



ANDERSON ACCEPTS AUL CHAIR

Ronald D. Anderson, I.U. marketing professor, will be invested as American United Life professor of business administration during a black-tie dinner and ceremony Nov. 16, 6 p.m., University Place Executive Conference Center and Hotel. The AUL professorship is the first endowed chair established on the IUPUI campus outside the Schools of Medicine and Law and was funded for \$1 million. Keynote speaker will be Carl J. Schramm, president of the Health Insurance Association of America. He will be joined by Jack E. Reich, chairman of the board and CEO for AUL, and Jerry D. Semler, president, AUL. Also, IU President Thomas Ehrlich, IUPUI Chancellor Gerald L. Bepko and Dean of the IU School of Business Jack R. Wentworth, among others. On endowing the chair, Reich said, "The IU School of Business is known internationally for the quality of its programs, and we want to assure that these programs are available to students here. By endowing this chair, we believe we are helping not only IU, but also the people of Indianapolis, as well as our own employees, several of whom are IUPUI students." Professor Anderson came to the IU School of Business at Indianapolis in 1973 and returns to the school after serving two years as Krannert professor of business administration and professor of marketing at Butler U. His research has resulted in more than 80 articles and papers in professional journals and magazines. A native of Des Moines, Iowa, he holds bachelor's and master's degrees from the U. of Iowa and a doctoral degree from IU.-J. Peterson

Among your choices is the services of IU Medical Center physicians through University Health Care (UHC), a primary care group practice of physicians in internal medicine, pediatrics and obstetrics/gynecology. UHC physician care is available through both plans offered to IUPUI employees--Maxicare (Metro Health) and Blue Cross/Blue Shield. UHC campus offices are on the second floor of the Regenstrief Health Center and the Coleman Center for Women in University Hospital. UHC care is also expanding to a new westside office that will be staffed by internal medicine physicians. 
