better prepared faculty members, a clearer definition of the required clinical competencies of graduates and an improved working relationship between nursing education and service.


