

PERSONAL COUNSELING OFFERS SEMINAR ON TOTAL FITNESS

Forty-five minutes of lectures and 45 minutes of exercise--both planned for the purpose of learning stress reduction through fitness will be included in a six-week seminar offered by the IUPUI Office of Personal Counseling. Seminar sessions are each Wednesday evening from 5:30-7 p.m. beginning June 5 and they will include exercise, learning what stress is and how to cope with it, as well as learning how to cope with problems of running or walking, such as dogs, and "other natural disasters." Other subjects will include nutrition and weight control and goal setting. Professional counselors will instruct. The fee is \$10 and space is limited to 30 people, but other seminars may be arranged if response is great enough. PEDIATRIC ACADEMY HONORS BULL AND MACKEY

Dr. Marilyn Bull, associate professor of pediatrics at IU and director of the Newborn Follow-Up Program at Riley Hospital, and Dr. John Mackey, clinical professor of obstetrics and gynecology at IU and private practitioner for 35 years, were among those honored during a recent annual meeting of the Indiana Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics. Dr. Bull received the Irving Rosenbaum Award for Community Service given by the academy members to a peer for contributions and dedication to the care of children. Dr. Mackey received the Edwin L. Gresham Award, named for the first director of the neonatal-perinatal program at IU and the first to establish a neonatology program in the state. Also during the meeting, for the first time the academy recognized non-physicians who have made outstanding contributions to the health of children. John Shettle, superintendent of the Indiana State Police, and John Day, representative to the Indiana General Assembly, received Community Service Awards for their part in the passage of the Indiana Child Restraint Law and the promotion of child passenger safety in the state.-PP

- **TOOTHPASTE STUDY**--The Oral Health Research Institute, IU School of Dentistry, needs 120 adult volunteers, age 18 or over, for a new dental research program to test whether any of three toothpastes, compared to a control toothpaste, are effective in treating dentinal sensitivity--teeth which are uncomfortable when exposed to hot or cold air, food or drinks. Sensitivity cannot be related to cavities, large fillings, crowns or gum disease. Toothpaste and toothbrushes for home use supplied. A modest reimbursement given at the end of the study. NAME DECASTRO OUTSTANDING U.S. FILIPINO

Rolando A. Fifteen deans and professors who are retiring from the university are leaving with an accumulation 348 years' service. Retiring from the School of Medicine are William H. Bond, professor, 33 years' service; Robert A. Garrett, professor, 37 years' service; Margaret Martin, assistant professor of pediatrics (and associate director of nursing services for children), 20 years' service; John F. Phillips, associate professor, 15 years' service; John A. Robb, associate professor, 13 years' service; Robert J. Rohn, Kenneth Wiseman professor, 29 years' service, and Elizabeth B. Solow, professor, 23 years' service. Retiring from the School of Nursing are Helen Dorsch, professor and associate dean, with eight years' service, and Magdalene Fuller, professor and associate dean, 25 years' service. From the School of Dentistry, Dean Ralph E. McDonald is leaving having served 39 years, and also retiring from the school are Samuel S. Patterson, professor, with 11 years' full-time and 25 years part-time service and William G. Shafer, distinguished professor, with 35 years' service. Retiring from the School of Engineering and Technology with seven years' service is John Hammann, associate professor. Hardwick Harshman, professor, leaves the School of Education after 14 years, and Mary Louise Rea, professor, retires from the School of Liberal Arts after 39 years.

BUSINESS GETS \$2 MILLION GRANT, \$1 MILLION CHAIR

IBM Corporation is giving a \$2 million grant for research in the development and management of computer-based informations systems and to expand graduate education in the field, and the American United Life Insurance Company board of directors voted to contribute \$200,000 of a \$1 million dollar chair it will endow--both to the IU School of Business. The IBM grant is the largest ever given the school and it includes \$1 million each for equipment and cash support as well as computer software for curriculum development and faculty research. The AUL endowment will bring to the school guest faculty who are distinguished professors of business or outstanding business leaders. AUL expects to grant \$200,000 each year for the next four years.


