Dr. Carl Winters, who will address this morning's meeting representing General Motors Corp., has devoted a great deal of his time and energy to the problems of personal rehabilitation particularly as they relate to young people. Dr. Winters has been Chairman of the Michigan State Crime Commission and while serving in this capacity, he put on a program of prevention in the field of juvenile delinquency.

Dr. Winters made his first speech at the age of eleven when he addressed a local farm bureau on the subject of "Raising a Prize-Winning Duroc Hog". He served as an adviser on the Juvenile Board of Sheriff Loham of Cook County, Ill. and was a member of the Board of Directors of the John Howard Association, an organization which works closely with the Chicago Crime Commission, the Illinois Penal Institution and with paroled prisoners.
